AND TO PROHIBIT THE CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC

ADMITTED.

THE PEOPLE OF THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. No beer garden, tavern or restaurant shall hereafter have its license to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises in this City approved by the City Commission except subject to the terms and conditions of this ordinance, and any place so licensed when this ordinance takes effect shall be made to comply herewith within thirty (30) days.

SECTION 2. Licenses to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises shall be limited to four (4) such licenses for the entire City of East Grand Rapids.

SECTION 3. No beer garden, tavern or restaurant shall have its license application approved to sell alcoholic liquor on the premises as follows:

- (a) Within 675 feet of an improved and equipped school ground;
- (b) Within 475 feet of a church established at the time the first license is issued to the licensee, measured in a straight line from the nearest wall of the proposed location to the main entrance of the church, unless the application is approved by the governing body of the church;
- (c) Within an "A" or "B" Residence Zoning District.

SECTION 4. No beer garden, tavern or restaurant shall have its application approved to sell alcoholic liquor on the premises except on the ground floor.

SECTION 5. The owner or owners, as well as the agents and servants of the owner or owners actually engaged in the operation of a place of business licensed to sell alcoholic liquor on the premises, shall at all times be responsible for the conduct of occupants and patrons. No disorderly, loud or boisterous conduct shall be permitted, nor shall any entertainment be given or permitted which is offensive or indecent in its nature. Front windows shall at all times be clear of curtains, screens or objects which would tend to obstruct vision into the establishment from the front and outside of the premises. No living quarters shall be permitted in the same building if they are connected to the business establishment in such a way that the public has or is likely to have access thereto. No booths or private rooms shall be permitted which are completely enclosed or capable of being, either permanently or temporarily completely enclosed or locked or with partition higher than four (4) feet from the floor. All places must have separate toilet facilities for men and women.

SECTION 6. All applications for licenses to sell alcoholic liquor for consumption on the premises or renewals thereof shall be upon forms provided by the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, and shall be filed with the City Clerk. The City Clerk shall transmit all proper applications to the City Commission. No application shall be approved if the applicant or any partner or officer of the applicant has been previously convicted of an offense involving the sale, possession or use of intoxicating liquor, or has pleaded guilty thereto, or has been found guilty of an offense involving moral turpitudes.

SECTION 7. It shall hereafter be unlawful for any person to consume alcoholic liquor in any public place in this city or in any place to which the public is admitted, except those places which are properly licensed therefor by the Liquor Control Commission, and then only the particular kind or style of alcoholic liquor which is licensed for sale on said premises, and the owner or operator of any such place shall be deemed to be a violator.

SECTION 8. No floor shows, entertainment, dancing or music shall be permitted from 1:00 A.M. to 8:00 A.M. in any place licensed to sell alcoholic liquor on the premises.

SECTION 9. This ordinance is cumulative to the Zoning Ordinance, so-called, to Act 2 of the Public Acts of 1933, First Extra Session, and all amendments thereto; to the orders of the Michigan Liquor Control Commission, and to all other license and regulatory ordinances not inconsistent herewith.

SECTION 10. Any person who violates the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction thereof, be subject to a fine of not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars, or to imprisonment in the Kent County Jail for a period of not to exceed ninety days, or may be both fined and imprisoned in the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 11. The sentences, phrases, clauses, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance are declared to be severable, and if any part or portion is declared to be unconstitutional or inoperative, such decision shall in no way affect the balance of the Ordinance.

All backfilling of trenches, abandoned structures, etc., within the limits of the proposed construction area shall be done with bank run sand or its equivalent, placed in horizontal layers not to exceed 6 inches in depth, and thoroly tamped or flooded to produce maximum settlement.

X BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the State Highway Department shall be reimbursed for all future repairs to the pavement included in this project made necessary on account of faulty material or workmanship in such underground work or the repair of the same or the installation of additional underground work by this municipality, on bill rendered by the State Highway Department when such repairs to the pavement will have been completed.
