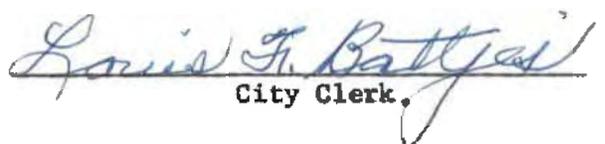

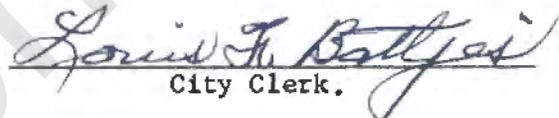

"Honorable Mayor and City Commissionera
City of Grand Rapids, Michigan

Following is the Proposal of the City of East Grand Rapids to purchase water from the City of Grand Rapids. The items contained within the Proposal are in general terms and would require careful drafting to assure compliance with the intent of both City Commissions.

The City of East Grand Rapids would agree:

1. To void the existing sewage disposal contract.
2. To sell its acquired interest in the old and new sewage disposal plants to Grand Rapids at book value.
3. To pay a sewer service charge in an amount equal to 150% of the prevailing sewage service rate to Grand Rapids customers.
4. To pay a readiness-to-serve water charge of \$15,000 annually (150% of the presumed quarterly charge of \$2500 were a 24" meter in the rate structure).
5. To pay Grand Rapids 150% of the prevailing Grand Rapids water commodity charge.
6. To pay all costs of construction of connecting facilities located within the City of East Grand Rapids.
7. To continue to service East Grand Rapids outstanding revenue bond debt.
8. To pay all costs of the East Grand Rapids water system including:
 - (a) Administration
 - (b) Transmission and distribution system maintenance and construction in accordance with Grand Rapids specifications.
 - (c) Pumping costs to maintain East Grand Rapids system pressures.
 - (d) Billing, collection and meter maintenance expenditures.

The City of Grand Rapids would agree:

1. To supply water of the same quality as is supplied to Grand Rapids consumers and in such quantity as is sufficient to meet estimated needs of East Grand Rapids customers.
2. To supply water of such pressure as will adequately supply the East Grand Rapids pumping station.
3. To purchase the acquired interest of the City of East Grand Rapids in the Grand Rapids sewage disposal plant at book value.

The two municipalities would agree:

To enter into a long term contract which would contain, in addition to the above items, the following provisions:

6/17/1963

1. At the request of either party, the water and sewer portions of the contract can be re-negotiated annually, but the 150% ratio of East Grand Rapids rate to Grand Rapids consumer rate would be maintained.
2. The water portion of the contract would provide that upon no less than 5 years' written notice by either party, this portion of the contract could be cancelled providing that after service of said notice the water rate to the City of East Grand Rapids in any year would not be more than 10% above that of the preceding year. The sewage disposal section of the contract would not so provide.

Inasmuch as the City of East Grand Rapids faces the necessity of immediately resolving the location of its new water source, it is respectfully requested that your Honorable Body act upon the above Proposal promptly and advise us of your action no later than July 15, 1963. The lack of an answer by this date will, of necessity, be interpreted as rejection of the Proposal.

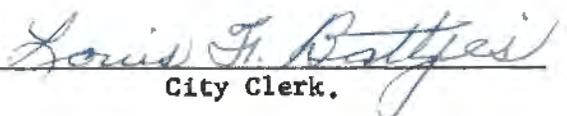

- (2) B-1 Residence - Terrace Apartment and Two-family Districts.
- (3) A-3 Residence - One Family Districts.
- (4) A-2 Residence - One Family Districts.
- (5) A-1 Residence - One Family Districts.
- (6) D-1 Park District.

5.6 Map. The boundaries of these districts are hereby established as shown on a map entitled "The Zoning Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1963, Showing Districts and Use Regulations", which accompanies and is made a part of this Chapter. Except where referenced on said map to a street line or other designated line by dimensions shown on said map, the district boundary lines follow lot lines or the center of streets or alleys as they existed at the time of the adoption of the June 15, 1959 Zoning Ordinance; but where a district line does not coincide with such lot lines or such street center lines or where it is not designated by dimensions, it shall be deemed to be 150 feet back from the nearest parallel street line.

5.9 Areas Not Included Within a District. 4. There shall be established and maintained a separate fund for each of said special assessment districts into which shall be placed the respective district's proportion of the proceeds of sale of the bonds, except accrued interest and premium, if any. From such fund there shall be paid the cost of the improvement in the proper district. The moneys in said several funds may be kept in one bank account, but no money shall be drawn therefrom for the benefit of any district unless there is a sufficient balance therefor in the fund of such district.

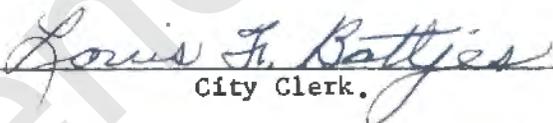
