That the following proposed ordinance be placed on final reading and adopted by this Commission:

AN ORDINANCE

TO REGULATE AND LICENSE THE SALE OF FOODS AND FOOD PRODUCTS AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE SANITARY CONDITIONS OF FOOD ESTABLISHMENTS AND OTHER FOOD DISPENSING FACILITIES AND TO REPEAL CERTAIN ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HEREWITH.

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. This Ordinance shall be known and cited as the General Food Ordinance of the City of East Grand Rapids.

SECTION 2. Definitions.

(a) Food. The term "food" as used herein shall include all articles of food, drink, ice, condiments, confections, nuts, cereal, popcorn, fruits, vegetables, fish, poultry, meats and kindred products normally used for human consumption, whether simple, mixed or compound.

(b) Health Officer. The term "health officer" shall mean the Health Officer of the City of East Grand Rapids or his authorized representative.

(c) Person. The word "person" shall mean person, firm, corporation or association.

SECTION 3. Building, Room or Rooms.

(a) The building, room or rooms in which food is manufactured, processed, prepared, stored, served, sold or offered for sale shall be of sound construction, in good repair and rat proof. The walls and ceilings shall be constructed of a smooth surfaced hard material. The floors shall be of sound construction, that can be properly cleaned and kept clean. The floors of rooms in which the processing of food requires large quantities of water or fats shall be constructed of impervious material. The basement walls and floor shall be constructed of sound impervious material and the floor adequately drained. The floors, walls, ceiling, windows, doors and screens of the building shall be kept clean and in good repair.

(b) Machinery and equipment installation. The building and room or rooms shall be of adequate size to accommodate the necessary machinery, equipment and facilities to manufacture, process, prepare, store, serve or dispense food in a clean, sanitary manner. The machinery and equipment shall be so installed as to be adequately spaced from walls, partitions and other pieces of equipment, to permit proper cleaning.

(c) Lighting. The building shall be properly lighted. Rooms in which food is processed and utensils are washed shall be well lighted.

(d) Ventilation. The building shall be properly ventilated. Rooms in which food is prepared, processed, served, or utensils are washed, shall be well ventilated so as to be reasonably free of odors and condensation.

(e) Toilet facilities. Adequate and conveniently located toilet facilities shall be provided. The walls and ceilings of the toilet room shall be of sound construction. The floor, with an eight-inch cove, shall be of impervious construction. The toilets shall not open directly into a kitchen or any room in which food is processed. The toilet shall be well lighted, ventilated, kept clean and in good repair.

(f) Lavatory Facilities. A conveniently located hand wash bowl, connected with hot and cold running water, shall be provided in food processing rooms and convenient to the toilet room. Soap and single service towels shall be provided. Waste from bowl shall be connected to sewer.

(g) Water Supply. A safe and adequate supply of water, under suitable pressure, shall be provided in the building and easily accessible to all rooms.

(h) Sewage Disposal. Adequate facilities shall be provided in the building for disposal of all sewage and other liquid waste into an approved sewer system.

(i) Garbage and Trash Disposal. Adequate water tight metal containers, with tight fitting metal covers, shall be provided in which garbage and decayed organic material shall be stored. Rubbish and trash shall be kept in suitable receptacles or otherwise stored in a manner that will not be a nuisance.

(j) Premises. The premises shall be kept in a clean, sanitary condition and free from rubbish and litter.

(K) Rodent and Pest Control. The operator of any food establishment shall take all measures necessary to eliminate rodents, flies and other insects from any building where food is manufactured, processed, prepared, served or dispensed. Further, such measures as shall be reasonable shall be employed to prevent the entrance of such pests into the building.

SECTION 4. Refrigeration.

Adequate refrigeration equipment shall be provided by any person selling food and in addition thereto, readily perishable food shall be kept at a temperature not exceeding 50 degrees F. except when such food is being prepared or served.

SECTION 5. Machinery, Equipment and Utensils. Construction.

Machinery, equipment and utensils shall be of sanitary construction. Surfaces shall be of solid material, free from cracks, crevices and open seams. Machinery, equipment and utensil surfaces which come in contact with food shall not contain cadmium or lead, nor shall any polish or other substance containing any cyanide or other poisonous material be used for cleaning or polishing. Vending and dispensing machines shall be of an approved type, and the parts of the machine which come in contact with the products dispensed shall be readily and easily accessible for cleaning purposes. They shall also be constructed so that the food will be stored and dispensed from the machine in a clean, sanitary manner, free from contamination. Pipe and fittings used in processing food shall be of a sanitary type and demountable for cleaning. Hoods that are installed to carry off cooking odors and steam shall be constructed of smooth metal. Machinery and multi-use utensils, show cases, display cases, counters, shelves, tables, refrigerating equipment, sinks and other utensils, shall be constructed so as to be easily cleaned.

SECTION 6. Single Service Utensils.

Single service utensils shall be received only in sanitary containers, stored therein in a clean dry place and shall be handled and served in a sanitary manner. Wrapped straws or an approved dispensing device that will protect them from contamination shall be used. Single service utensils or containers shall be used only once.

SECTION 7. Washing facilities.

Washing and sterilizing vats of adequate size, constructed of sound suitable material shall be provided. These vats shall consist of two or more compartments connected with a sewer and provided with hot and cold running water. Soap or a suitable detergent and brushes in good repair shall be provided. Water heating equipment shall be provided and used that will heat and maintain heated, an adequate quantity of water at the temperature necessary for proper washing and sanitizing equipment and utensils.

SECTION 8. Washing and Cleaning.

Machinery, equipment, containers, display cases, counters, shelves, exhaust fans, stoves, hoods, work surfaces, vending and dispensing machines shall be cleaned, and kept clean and free from dust, dirt, insects, and other contaminating material. Multi-use utensils and containers shall be thoroughly washed and effectively sanitized by an approved method. Laboratory tests may be made when deemed necessary to determine if utensils have been properly washed and sanitized.

SECTION 9. Sanitation.

Multi-use eating and drinking utensils shall be sanitized after washing in clean hot water at a temperature of not less than 170 degrees F. for not less than two minutes, or other approved effective method as prescribed by the Health Officer. Chemical sanitization may be used provided the chemical and the method of use has been approved by the Health Officer. Cloths used by personnel shall be clean. If cloths are used for drying dishes, they shall be used for no other purpose.

SECTION 10. Storage and Handling.

Multi-use utensils and containers shall be stored in a clean, dry place, protected from flies, dust and other contamination, and shall be handled in such a manner as to prevent contamination.

SECTION 11. Wholesomeness of food.

Food shall be clean, wholesome, free from adulteration and spoilage, and so processed, prepared and handled as to be safe for consumption. No person shall have in his possession, sell, or offer for sale, any unclean, unwholesome, adulterated, contaminated or spoiled food. Ice used for domestic purposes or used in the processing, storing or serving of food shall be manufactured or harvested only from water which is pure and obtained from a source which complies with the standards of purity for drinking water as defined by the United States Public Health Service. Ice shall be transported and stored in clean containers and handled in a clean manner. Oysters, clams and mussels shall be from approved sources, and if shucked shall be kept until used in the container in which they were placed at the shucking plant.

SECTION 12. Sampling and Seizure of Food.

The Health Officer may take samples of food as often as he may deem necessary to be examined for the detection of adulteration and/or wholesomeness. The Health Officer may retain, condemn, destroy or cause to be removed any food that is unwholesome or adulterated. A retained or condemned tag, stamp or other marking device placed upon any article of food shall not be removed without written consent of the Health Officer.

SECTION 13. Labeling.

All foods packaged, canned or wrapped, which shall not be subject to the jurisdiction of the State of Michigan exclusively or the United States government exclusively which are made of two or more ingredients, or shall in the processing thereof have been changed so that the origin thereof is not readily apparent, shall bear on the label the common or usual name or names of the ingredients contained therein. All such products shall conform with the requirements of the State and United States governments and the name of the manufacturer or distributor shall appear on all packaged, canned or wrapped foods.

SECTION 14. Storage, Display and Serving of Food.

Food shall be stored, transported, displayed and served so as to be protected from dust, flies, vermin, depredation and pollution by rodents, unnecessary handling, droplet infection, overhead leakage and other contamination. No animals or fowls shall be kept in any room in which food is manufactured, processed, stored or served.

SECTION 15. Cleanliness of Personnel.

Personnel shall wear clean, washable outer garments, including proper protection of hair. Personnel shall keep their hands clean at all times while engaged in handling food, utensils or equipment. Personnel shall not expectorate or use tobacco in any form in rooms in which food is processed and prepared, or utensils are washed. Adequate lockers or dressing rooms shall be kept clean. Soiled garments, linens and aprons shall be kept in containers, provided for this purpose.

SECTION 16. Disease Control.

No person who is afflicted with any disease in a communicable form or is a carrier of such disease, shall work in any place where food is processed, prepared or served, nor shall any employer employ any such person, nor any person suspected of being affected with any disease in communicable form or being a carrier of such disease. If the employer suspects that any employee has contracted any disease in a communicable form or has become a carrier of such disease, he shall notify the Health Officer immediately.

SECTION 17. Procedure When Infection Is Suspected.

When the likelihood of transmission of infection from any food-establishment-employee shall arise, the Health Officer is authorized to require any or all the following measures:

- (a) The immediate exclusion of the employee involved.
- (b) After investigation and a finding by the Health Officer that there is imminent danger that an outbreak of disease will result from the condition of the employee, the food establishment may be closed until such likelihood of outbreak of disease is eliminated.
- (c) The Health Officer may require proof of the non-existence of the disease for which the employee is excluded before such employee shall be reinstated.

SECTION 18. Vehicles Used In Transportation of Food.

Vehicles used in the transportation of food shall have bodies that are sound, easily cleanable, and are kept clean. It shall be equipped to protect food from contamination and readily perishable food from deterioration.

SECTION 19. Approval and Licensing.

No person shall engage in the operation of a business in which food is manufactured, processed, prepared, served, stored, dispensed or vended from a machine without first meeting the requirements of this ordinance applicable to food vending machine operators. No license shall be issued without the approval of the Health Officer.

SECTION 20. Right of Entry and Inspection.

The person operating the food establishment shall, upon the request of the Health Officer, permit access to all parts of the establishment and shall permit copying any and all records of food purchased if such food is suspected of causing illness, or in violation of the terms of this ordinance.

SECTION 21. Rules and Regulations.

The Health Officer shall have full power and authority to make such rules and regulations as shall be necessary or proper to carry out the intent and purpose of this ordinance and to protect the public health. Such rules and regulations, when adopted by the Health Officer and approved by the City Commission shall be deemed a part of this ordinance.

SECTION 22. No place or business selling or dispensing food as defined herein shall be operated and maintained except that a license for the same shall first be secured and fees paid by the proprietor thereof as provided by ordinance; provided that any such license shall be denied to the applicant unless the place of business also complies with the provisions of this ordinance. Whenever the Health Officer shall find that any licensee under this ordinance is in violation thereof and that said person shall have been repeatedly in violation of said ordinance or is unable or unwilling to comply with the terms thereof, he shall have authority and he is hereby empowered to serve notice of revocation of license upon the licensee and said licensee shall immediately cease operation. If said licensee shall deem himself aggrieved by the action of the Health Officer, he may within five days after service of notice, appeal to the City Commission by filing with the City Clerk a claim for appeal. At the next meeting of the City Commission following the filing of such claim of appeal, the same shall be presented and the City Commission shall fix the day for hearing said appeal either before the City Commission or a special committee appointed for that purpose. After hearing, if the City Commission is satisfied that the licensee has repeatedly violated any of the provisions of this ordinance, or that said licensee is unable or will be unwilling to comply with the provisions thereof then said license shall be permanently revoked. The action of the City Commission will be final in the absence of fraud or bad faith.

SECTION 23. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remainder of said ordinance shall not be affected thereby.

SECTION 24. Penalty for Violation.

Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance, shall be subject to a fine of not more than Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) or to imprisonment for not more than ninety (90) days or to both such fine and imprisonment. Each violation shall constitute a separate offense and be punishable as above provided.

SECTION 25. This ordinance shall be construed as regulatory of the several businesses herein mentioned, provided, however, that said ordinance shall not be construed as authorizing any person or persons to engage in any business without having first obtained, from the proper municipal licensing officer, such license as is now or may hereafter be required by ordinance. For the purpose of such licenses as may now be or may hereafter be required by ordinance, the following words and phrases shall have the meaning herein designated:

(a) WHOLESALER OF HORSE MEAT is a person who slaughters and/or sells to a retailer unprocessed meat from a horse.

(b) RETAILER OF HORSE MEAT is a person who shall offer horse meat for sale or purchase the same for resale.

(c) BOARDING HOUSE is any place where a person other than the dependents of the owner or the person having control thereof shall be provided with meals for remuneration, except such places as shall be covered by other regulatory food ordinances.

(d) QUASI PUBLIC RESTAURANT is a place where food is prepared and served to the employes of any person or the members of any organization.

(e) FRUIT AND/OR VEGETABLE STAND shall be defined as a person offering for sale or selling to the public unprocessed fruit or vegetables, provided however, that the same shall be deemed to include frozen fruits and vegetables.

(f) GROCER is any person selling all or any of the items defined as "food" herein and the licensing of any person as a grocer shall include the right to sell all items defined as food, and in addition thereto, milk, milk products and package ice cream, but excluding meats and kindred products.

(g) VENDING MACHINE is any machine useable for dispensing "food" as defined herein upon the purchase price being deposited in some part thereof.

(h) RETAIL MILK DEALER is any person who shall sell or offer for sale milk at retail.

(i) ICE MANUFACTURER is any person who manufactures or harvests ice.

(j) ICE DELIVERY VEHICLE is any vehicle used for transporting ice for sale or resale.

(k) CONFECTIONERY STAND is any establishment or vehicle from which candy, nuts, popcorn and/or kindred products are sold.

(l) NUT STAND is any establishment or vehicle from which nuts are sold.

(m) CANDY STAND is any establishment or vehicle from which candy is sold.

(n) POPCORN STAND is any establishment or vehicle from which popcorn is sold.

(o) CANDY AND/OR CONFECTIONERY MANUFACTURER shall be defined as any person that processes or prepares products, the main ingredients of which is sugar, sirup or any other sweetening agents and/or compounds for sale.

(p) FOOD SPECIALTY MANUFACTURER is any person manufacturing potato chips, popcorn or kindred food products for the purpose of resale.

(q) FOOD SPECIALTY VEHICLE is any vehicle employed or used for the distribution of potato chips, popcorn or kindred food products, but shall not include any vehicle which is used to transport the products of a licensed specialty manufacturer as herein defined.

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND SECTIONS 3 and 4-A OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND FIX THE ISSUING OF LICENSES AND FIXING THE AMOUNT AND COLLECTION OF LICENSE FEES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS NOT OTHERWISE PROVIDED FOR", APPROVED APRIL 20, 1925, AS AMENDED, AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Sections 3 and 4-A of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to fix and regulate the issuing of licenses and fixing the amount and collection of license fee within the City of East Grand Rapids not otherwise provided for", as amended, are hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 3. Whenever the Commission may deem it advisable or necessary, it may fix and establish, by resolution, a blanket license to cover and include all theatres and other amusement concessions and stands and other occupations and businesses subjected herein to the payment of a license fee, located upon Ramona Park Grounds, so-called, in the City of East Grand Rapids, which said grounds or park is, for the purpose of this section, limited to that portion lying north of Wealthy Street; provided, however, that such blanket license shall be granted for the theatres, concessions, stands and other businesses in existence at the time such blanket license is issued, and any new occupation or business established upon said Park Grounds after the issuing of such blanket license shall be subject to the license fees hereinbefore established and fixed. Such blanket license fee shall be charged to and paid by the owners and proprietors of said Ramona Park Grounds, and when so fixed and established as herein provided,

the provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to the owners, proprietors or operators of theatres, amusement concessions and stands included in this section. Failure to comply with the provisions of this section shall render the person, firm or corporation affected, or their officers and agents subject to the punishment as in this ordinance provided.

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, either directly or indirectly, by his, her, their or its officers, agents, or employees, to carry on or engage in the conduct of any show, attraction, concession or exhibit of any kind, on the grounds described in Section 3 of this ordinance, commonly called "Ramona Park Grounds", and which show, attraction, concession or exhibit is not specifically enumerated in this ordinance, the purpose of which is to attract or to do business with the public, regardless of whether or not any charge to the public is made for attending or viewing the same, without first obtaining a license therefor from the said City of East Grand Rapids, and without first having paid the license fee or charge made for such license.

(b) No license shall be issued to any person, firm or corporation for the conduct of any such show, attraction, concession or exhibit which the Commission has determined, upon full consideration of all the facts involved to be detrimental to the health, safety and/or general welfare of the inhabitants of the City of East Grand Rapids.
