average amount of water run through said water meter
during the same quarterly period for the two preced-
ing years. Provided, however, if this basis of cal-
culation is impracticable for any reason, then the
charge for such water so used shall be upon such
other reasonable basis of calculation as may be
determined upon by the City Manager."

"City Commission
East Grand Rapids, Mich.

Gentlemen:

There are at the present time a number of shanties scattered over the ice on Reeds Lake. These shanties are used by fishermen every day. The question of pollution of Reeds Lake, now and in the future when the ice disappears, by the excreta from these fishermen, is an important health matter. The excreta getting into the lake now or later, is considered a pollution of the public drinking water of the City of East Grand Rapids.

In 1929, there was an act passed by the State of Michigan which states that it is unlawful to pollute lakes and streams in the state.

I do not know that there is an ordinance prohibiting the erection of the fishing shanties on Reeds Lake, but I am convinced that this is a matter definitely referable to the public health and should come before the Commission.

I would be pleased to have the City Commission take some action on this matter, temporarily or permanently, as soon as possible.

We are pleased to submit herewith our proposal for the annual audit of the accounts of the City of East Grand Rapids for the fiscal year ending April 30, 1931.

The scope of our examination would include a verification of the assets and liabilities of the City of East Grand Rapids as of April 30, 1931, including certain confirmations from independent sources. A brief outline of the procedure which we believe should be included in the scope of examination is shown below:

Cash on hand at April 30, 1931 will be counted on that date. Cash on deposit will be verified by direct correspondence with the depository banks and proper reconciliation with the amounts shown by the books. In addition, we propose to trace all recorded cash receipts as shown by the Treasurer's records to the bank deposits for the year and will make a further check for a period of three months, to be selected by us of the detailed records of the various departments from which collections originate and compare them with the Treasurer's records of cash received.

As a part of our work, we will make a test check of approximately 25% of the cash disbursements for the year and will examine pay rolls, invoices and other data in support of these disbursements. We will also assure ourselves that proper authorization has been given by the Commission and that the disbursements have been distributed to the proper funds.

Bonds purchased from sinking funds will be verified by inspection or otherwise satisfactorily accounted for and a thorough check will be made of all bond retirements and bond interest together with a review of the Commission's proceedings for proper authorization for any additional bonds issued during the year.

We will also include as a part of our work, trial balances of the general tax rolls, special street improvements and sewer rolls, items returned to County Treasurer remaining unpaid, and unpaid items in Water Department, Public Works, Plumbing Inspection, etc.

We would submit a complete report including statements of resources and liabilities of the various funds and detailed exhibits of the departmental appropriations and expenditures thereof, with all necessary and supporting exhibits. A detailed schedule of all insurance carried by the City will also be included in our report.

We propose to undertake this engagement on the basis of our regular per diem rates for the time required, namely, \$30 per day for senior accountants, \$20 per day for assistants, and any necessary time of executives in connection with supervision and review of the work at \$50 per day.

Based upon our experience in similar engagements, supplemented by discussions with Messrs. Gork and Battjes with reference to the condition of the records, we believe that the time required to complete the examination as heretofore outlined, would result in a fee of approximately \$1200.00. In connection with the handling of this examination, we wish to assure your Commission that we will assign accountants who are thoroughly experienced in municipal accounting and will keep the required time at a minimum consistent with the condition of the records and the information required.

WHEREAS, it is estimated that the entire expense of constructing said North Shore Sanitary Sewer, including the necessary branches, laterals, Y's, manholes and catch basins will amount to \$135,391.59, of which \$67,457.30 has been raised by special assessments levied against the property in said special assessment district, and \$10,000 has been assumed as the City's share of said improvement to be paid out of its general funds, leaving an additional amount to be raised to pay the expense of said improvement in the sum of \$57,934.29, of which amount it is contemplated that \$28,811.40 shall be paid by special assessment to be levied upon the lands and premises included in said special assessment district, and the sum of \$29,122.89 to be paid by the city as the city's share of said improvement, and out of general funds of the city;

Section Four as amended June 11, 1923, Section Five and Section Six as amended August 12, 1929, of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts, and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such districts or zones; and to classify, regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; and to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof", and approved April 3, 1922, are hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 4. COMMERCIAL DISTRICT. The "Commercial District" shall hereafter be restricted to the area of land within the corporate limits of the City of East Grand Rapids, bounded as follows:

Commencing at the southwest corner of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Kent County, Michigan; thence north along the east line of Lakeside Drive to the northwest corner of Lot 38, of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence northwesterly along the south line of Healthy Street to the northwest corner of Lot 7 of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition as now platted; thence southerly on the southeasterly line of Lot 8 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, to the southeast corner of said Lot 8; thence westerly along the south line of said Lot 8 to the southwest corner of said Lot 8; thence northerly along the west line of said Lot 8, to the southeast corner of Lot 22 of P.E. Brown's Subdivision of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence along the southerly line of lots abutting upon the southerly line of Healthy Street as now platted from the westerly line of said Lot 8 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the easterly line of Lovett Avenue at the southwest corner of Lot 3 of W. H. Gilbert's Subdivision; thence northerly along the easterly line of Lovett Avenue to the southeast corner of Lovett Avenue and Greenwood Avenue; thence easterly along the southerly line of Greenwood Avenue to a point on the northerly boundary line of Lot 24 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, where the easterly line of Reeds Lake Boulevard produced would intersect said northerly line of said Lot 24; thence northerly along the easterly line of Reeds Lake Boulevard to the northwest corner of Lot 31 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence easterly along the north line of Lot 31 to the westerly shore line of Reeds Lake; thence southerly along the westerly shore line of Reeds Lake to the southerly line of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence westerly along the southerly line of Lot 32 of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the place of beginning.

Also,

Commencing at the southeast corner of Healthy Street and Plymouth Road; thence south along the east line of Plymouth Road, 241.4 feet; thence east 175 feet; thence north parallel with the east line of Plymouth Road to the southerly line of Healthy Street; thence northwesterly along the southerly line of Healthy Street to the place of beginning.

The boundaries of said 'Commercial District' are shown upon the map attached hereto and hereby made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated 'Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1931, showing districts for use regulations', and said map, and all notations, references and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the districts therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

All buildings and premises within said districts, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, may be used for any purpose except the following.

2. Acetylene Gas manufacture.
3. Acid manufacture
4. Ammonia, Bleaching powder or Chlorine manufacture.
5. Arsenal.
6. Bakery (employing more than five persons)
7. Blacksmith or horseshoeing shop.
8. Bottling works.
9. Carting, express, mail or storage yard.
10. Celluloid manufacture.

11. Crematory.
12. Creosote manufacture.
13. Coak, Coke or Woodyard.
14. Disinfectants manufacture.
15. Distillation of Bones, Coal or Wood.
16. Dyeing and Clearing works (employing more than five persons)
17. Exterminator and insect poison manufacture.
18. Fat rendering.
19. Fertilizer.
20. Fireworks or explosive manufacture or storage.
21. Foundries.
22. Gas (illumination or heating) manufacture.
23. Glue size or gelatin manufacture.
24. Gunpowder manufacture or storage.
25. Ice plant or storage.
26. Incineration or reduction of garbage, dead animals, offal or refuse.
27. Laundry (employing more than five persons).
28. Livery stable.
29. Petroleum refining or storage.
30. Potash works.
31. Pyroxlin manufacture.
32. Stock yards or slaughter house.
33. Stone yards or monumental works.
34. Storage or baling of scrap, paper, iron, bottles or junk.
35. Storage warehouse.
36. Sulphuric, nitric, or hydrochloric acid manufacture.
37. Tanning, curing or storage of raw hides or skins.
38. Tar distilling or manufacture.
39. Tar roofing or water proofing manufacture.
40. Any other kind of manufacture or treatment other than the manufacture or treatment of products strictly incidental to the conduct of a retail business conducted on the premises.
41. And in general those uses which have been declared a nuisance in any court of record in this state, or by statute, or which may be noxious, or offensive by reason of the emission of odor, dust, smoke, gas or noise.

SECTION 5. RESIDENCE DISTRICT A. The following area not within the Commercial District is hereby designated as the "Residence District A"; all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Bagley Avenue, Groswell Avenue and Lovett Avenue and lying north of a line parallel with and one hundred fifty (150) feet north of the north line of Lake Drive; all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Wealthy Street from the west city boundary limits to Lovett Avenue, and on either side of Greenwood Avenue, and on the north side of Lakeside Drive from Greenwood Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard. The boundary line for said "Residence District A" shall be the rear lot lines of the lands and premises within said district that have been and are now, or that may hereafter be, divided into blocks and lots, but such boundary line shall not be less than one hundred and fifteen (115) feet back from the street line. In case of unsubdivided lands within said district such boundary line shall extend back at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet from the abutting street line.

The boundaries of said Residence District A are shown upon the map attached hereto and hereby made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated "Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1951, showing districts for use regulations", and said map, and all notations, references, and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the district therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

In the Residence District "A" all buildings and premises, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, shall be erected for, and used exclusively as:

1. Any use permitted in Residence District B.
2. Two-family dwellings.
3. Multiple dwellings.
4. Hotels.
5. Libraries, hospitals and sanitariums.
6. Club houses and fraternal buildings.

SECTION 6. RESIDENCE DISTRICT B. All other lands and premises within the corporate limits of the City not specifically mentioned in the preceding sections of this ordinance shall hereafter constitute and comprise the Residence District "B". The boundaries of said Residence District "B" are shown upon the map attached hereto and made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated "Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1931, showing districts for use regulations", and said map, and all notations, references, and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by this map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the districts therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

All buildings and premises in said district, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, shall be erected for and used exclusively as private dwellings, and the usual accessory buildings appurtenant thereto; a private garage or stable located on the same lot. A community garage may be built when located not less than seventy-five (75) feet from the front or side street line. No business, retail or otherwise, shall be conducted in any dwelling or other permitted building in said district, nor shall any business of furnishing in any manner any entertainment, dancing, meals, or refreshments, or any combination of them, for a monetary consideration, be conducted in any dwelling or other permitted building in said district; provided, however, that home occupations engaged in by the occupants of a dwelling not involving the conduct of a retail business on the premises, may be permitted.

SECTION 2. This amended ordinance is ordered to take effect April 1, 1931.

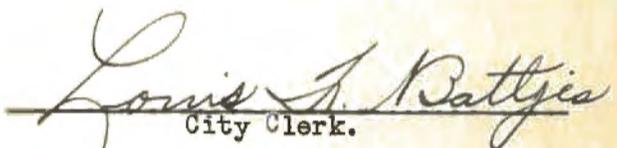

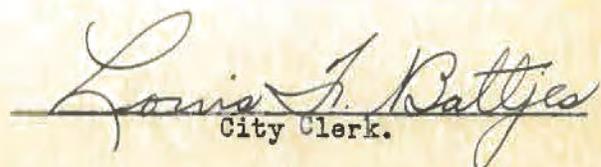

It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, being the owner or in control of any building or other structure having conductor pipes or rain-water leaders attached to such building or structure and connected with any sanitary sewer in a manner to permit the discharge of water from such building or structure into any such sanitary sewer, to permit or suffer such conductor pipe or rain-water leader and sanitary sewer connections to continue after the taking effect of this ordinance, and after having been notified by the plumbing inspector, in writing, to discontinue the connection of such conductor pipe or rain-water leader, which notice from the plumbing inspector shall be served on the owner or person in control of said building or structure, either in person or by registered mail, and shall give such owner or person in control, thirty days within which to discontinue such conductor pipe or rain-water leader.

SECTION 3. No person, firm or corporation, being the owner or in control of any building or structure, shall discharge the rain-water falling thereon from more than fifteen hundred square feet in area across the lot line into the street at any one place, provided that the plumbing inspector shall have power and authority to issue a permit when necessary, to allow the water on any sized roof to be carried directly to the storm water sewer.

SECTION 4. A violation of the terms of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or by imprisonment in the County Jail for the County of Kent for not more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the Court.

SECTION 5. A public emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take immediate effect. "

AND WHEREAS, an amendment to Sections 4 and 5 of the "Zoning Ordinance, so-called, for the purpose of changing certain property located in the Commercial District and to rezone such property as to include the same in Residence District "A", has been proposed by the City Commission of the City of East Grand Rapids,

AND WHEREAS, an amendment to Sections 14 and 15 of the "Zoning Ordinance, so-called, for the purpose of changing the open space required for side yard areas in the "A" Area District and in the "B" Area District, has been proposed by the City Commission of the City of East Grand Rapids;

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved, that on the 28th day of December, 1931, at 8 o'clock in the evening of said day, in the Commission Room in the City of East Grand Rapids be designated as the time and place for a public hearing on the following proposed amendments to Sections 4,5, 14 and 15 of the Zoning Ordinance, so-called:

"AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND SECTIONS FOUR, FIVE, FOURTEEN AND FIFTEEN OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH DISTRICTS OR ZONES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN, WITHIN WHICH TO REGULATE THE USE OF LAND AND STRUCTURES, AND THE AREA OF YARDS, COURTS, AND OTHER OPEN SPACES; AND TO REGULATE AND LIMIT THE HEIGHT, THE AREA, THE SIZE AND LOCATION OF BUILDINGS HEREAFTER ERRECTED; AND TO REGULATE THE LIGHT AND VENTILATION OF SUCH DISTRICTS OR ZONES; AND TO CLASSIFY, REGULATE AND RESTRICT THE LOCATION OF TRADES AND INDUSTRIES; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADMINISTERING OF THIS ORDINANCE AND FOR APPEALS THEREFROM, AND FOR AMENDMENTS, SUPPLEMENTS OR CHANGES HERETO, AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE TERMS HEREOF", APPROVED APRIL 3, 1922, AS AMENDED.

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Section Four as amended June 11, 1923, and May 2, 1931, and Section Five as amended June 11, 1923, and May 2, 1931, and Sections Fourteen and Fifteen of an Ordinance entitled: 'An Ordinance to Establish Districts or Zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to Regulate the Use of Land and Structures, and the Area of Yards, Courts and other open Spaces; and to Regulate and Limit the Height, the Area, the Size, and Location of Buildings hereafter erected; and to Regulate the Light and Ventilation of such districts or Zones; and to Classify, Regulate and Restrict the location of trades and industries; and to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof, and approved April 3, 1922', are hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION FOUR: COMMERCIAL DISTRICT: The 'Commercial District' shall hereafter be restricted to the area of land within the corporate limits of the City of East Grand Rapids, bounded as follows:

Commencing at the southwest corner of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Kent County, Michigan; thence north along the east line of Lakeside Drive to the northwest corner of Lot 38 of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence northwesterly along the south line of Wealthy Street to the northwest corner of Lot 7 of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition as now platted; thence southerly on the southeasterly line of Lot 8 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, to the southeast corner of said Lot 8; thence westerly along the south line of said Lot 8 to the southwest corner of said Lot 8; thence northerly along the west line of said Lot 8 to the southeast corner of Lot 22 of P.H. Brown's Subdivision of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence along the southerly line of lots abutting upon the southerly line of Wealthy Street as now platted from the westerly line of said Lot 8 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the easterly line of Lovett Avenue at the southwest corner of Lot 3 of W.H. Gilbert's Subdivision; thence northerly along the easterly line of Lovett Avenue to the northwest corner of Lot 24 of Judd's Subdivision; thence southeasterly along the northerly line of Lot 24, 133 feet, to the northeast corner of Lot 24 of Judd's Subdivision; thence northeasterly along the easterly line of Lots 25 to 73 inclusive, and thence along said easterly line of Lots 25 to 73, produced and extended, to a point on the south line of Greenwood Ave. being also the south line of Lakeside Drive; thence easterly along the southerly line of Lakeside Drive to a point on the northerly boundary line of Lot 24 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, where the easterly line of Reeds Lake Boulevard produced would intersect said northerly line of said Lot 24; thence northerly along the easterly line of Reeds Lake Boulevard to the northwest corner of Lot 31 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence westerly along the north line of Lot 31 to the westerly shore line of Reeds Lake; thence southerly along the westerly shore line of Reeds Lake to the southerly line of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence westerly along the southerly line of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the place of beginning.

Also commencing at the southeast corner of Wealthy Street and Plymouth Road; thence south along the east line of Plymouth Road, 241.4 feet; thence east 175 feet; thence north parallel with the east line of Plymouth Road to the southerly line of Wealthy Street; thence northwesterly along the southerly line of Wealthy Street to the place of beginning.'

The boundaries of said 'Commercial' District are shown upon the map attached hereto and hereby made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated "Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1931, showing districts for use regulations",

and said map, and all notations, references, and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the districts therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

All buildings and premises within said districts, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, may be used for any purpose except the following:

1. Abattoirs.
2. Acetylene Gas manufacture.
3. Acid manufacture.
4. Ammonia, Bleaching Powder or Chlorine manufacture.
5. Arsenal.
6. Bakery (employing more than five persons).
7. Blacksmith or horseshoeing shop.
8. Bottling Works.
9. Carting, express, hauling or storage yard.
10. Celluloid manufacture.
11. Crematory.
12. Creosote manufacture.
13. Coal, Coke or Woodyard.
14. Disinfectants manufacture.
15. Distillation of Bones, Coal or Wood.
16. Dyeing and Cleaning Works (employing more than five persons)
17. Exterminator and insect poison manufacture.
18. Fat rendering.
19. Fertilizer.
20. Fireworks or explosive manufacture or storage.
21. Foundries.
22. Gas (illumination or heating) manufacture.
23. Glue size or gelatin manufacture.
24. Gunpowder manufacture or storage.
25. Ice plant or storage.
26. Incineration or reduction of garbage, dead animals, offal or refuse.
27. Laundry (employing more than five persons).
28. Livery stable.
29. Petroleum refining or storage.
30. Potash Works.
31. Pyrokin manufacture.
32. Stock Yards or slaughter house.
33. Stone yards or monumental works.
34. Storage or baling of scrap, paper, iron, bottles or junk.
35. Storage warehouse.
36. Sulphuric, Nitric, or Hydrochloric Acid manufacture.
37. Tanning, curing or storage of raw hides or skins.
38. Tar distillating or manufacture.
39. Tar Roofing or Water Proofing Manufacture.
40. Any other kind of manufacture or treatment other than the manufacture or treatment of products strictly incidental to the conduct of a retail business conducted on the premises.
41. And in general those uses which have been declared a nuisance in any court of record in this state, or by statute, or which may be noxious, or offensive by reason of the emission of odor, dust, smoke, gas or noise.

SECTION 5. RESIDENCE DISTRICT A. The following area not within the Commercial District is hereby designated as the 'Residence District A': All the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Bagley Avenue, Crosswell and Lovett Avenue and lying north of a line parallel with and one hundred and fifty (150) feet north of the north line of Lake Drive, all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Wealthy Street from the west city boundary limits to Lovett Avenue, except that part designated as the Grand Rapids Clinic, and on either side of Greenwood Avenue, and on the north

side of Lakeside Drive from Greenwood Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard, and all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Lovett Avenue from Wealthy Street to Greenwood Avenue, except Lots 17 and 24 of Judd's Subdivision. The boundary line for said Residence District 'A' shall be the rear lot lines of the lands and premises within said district that have been and are now, or that may hereafter be, divided into blocks and lots, but such boundary line shall not be less than one hundred and fifteen (115) feet back from the street line. In case of unsubdivided lands within said district such boundary line shall extend back at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet from the abutting street line.

The boundaries of said Residence District A are shown upon the map attached hereto and hereby made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated 'Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1931, showing districts for use regulations', and said map, and all notations, references and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the district therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

In the Residence District A all buildings and premises, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, shall be erected for, and used exclusively as:

1. Any use permitted in Residence District B.
2. Two-family dwellings.
3. Multiple dwellings.
4. Hotels.
5. Libraries, hospitals and sanitariums.
6. Club houses and fraternal buildings.

SECTION 14: 'A' AREA DISTRICT. The boundary limits of the 'A' Area District shall be the same as that prescribed and fixed by Section Six (6) of this Ordinance for Residence District B, and the minimum dimensions of yards and the intensity of use of lot areas by dwellings hereafter erected or altered and the minimum lot area per family in such districts shall be as follows:

FRONT YARDS: The open space or front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling hereafter erected or altered, exclusive of unenclosed porches not more than ten (10) feet wide, except as otherwise provided in Subdivision Five (5) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance, shall not be less than twenty (20) per cent of the full depth of the lots; provided, that such front yard shall not be less than twenty (20) feet in depth, and need not exceed forty (40) feet in depth.

REAR YARDS: Immediately behind every dwelling hereafter erected or altered, there shall be a rear yard having a minimum depth of twenty-five (25) feet.

SIDE YARDS: Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on all lots shall not be less than twenty-five (25) per cent of the full width of such lots; provided, that in no case shall any side yard of lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width be less than five (5) feet wide, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width. In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face and front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide on lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width, or less than

seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet wide, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one or more feet in width; Provided, however, that the aforesaid side yard requirement for corner lots may be modified as provided in subdivision six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance; and provided further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet except as provided in said Subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance.

If lots are subdivided it is the spirit of this ordinance to have the same rules apply as if the lot was so originally platted.

COURTS: Dwellings sixty (60) feet or more in length, shall be provided with inner and outer courts of the dimensions prescribed for dwellings in the 'B' Area District.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY: Every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered which is located in the 'A' Area District shall provide a lot area of not less than Five Thousand (5000) square feet per family; provided however, that where a lot is separate and distinct from adjacent lots and is included in a plat of record at the time of the passage of this ordinance, has less area than herein required, then such minimum lot area per family may be less than that herein required, but in no case shall such minimum lot area be less than four thousand (4000) square feet per family.

SECTION 15. 'B' AREA DISTRICT. The boundary limits of the 'B' Area District shall be the same as that established in Section Five (5) of this ordinance for Residence District A and the minimum dimensions of yards and courts and the intensity of use of lot area by buildings hereafter erected or altered, and the minimum lot area per family, in such district, shall be as follows:

FRONT YARD: The open space or front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered in Residence District A exclusive of unenclosed porches not more than ten (10) feet wide, except as otherwise provided for in Subdivision Five (5) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance, shall not be less than twenty (20) feet in depth and need not be more than forty (40) feet deep.

REAR YARD: Immediately behind every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered in such district there shall be a rear yard having a minimum depth of twenty-five (25) feet.

SIDE YARDS: Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on all lots shall not be less than twenty-five (25) per cent of the full width of such lots; provided, that in no case shall any side yard of lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width be less than five (5) feet wide, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width; and provided further, that in case any dwellings or buildings exceeds forty-five (45) feet in height, the side yard shall be increased in width by one foot for each additional story above the third story, and such side yard shall be further increased in width by three (3) inches for every ten (10) feet or fraction thereof that the length of the side yard exceeds fifty (50) feet/

In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face and front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide on lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet wide, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one (51) or more feet in width; provided, however, that the aforesaid side yard requirement for corner lots may be modified as provided in subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance; and provided, further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet, except as provided in said Subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance.

If lots are subdivided it is the spirit of this ordinance to have the same rules apply as if the lot was so originally platted.

OUTER COURTS: That the above minimum widths for side yards for multiple dwellings more than sixty (60) feet in length may be observed for any length of side yard, provided there shall be an outer court at least every forty (40) feet of not less than five (5) feet wide for a one-story dwelling, six (6) feet wide for two-story dwelling, seven (7) feet wide for a three-story dwelling, and shall be increased by two (2) feet in width for each additional story above three (3) stories.

INNER COURTS: An inner court shall have a width of not less than twice the minimum width prescribed in this section for an outer court, nor shall its area be less than twice the square of its required least dimensions.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY: Every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered which is located in the 'B' Area District shall provide a lot area of not less than five thousand (5000) square feet per family for a 'private dwelling' and not less than twenty-five hundred (2500) square feet per family for a 'two-family dwelling', and of not less than fifteen hundred (1500) square feet per family for multiple dwellings of Class A, and of not less than two hundred square feet per person for multiple dwellings of Class B and hotels; provided, however, that where a lot is separate and distinct from adjoining lots and is included in a plat of record at the time of the passage of this ordinance, has less area than herein required for 'private dwellings', 'two family dwellings', and 'multiple dwellings' of Class A, then such minimum lot area be less than eighty (80) per cent of the aforesaid requirements.

SECTION 2. This amended ordinance is ordered to take effect _____, 1932."

AN ORDINANCE

TO AMEND SECTIONS FOUR, FIVE, FOURTEEN AND FIFTEEN OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH DISTRICTS OR ZONES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN, WITHIN WHICH TO REGULATE THE USE OF LAND AND STRUCTURES, AND THE AREA OF YARDS, COURTS, AND OTHER OPEN SPACES; AND TO REGULATE AND LIMIT THE HEIGHT, THE AREA, THE SIZE AND LOCATION OF BUILDINGS HEREAFTER ERECTED; AND TO REGULATE THE LIGHT AND VENTILATION OF SUCH DISTRICTS OR ZONES; AND TO CLASSIFY, REGULATE AND RESTRICT THE LOCATION OF TRADES AND INDUSTRIES; AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADMINISTERING OF THIS ORDINANCE AND FOR APPEALS THEREFROM, AND FOR AMENDMENTS, SUPPLEMENTS OR CHANGES THERETO, AND TO PROVIDE PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE TERMS HEREOF", APPROVED APRIL 3, 1922, AS AMENDED.

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

SECTION 1. Section Four as amended June 11, 1923 and May 2, 1931, and Section Five as amended June 11, 1923 and May 2, 1931, and Sections Fourteen and Fifteen of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Establish Districts or Zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, Within Which to Regulate the Use of Land and Structures, and the Area of Yards, Courts and Other Open Spaces; and to Regulate and Limit the Height, the Area, the Size and Location of Buildings Hereafter Erected; and to Regulate the Light and Ventilation of Such Districts or Zones; and to Classify, Regulate and Restrict the Location of Trades and Industries; and to Provide for the Administering of this Ordinance and for Appeals Therefrom, and for Amendments, Supplements or Changes Hereto, and to Provide Penalties for the Violation of the Terms Hereof, and Approved April 3, 1922", are hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION FOUR: COMMERCIAL DISTRICT: The "Commercial District" shall hereafter be restricted to the area of land within the corporate limits of the City of East Grand Rapids, bounded as follows:

Commencing at the southwest corner of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Kent County, Michigan; thence north along the east line of Lakeside Drive to the northwest corner of Lot 38 of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence northwesterly along the south line of Wealthy Street to the northwest corner of Lot 7 of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition as now platted; thence southerly on the southeasterly line of Lot 8 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, to

the southeast corner of said Lot 8; thence westerly along the south line of said Lot 8 to the southwest corner of said Lot 8; thence northerly along the west line of said Lot 8 to the southeast corner of Lot 22 of P.H. Brown's Subdivision of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence along the southerly line of lots abutting upon the southerly line of Wealthy Street as now platted from the westerly line of said Lot 8 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the easterly line of Lovett Avenue at the southwest corner of Lot 3 of W.H. Gilbert's Subdivision; thence northerly along the easterly line of Lovett Avenue to the northwest corner of Lot 24 of Judd's Subdivision; thence southeasterly along the northerly line of Lot 24, 133 feet, to the northeast corner of Lot 24 of Judd's Subdivision; thence northeasterly along the easterly line of Lots 25 to 73 inclusive, and thence along said easterly line of Lots 25 to 73, produced and extended, to a point on the south line of Greenwood Avenue being also the south line of Lakeside Drive; thence easterly along the southerly line of Lakeside Drive to a point on the northerly boundary line of Lot 24 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, where the easterly line of Reeds Lake Boulevard produced would intersect said northerly line of said Lot 24; thence northerly along the easterly line of Reeds Lake Boulevard to the northwest corner of Lot 31 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition; thence westerly along the north line of Lot 31 to the westerly shore line of Reeds Lake; thence southerly along the westerly shore line of Reeds Lake to the southerly line of Lot 32 of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the place of beginning.

Also, commencing at the southeast corner of Wealthy Street and Plymouth Road; thence south along the east line of Plymouth Road, 241.4 feet; thence east 175 feet; thence north parallel with the east line of Plymouth Road to the southerly line of Wealthy Street; thence northwesterly along the southerly line of Wealthy Street to the place of beginning.

The boundaries of said "Commercial District" are shown upon the map hereto attached and hereby made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated "Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1931, showing districts for use regulations", and said map, and all notations, references and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the districts therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

All buildings and premises within said districts, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, may be used for any purpose except the following:

1. Abattoirs.
2. Acetylene Gas manufacture.
3. Acid manufacture.
4. Bleaching Powder, Ammonia or Chlorine manufacture.
5. Arsenal.
6. Bakery (employing more than five persons).
7. Blacksmith or horseshoeing shop.
8. Bottling works.
9. Carting, express, hauling or storage yard.
10. Celluloid manufacture.
11. Crematory.
12. Creosote manufacture.
13. Coal, Coke or Woodyard.
14. Disinfectants manufacture.
15. Distillation of Bones, Coal or Wood.
16. Dyeing and Cleaning Works (employing more than five persons).
17. Exterminator and insect poison manufacture.
18. Fat rendering.
19. Fertilizer.

20. Fireworks or explosive manufacture or storage.
21. Foundries.
22. Gas (illumination or heating) manufacture.
23. Glue size or gelatin manufacture.
24. Gunpowder manufacture or storage.
25. Ice plant or storage.
26. Incineration or reduction of garbage, dead animals, offal or refuse.
27. Laundry (employing more than five persons).
28. Livery stable.
29. Petroleum refining or storage.
30. Potash works.
31. Pyrocin manufacture.
32. Stock yards or slaughter house.
33. Stone yards or monumental works.
34. Storage or baling of scrap, paper, iron, bottles or junk.
35. Storage warehouse.
36. Sulphuric, Nitric or Hydrochloric Acid manufacture.
37. Tanning, curing, or storage of raw hides or skins.
38. Tar distillating or manufacture.
39. Tar Roofing or Water Proofing manufacture.
40. Any other kind of manufacture or treatment other than the manufacture or treatment of products strictly incidental to the conduct of a retail business conducted on the premises.
41. And in general those uses which have been declared a nuisance in any court of record in this state, or by statute, or which may be noxious or offensive by reason of the emission of odor, dust, smoke, gas or noise.

SECTION FIVE: RESIDENCE DISTRICT A. The following area not within the Commercial District is hereby designated as the "Residence District A"; all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Bagley Avenue, Croswell Avenue and Lovett Avenues and lying north of a line parallel with and one hundred and fifty (150) feet north of the north line of Lake Drive, all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Wealthy Street from the west city boundary limits to Lovett Avenue, except that part designated as the Grand Rapids Clinic, and on either side of Greenwood Avenue, and on the north side of Lakeside Drive from Greenwood Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard, and all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Lovett Avenue from Wealthy Street to Greenwood Avenue, except Lots 17 and 24 of Judd's Subdivision. The boundary line of said Residence District "A" shall be the rear lot lines of the lands and premises within said district that have been and are now, or that may hereafter be, divided into blocks and lots, but such boundary line shall not be less than one hundred and fifteen (115) feet back from the street line. In case of unsubdivided lands within said district such boundary line shall extend back at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet from the abutting street line.

The boundaries of said Residence District A are shown upon the map attached hereto and hereby made a part of this ordinance, the same being designated "Map of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, 1931, showing districts for use regulations", and said map, and all notations, references and other things shown thereon, shall be as much a part of this ordinance as if the matters and things set forth by said map were all fully described herein, and the boundaries of the district therein shown are hereby adopted and established.

In the Residence District A all buildings and premises, except as otherwise provided in this Ordinance, shall be erected for and used exclusively as:

1. Any use permitted in Residence District B.
2. Two-family dwellings.
3. Multiple dwellings.
4. Hotels.
5. Libraries, hospitals and sanitariums.
6. Club houses and fraternal buildings.

SECTION 14: "A" AREA DISTRICT: The boundary limits of the "A" Area District shall be the same as that prescribed and fixed by Section Six (6) of this Ordinance for Residence District B, and the minimum dimensions of yards and the intensity of use of lot areas by dwellings hereafter erected or altered and the minimum lot area per family in such districts shall be as follows:

FRONT YARDS: The open space or front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling hereafter erected or altered, exclusive of unenclosed porches not more than ten (10) feet wide, except as otherwise provided in Subdivision Five (5) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance, shall not be less than twenty (20) per cent of the full depth of the lots; provided, that such front yard shall not be less than twenty (20) feet in depth, and need not exceed forty (40) feet in depth.

REAR YARDS: Immediately behind every dwelling hereafter erected or altered, there shall be a rear yard having a minimum depth of twenty-five (25) feet.

SIDE YARDS: Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on all lots shall not be less than twenty-five (25) per cent of the full width of such lots; provided, that in no case shall any side yard of lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width be less than five (5) feet wide, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width. In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face and front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide on lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) ~~feet~~ feet wide, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one (51) or more feet in width; provided, however, that the aforesaid side yard requirement for corner lots may be modified as provided in Subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance; and provided further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet except as provided in said Subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance.

If lots are subdivided it is the spirit of this ordinance to have the same rules apply as if the lot was so originally platted.

COURTS: Dwellings sixty (60) feet or more in length, shall be provided with inner and outer courts of the dimensions prescribed for dwellings in the "B" Area District.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY: Every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered which is located in the "A" Area District shall provide a lot area of not less than Five Thousand (5000) square feet per family; provided however, that where a lot is separate and distinct from adjacent lots and is included in a plat of record at the time of the passage of this ordinance, has less ~~area~~ than herein required, then such minimum lot area per family may be less than that herein required, but in no case shall such minimum lot area be less than four thousand (4000) square feet ~~per~~ family.

SECTION 15: "B" AREA DISTRICT: The boundary limits of the "B" Area District shall be the same as that established in Section Five (5) of this ordinance for Residence District A and the minimum dimensions of yards and courts and the intensity of use of lot area by buildings hereafter erected or altered, and the minimum lot area per family, in such district, shall be as follows:

FRONT YARD: The open space or front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered in Residence District A exclusive of unenclosed porches not more than ten (10) feet wide, except as otherwise provided for in Subdivision Five (5) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance, shall not be less than twenty (20) feet in depth and need not be more than forty (40) feet deep.

REAR YARD: Immediately behind every dwelling or building, hereafter erected or altered in such district there shall be a rear yard having a minimum depth of twenty-five (25) feet.

SIDE YARDS: Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on all lots shall not be less than twenty-five (25) per cent of the full width of such lots; provided, that in no case shall any side yard of lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width be less than five (5) feet wide, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet ~~or~~ or more in width; and provided further, that in case any dwelling or building exceeds forty-five (45) feet in height, the side yard shall be increased in width by one foot for each additional story above the third story, and such side yard shall be further increased in width by three (3) inches for every ten (10) feet or fraction thereof that the length of the side yard exceeds fifty (50) feet. In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face and front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide on lots fifty-nine (59) feet or less in width, or less than seven and one-half ($7\frac{1}{2}$) feet on lots sixty (60) feet to eighty-nine (89) feet in width, and ten (10) feet on lots ninety (90) feet or more in width, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet wide, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots ~~fifty-one~~ (51) or more feet in width; provided, however, that the aforesaid side yard requirement for corner lots may be modified as provided in Subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance; and provided, further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet, except as provided in said Subdivision Six (6) of Section Nineteen (19) of this ordinance.

If lots are subdivided it is the spirit of this ordinance to have the same rules apply as if the lot was so originally platted.

OUTER COURTS: that the above minimum widths for side yards for multiple dwellings more than sixty (60) feet in length ~~provided~~ ~~may~~ may be observed for any length of side yard, provided there shall be an outer court at least every forty (40) feet of not less than five (5) feet wide for a one-story dwelling, six (6) feet wide for two-story dwelling, seven (7) feet wide for a three-story dwelling, and shall be increased by two (2) feet in width for each additional story above three (3) stories.

INNER COURTS: An inner court shall have a width of not less than twice the minimum width prescribed in this section for an outer court, nor shall its area be less than twice the square of its required least dimensions.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY: Every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered which is located in the "B" Area District shall provide a lot area of not less than five thousand (5000) square feet per family for a "private dwelling", and not less than twenty-five hundred square feet per family for a "two-family dwelling, and of not less than fifteen hundred (1500) square feet per family for multiple dwellings of Class A, and of not less than two hundred (200) square feet per person for multiple dwellings of Class B and hotels; provided, however, that where a lot is separate and distinct from adjoining lots and is included in a plat of record at the time of the passage of this ordinance, has less area than herein required for "private dwellings", "Two-family dwellings" and "multiple dwellings" of Class A, then such minimum lot area be less than eighty (80) per cent of the aforesaid requirements.

SECTION TWO: A Public emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take immediate effect, on account of the necessity for the immediate preservation of the public health, peace and safety.
