AN ORDINANCE Relative to Licensing Sidewalk Builders and Contractors, and to Repeal all Ordinances of the Village of East Grand Rapids conflicting therewith.

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

SECTION I. No person, firm or corporation shall engage in the business of building, constructing and repairing sidewalks in the City of East Grand Rapids without first having obtained a license so to do from the Clerk of said City, and any person, firm or corporation, desiring to engage in such aforesaid business, shall make written application to the Clerk of said city for a license therefor; such application shall state the name and residence of the applicant, and in case such applicant is a partnership or corporation, then such application shall state the name and residence of each partner and the full name of the corporation and the address of its principal place of business. Such license shall not be granted for a longer period than one year or portion thereof and all such licenses shall expire on April 30th of each year. The fee for such licenses shall be five dollars and shall accompany the application for a license.

SECTION II. The building, constructing and repairing of sidewalks in said City shall be done under the general supervision and direction of the Director of Public Works and Service of said City, and the person, firm or corporation doing the same shall conform to all the provisions of the ordinance of said City entitled "An Ordinance Relative to the Construction and Repairing of Sidewalks, etc." adopted and passed January eleventh, 1928, and the directions which said Director shall give in the premises.

SECTION III. All duly licensed persons, firms or corporations engaged in such aforesaid business, shall, before occupying a part of any public street or alley in said City for the purpose of placing necessary building material there in, enter into a surety company bond to the City of East Grand Rapids to be approved by the Mayor Manager of said City, conditioned that the aforesaid person, firm or corporation shall keep all excavations and such work and material deposited in any such street or alley while it remains therein, carefully guarded, both by day and night, against accidents to persons and damages to property, during the entire progress of such construction, laying or rebuilding, and every person, firm or corporation, constructing, laying or rebuilding any sidewalk on any street or avenue in said City, whether by contract or otherwise, shall save the City of East Grand Rapids harmless from all loss or damage in consequence thereof, and to obey all directions which the Director of Public Works and Service shall give in relation to property guards or lights about such material while in any street or alley, and in addition to the necessary barriers to be erected for the protection of persons and property against accidents or damages, a sufficient number of red lights must be maintained at night from sunset until sunrise, as shall be sufficient to warn pedestrians of the dangerous condition of the locality, and further conditioned that upon failure to comply with the provisions of the ordinance of said City entitled "An Ordinance Relative to the Construction and Repairing of Sidewalks" adopted and passed January eleventh, 1928, the license granted shall be revoked and cancelled.

SECTION IV. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, nor more than seventy five dollars, and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment at hard labor in the common jail of the County of Kent or in any penitentiary, jail or workhouse, house of correction or almshouse of said City, in the discretion of the Court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than sixty days; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned at hard labor in the common jail of the County of Kent, or in any penitentiary jail, workhouse or house of correction, or almshouse of said City, until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not less than five days nor more than sixty days.

SECTION V. All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the Village of East Grand Rapids, inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect February first, 1928.

AN ORDINANCE Relative to the Construction and Repairing of Sidewalks in the City of East Grand Rapids, and to Require Owners of Property to Construct, Rebuild or Repair the Same and Pay for the Expense thereof, and to Provide for a Penalty for Failure to Construct, Rebuild or Repair any Sidewalk when Required by the Commission of said City, and to Repeal all Ordinances of the Village of East Grand Rapids Conflicting therewith:

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

SECTION I. All sidewalks on any of the public streets, avenues or alleys which shall hereafter be laid, constructed or repaired within the City of East Grand Rapids shall be of such width as the Commission shall hereafter from time to time determine, but not less than five and one half feet in width in any case, and all sidewalks shall be laid, constructed, rebuilt or repaired of cement as follows: On clay soil an excavation of one foot below sidewalk grade shall be made, and the same refilled with sand, gravel or cinders to within four inches of sidewalk grade, and said filling shall be thoroughly rammed and packed. Upon said filling a concrete foundation shall be laid composed of not more than six parts good clean bank gravel to one part of Portland cement and the same shall be thoroughly mixed and be three and one quarter inches in thickness. A surface or top dressing shall be laid upon such foundation, such dressing to be not less than three fourths inches in thickness, and composed of two parts of good clean sharp sand to one part of Portland cement; all work to be done in a good and workmanlike manner and under the direction and approval of the Director of Public Works and Service or other officer designated by the Commission, and all walks shall be laid with an incline downward from the inner side of any such walk toward the center of the street of one fourth inch to the foot, and the inside line of such sidewalks shall be laid in the street and not more than one foot from the lot line.

SECTION II. All sidewalks shall be laid on a grade of not less than six inches above the curb line of the pavement in the street adjoining such sidewalk, and not less than six inches above the center of the roadway of streets having no curbs, unless the Commission shall otherwise direct; and sidewalks shall be so laid that they shall be of a uniform and level surface throughout the length of the street, and it shall be unlawful for any person or persons, corporations associations or officer, to construct, lay or rebuild any sidewalk on any of the public streets, avenues or alleys in the City of East Grand Rapids without first having obtained the proper grade, width and alignment for such sidewalks from the Department of Public Works and Service; provided, however, that no sidewalk shall be laid on a grade more than one foot above the grade line of the curb in any street without the permission of the City Commission.

SECTION III. Whenever the City Commission shall order any sidewalk to be constructed, or any existing sidewalk to be rebuilt or repaired, it shall be the duty of the Director of Public Works and Service to give to the owner or occupant of the premises in front of or adjoining the street in which said sidewalk is to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired, written notice to construct, rebuild or repair the same within the time fixed by the City Commission after the service of such notice on such owner or occupant. If the premises be unoccupied, and the owner be a non-resident of the City of East Grand Rapids, then said Director may service said notice by posting the same in a conspicuous place on the premises and in case the resident, owner or occupant shall be absent from said premises, said notice may be served by leaving a copy of the same at the residence of such person, with some adult person of his or her family.

SECTION IV. If such sidewalk shall not be constructed, rebuilt or repaired within the time fixed by the notice required in the preceding section, it shall be the duty of the Director of Public Works and Service to make written report to the Council of the neglect or refusal of the owners or occupants to comply with said notice to construct, rebuild or repair such walk, and the Commission may then order and direct said Director to cause such sidewalk to be constructed, rebuilt or repaired, as the case may be, and make report and return it to the City Commission of his doings in the premises, and he shall at the same time prepare and an account of the expense for labor, materials and services incurred thereby, verified by the City Manager, and report the same, together with a correct description of the premises in front of, adjoining to or about which such work shall have been done, and the name of the owner thereof, to the Commission, as required by the provisions of Section 9 of Chapter 13 of the City Charter.

SECTION V. Upon receiving the account of the cost and expense of constructing, rebuilding or repairing such sidewalk as prescribed in the preceding section, the Commission shall determine what amount or part of such expense shall be charged, and the person against whom, and the premises upon which the same shall be levied as a special assessment, and shall cause such amount so determined to be charged, together with a penalty of ten per cent in addition thereto, to be reported by the City Clerk to the Board of Assessors to be levied by them as a special tax or assessment upon the lot or premises adjacent to and abutting upon said sidewalk in the manner and as provided in Chapter 13 of the City Charter.

SECTION VI. Where any cinder or gravel paths are to be constructed and laid in any public street or alley in the City of East Grand Rapids, such paths shall be constructed and laid under the supervision of the Director of Public Works and Service, and in such manner as the Director of Public Works and Service may direct, but no paths shall be constructed and laid unless permission therefor is granted by the City Commission.

SECTION VII. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, nor more than seventy five dollars, and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment at hard labor in the common jail of the County of Kent or in any penitentiary, jail or almshouse, workhouse or house of correction, of said City, in the discretion of the Court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than sixty days; and in case such Court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned at hard labor in the common jail of the County of Kent, or in any penitentiary, jail, workhouse, house of correction or almshouse of said City, until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not less than five days nor more than sixty days.

SECTION VIII. All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the Village of East Grand Rapids, inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take Effect February one, 1928.

AN ORDINANCE To Regulate Oil and Gasoline Filling Stations in the City of East Grand Rapids, and to Limit the Number of Locations Thereof, and the Granting of Licenses Therefor:

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. No oil and gasoline filling station shall hereafter be located and established within the City of East Grand Rapids, whether located on or near the curb of any street or other public way, or what is commonly known as drive-in station, without first obtaining a license and permit therefor in accordance with the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 2. Application for a license and permit to operate and conduct an oil and gasoline filling station shall be addressed to the City Commission and filed with the City Clerk, and such application shall state the location of such proposed filling station and the capacity of the tank or tanks to be used, and how such oil and gasoline shall be stored and sold.

Section 3. No license shall be granted for any such filling station for any location outside of the limits of the Commercial District as established by the Zoning Ordinance of the City of East Grand Rapids, adopted April 3rd, 1922, nor for any location where by reason of traffic conditions or fire or explosion hazard a filling station would endanger and imperil the public safety, and no such license shall be granted for any location within two hundred (200) feet of any school, church, theatre, park or any other place of public assembly which has a seating capacity of two hundred (200) or more persons, nor for any location within two hundred (200) feet of any building occupied in whole or in part as a dwelling house, and not more than five licenses shall be granted for such filling stations within the City of East Grand Rapids: Provided, that a license may be granted for such filling stations for a location with less than two hundred (200) feet of any building within said Commercial District occupied in whole or in part as a dwelling house when the owners of not less than seventy five percent of such buildings used for dwelling house purposes consent thereto in writing and such written consent is filed with the Clerk of this City.

Section 4. The distance from a place of dwelling, school, church, theatre or other place of public assembly to the location of such filling station as provided in the preceding section of this ordinance shall be measured from the nearest pump or tank to the front entrance, or to the nearest portion of the dwelling or auditorium in which the public are gathered. In case of a park, the measurements shall be from the nearest pump or tank to the regular entrance of said park; provided, however, that the foregoing provisions for parks shall not be construed to include Ramona Park, so-called, or small triangular parks not used or designated as public assembly grounds.

Section 5. Upon the granting of such license by the City Commission the Clerk shall issue the same upon the payment of an installation fee of \$35.00 for the current year and thereafter an annual inspection fee of \$10.00 per pump, payable upon the first day of May of each year.

Section 6. No person shall sell any gasoline for delivery directly into the tank upon any automobile or motor truck within the City of East Grand Rapids while the engine of such automobile or motor truck is running, and no gasoline shall be delivered into the tank of any automobile or motor truck unless drawn from a tank buried at least three feet underground.

Section 7. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$100.00 and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County, in the discretion of the Court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until such fine and costs is paid, for a period not exceeding ninety days.

Section 8. All ordinances or parts of ordinances heretofore adopted by the Village of East Grand Rapids inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect February 11, 1928.

AN ORDINANCE

TO PROHIBIT THE REMOVAL OF SWARD AND EARTH OR OTHER SUBSTANCE FROM THE PUBLIC STREETS, HIGHWAYS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC PLACES IN THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS, AND TO REGULATE THE MAKING OF EXCAVATIONS THEREIN, AND TO REQUIRE EXCAVATIONS MADE IN, AND MATERIALS OR OTHER OBSTRUCTIONS PLACED UPON ANY SUCH STREETS, HIGHWAYS, ALLEYS AND PUBLIC PLACES TO BE GUARDED AGAINST ACCIDENT OR INJURY TO PERSONS OR PROPERTY, AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES CONFLICTING HEREWITH.

THE CITY OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to excavate and remove or carry away any sward, gravel, sand or earth from any part of any public street, highway, alley or other public place, or to excavate any hole, trench or drain in any such street, highway, alley or other public place in the City of East Grand Rapids without first obtaining written permission therefor from the City Commission or Manager of said City.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to deposit or place, or cause to be deposited or placed, any lumber, stone, brick, steel, iron, cement, sand, gravel or other building material, or any log, wood, timber, dirt, earth, ashes or other articles or obstructions of any kind and nature in or upon any part of any public street, highway, alley, sidewalk, or other public place in the City of East Grand Rapids without first obtaining written permission therefor from the City Commission or Manager of said City; provided, that this section shall not apply to shade or ornamental trees planted in any public street, highway or other public place in said city.

Section 3. Whenever the City Commission or City Manager shall grant a permit to any person or persons to excavate and remove any sward, gravel, sand or earth, or to excavate any hole, trench or drain, or to deposit or place any material or articles of obstructions mentioned in section two of this ordinance, in and upon any part of any public street, highway, alley, sidewalk or other public place in said city, such permit shall be in writing or printed and shall designate the time and place for which said permit is granted and specify the manner in which the purpose and object for which said permit is granted shall be performed, and in case the licensee under any such permit shall not perform all the requirements and conditions of such permit, or shall not comply with the provisions of the ordinances of said city governing or regulating the objects and things for which such permit was granted, then such permit shall be revoked and cancelled by the commission or officer granting it, and written notice of such revocation shall be given to the licensee under the permit to or to his agent or employee, and it shall be unlawful for such licensee to thereafter proceed under and by virtue of such permit, and he shall, within five days after receiving such notice of revocation, replace any sward, gravel, sand or earth removed by him, and refill any hole, trench or other excavation made by him upon any public street, highway, alley or other public place in said city at his own expense, and failure to comply with this provision of this ordinance shall subject such licensee to the punishment and penalty hereinafter provided for by this ordinance.

Section 4. Whenever a permit is granted to any person or persons under the provisions of this ordinance, such person or persons shall erect and maintain a good, strong and sufficient barrier around all excavations made by him or them under such permit, and around all materials or obstructions deposited or placed upon any public street, highway, alley, sidewalk or other public place in said city under and by virtue of such permit in such manner as to prevent accidents or injury to persons or property, and such person or persons shall also place, keep and maintain upon such barrier, and upon the piles of dirt and the aforesaid materials, articles or other obstructions deposited and placed upon such streets, highways, alleys, sidewalks or other public places, suitable and a sufficient number of colored lights showing a bright red color from sunset to sunrise of each and every night during all the time such barrier is maintained, and such excavation, hole, trench, or drain remains open and during all the time any such lumber, stone, brick, steel, iron, cement, sand, gravel, earth, or other building material or obstructions shall remain in and upon any such street, highway, alley, sidewalk or public place.

Section 5. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00), nor more than two hundred dollars (\$200.00) and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not less than five nor more than ninety days.

Section 6. All ordinances and parts of ordinances of the City or Village of East Grand Rapids conflicting or inconsistent with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Resolved, by the Commission of the City of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, that Sections 2, 3, 8 and 11 of Chapter 7, entitled "Registration, Nomination and Election", and Section 16 of Chapter 10, entitled "General Finance", and the entire of Chapter 11 entitled "Bonds", and Section 30 of Chapter 18, entitled "Miscellaneous", of the Charter of the City be amended to read as follows:

## "CHAPTER VII"

## - Registration, Nomination and Election -

## Nomination.

Section 2. Candidates for any elective office to be voted for at any Municipal Election under the provisions of this Charter shall be nominated at a Primary Election and no other names shall be printed on the municipal election ballot for the election of such officer. In case a vacancy in any elective office is to be filled at any municipal election, candidates to fill such vacancy shall be nominated at the Primary preceding such election and the nominating petitions, primary and municipal election ballots shall state that the nomination and election for such office is to fill a vacancy". Provided, that in all Primary Elections any candidate for an office who receives a majority of all votes cast for that office shall thereby be elected.

$\frac{1}{2}$  Section 3. The Primary Election for the nomination of candidates for all elective offices, shall be held on the third Monday preceding a General Municipal Election, and in case no candidate receives a majority at a primary election, then the two candidates for each office receiving the highest number of votes shall thereby be nominated and their names placed upon the municipal election ballot.

Section 8. Candidates for elective offices, except City Commissioner, shall be nominated from the City at large by petition. Candidates for the office of City Commissioner shall be nominated by petition and elected by the qualified electors of the ward in which they reside. Each nominating petition shall be signed by not less than twenty-five qualified electors and shall be filed with the City Clerk before 5 o'clock in the afternoon of the twentieth day before the primary election day. Each elector signing such petitions shall add his residential street and number and date of signing, and if any elector shall sign petitions for more candidates for any office than the number to be elected to such office, his signature shall be void on all petitions for that office. Nominating petitions shall be on blanks furnished by the City Clerk.

Section 11. The inhabitants of the City having the qualifications of electors under the constitution and general laws of the State, and no other, shall be electors therein. Every elector shall vote in the election precinct where he shall have resided during the twenty days next preceding the day of election. The residence of any elector, not being a householder, shall be deemed to be in the election precinct in which is located his regular place of lodging: Provided, that where a qualified elector moves from one voting precinct

to another voting precinct in the same ward in the City during the twenty days preceding any election, such elector shall be eligible to vote in the precinct where he resided prior to moving.

#### CHAPTER X.

##### General Finance

Section 16. No public work or improvement shall be commenced, or expenditures made, nor any contract therefor be let or made (excepting as herein otherwise provided) until an appropriation has been made or a special assessment shall have been levied, to pay the cost and expense thereof. No such work or improvement shall be paid for or contracted to be paid for, except from the proceeds of such appropriation or special assessment, or from the proceeds of bonds or other obligations issued in anticipation of the collection of such appropriation or special assessment.

#### CHAPTER XI.

##### Bonds

Section 1.. The City Commission may borrow money and issue bonds therefor on the faith and credit of the city for all lawful public purposes including necessary lands therefor (except as otherwise provided in this charter) whenever so authorized to do by a three fifths vote of the electors of the City cast at an election wherein the question of issuing such bonds is lawfully submitted, provided, that the bonded indebtedness of the city shall at no time exceed six per centum of the assessed valuation of all real and personal property in the city subject to taxation as shown by the assessment roll for the fiscal year in which such election is held; and provided further, that bonds issued for public improvements for which a special assessment district is made to pay therefor, and which are a charge upon such district, and bonds issued for emergency purposes, and bonds secured by mortgages on the property and franchise of a public utility shall not be included, and the resources of the sinking fund shall be deducted, in determining the amount of such bonded indebtedness.

Section 2. The City Commission as such is hereby authorized to borrow money and issue the bonds of the city for the payment thereof for the following purposes:

(a) To pay for any public improvement in anticipation of the receipts from special assessments levied at or prior to the time such loan is made and such bonds to be made payable in installments approximately corresponding to the installments of such special assessments. Such bonds may be issued at the time of the letting of the contract for the improvement, if work is done by contract, or upon the estimated cost of the improvement when the Commission shall determine that the work shall not be done by contract. The loan shall not exceed in amount the contract price or the estimated cost of the improvement after deducting the amount of the first installment when the special assessment therefor is to be paid in annual installments. The Commission shall pledge the faith and credit of the city for the payment of such bonds, and the special assessments when collected shall be placed in a sinking fund for their payment.

(b.) To pay the City's share for the cost of street improvements, water mains, water filtration or purifying plants, works increasing the water supply, sewers, drains, sewage disposal and treatment works and disposition thereof, and for enlarging, improving or extending the same, not to exceed the sum of Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000) in any one year, but no sum shall be borrowed for such purposes in excess of seventy-five per centum of the cost of such improvements nor for a longer time than fifteen years

(c.) In case of fire, floods, disease epidemics, and other calamity, the Commission may borrow, for the relief of the inhabitants, of the City and for the preservation of municipal property, a sum not exceeding one fourth of one per centum of the assessed value of all taxable real and personal property in the city, due in not more than three years. Bonds of the city payable in equal annual installments may be issued for any such loan.

(d.) For the renewal of bonds falling due from time to time the payment of which at maturity is not required by this charter or by the laws of the state of Michigan.

(e.) To pay any judgment or decree that shall have been rendered against the city for payment of which there are no available funds.

Section 3. All details as to the terms and form of bonds and the issue thereof shall be determined by the City Commission.

Section 4. The City Commission shall make provision for a sinking fund with which to pay at maturity all bonds issued by the city except serial bonds which fall due annually.

#### CHAPTER XVIII

#### -Miscellaneous-

Section 30. Amendments to this Charter may be proposed either by the City Commission on affirmative vote of not less than five of its members or by the people of the city of East Grand Rapids under the provisions of the initiative so far as applicable; provided, that no amendments to this charter shall become effective unless approved by a majority of the electors voting at a general or primary municipal election or at a special election called for such purpose."

-----

And be it further resolved that the aforesaid proposed amendments to the city charter be submitted to the qualified electors of the city of East Grand Rapids for adoption at the General Municipal Election to be held in the city on the 2nd day of April, 1928, and that the City Clerk be and he is hereby directed to prepare the necessary and proper ballots for submission at such election of said proposed amendments and that he give notice of the election within the time and in the manner as required by the provisions of the City Charter and the laws of this state relating thereto. And also that a copy of said proposed amendments certified by the City Clerk to be a true copy thereof, be transmitted by said Clerk to the Governor of this State for his approval.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved, by the Commission of the City of East Grand, that said proposed amendments be submitted to the qualified electors of the City of East Grand Rapids for adoption or rejection at the General Municipal Election to be held in this City on the 2nd day of April, 1928, and that the ballot for said election shall contain the substance of said proposed amendments and be in the following form, viz:

"Shall sections two, three, eight and eleven of Chapter seven, and section sixteen of Chapter ten, and the entire of Chapter eleven, and section thirty of Chapter eighteen of the Charter of the City be amended as proposed by resolution of the Commission of this city adopted at a regular session thereof held February 20, 1928, which proposed amendments are in substance as follows:"

CHAPTER VII. Section 2. By adding this section the following: "In case a vacancy in any office is to be filled, the nominating petitions, primary and municipal election ballots shall state that the nomination and election is to fill a vacancy."

Section 3. By adding to this section the following: "And in case no candidate receiving a majority at a primary election, then the two candidates receiving the highest number of votes shall be nominated and their names placed on the election ballot."

Section 8. Amending this section by requiring nominating petitions to be filed by five o'clock in the afternoon of the twentieth day before the primary, and providing that if an elector signs petitions for more candidates for any office than the number to be elected, his signature shall be void on all petitions for that office.

Section 11. Amending this section to provide that an elector moving from one precinct to another in the same ward during the twenty days preceding an election shall be eligible to vote in the precinct where he resided prior to moving.

CHAPTER X. Section 16. By adding to this section the underscored words, "No public or improvement shall be commenced, or expenditures made, nor any contract therefor be let or made until an appropriation has been made or special assessment shall have been levied to pay the cost and expense thereof."

CHAPTER XI. To amend the entire chapter to provide as follows:

Section 1. The City Commission may borrow money and issue bonds on the faith and credit of the city for all lawful public purposes whenever authorized by a three fifths vote, and to limit the bonded indebtedness to six per cent of the total assessed property valuation in the city as shown by the tax roll for the fiscal year in which the election is held, and bonds issued for public improvements to be paid for by special assessment, and bonds issued for emergency purposes, and bonds secured by mortgages on the property and franchise of a public utility shall not be included in determining the amount of the bonded indebtedness, and the resources of the sinking fund shall be deducted.

Section 2. To authorize the City Commission to borrow money and issue city bonds for the following purposes:

(a). To pay for public improvements in anticipation of receipts from special assessments and the bonds to be payable in installments corresponding to the installments of the special assessments, and such loan not to exceed the estimated cost after deducting the first installment and pledging the faith and credit of the City to the payment of such bonds.

(b). To pay the city's share for the cost of street improvements, water mains, water filtration or purifying plants, increasing water supply, sewers, drains, sewage disposal and treatment works, and for enlarging same, a sum not exceeding \$50,000 in any one year, but no sum to be borrowed over 75 percent of the cost of such improvement nor for a longer time than fifteen years.

(c). In case of fire, floods, disease epidemics and other calamity, to borrow for the relief of the city inhabitants, a sum not exceeding one fourth of one per cent of the assessed valuation of the city.

(d). To renew bonds payment of which is not required at maturity.

(e). To pay any judgment or decree rendered against the city.

Section 3. The commission shall determine all details as to form and terms of bonds and their issue.

Section 4. To provide for a sinking fund to pay outstanding bonds at maturity, except serial bonds falling due annually.

CHAPTER XVIII. Section 30. Amendments to this charter may be proposed by the Commission upon affirmative vote of not less than five members, or by the people under the initiative provisions; no amendment shall become effective unless approved by a majority of the electors voting at a general, primary or special election called for such purposes.

"WHEREAS, first party is the owner of a Park & Boulevard system around Reed's Lake in the City of East Grand Rapids, known as Reeds Lake Boulevard, and

"WHEREAS, second party is desirous of building a trunk line sewer and installing water mains in a portion of said park and boulevard system, Now Therefore,

"In consideration of, and upon the terms and conditions hereinafter mentioned, said first party hereby grants permission to second party to build and maintain a sewer and water mains, in and across said park and boulevard system over the route indicated in the map or blueprint dated June, 1928, and annexed hereto and made a part hereof.

"Second party hereby agrees to build and install the said sewer and water main according to terms of this agreement, and to complete the same on or before the 31st day of December, 1928. Said sewer and water mains shall be built and installed according to the following specifications:

(a) Said sewer and water mains shall each be twelve inches in diameter and shall be of cast iron flanged pipe, or bell and spigot pipe calked with lead.

(b) Said sewer shall be so constructed as to limit infiltration to not to exceed five thousand gallons per mile per day, including the manholes.

(c) Sufficient earth cover shall be provided over the said sewer and water mains to protect the same against injury from freezing or from travel over the same, or from the dropping of heavy objects upon the ground above the same.

(d) Manholes for such sewer shall be placed at intervals not greater than 300 feet apart, and if practical shall be placed at each change of the line or grade of said sewer. If said manholes are constructed of brick, they shall be constructed in the dry on a sufficient concrete foundation, with brick plastered inside and out, with not less than one-half inch cement mortar, carried to the full length of the manhole. Manholes shall have standard cast iron covers, with the top of the same at an elevation not less than two feet above the present level of the lagoons in said park and boulevard system, and sufficient earth shall be placed and graded about the manholes so as to give the same a satisfactory appearance from the boulevards.

In consideration of the permission herein granted, said second party further agrees:

(a) That it will provide not less than three hydrants on the water mains within the limits of Hodsnyple Park, in said park and boulevard system, one of which shall be placed near the east, one near the west line and one near the center of said

"Park, and furnish without charge, water service through said hydrants to first party, in the event of fire or other emergency.

(b) First party may make connections with said water main and with said sewer, at its own expense, in the event that it shall establish comfort stations along the said boulevard. Water service and sewer service for said stations shall be furnished by second party to first party without charge.

(c) That no assessment or tax shall be levied against first party, or its property, to pay the cost of installing or maintaining said sewer or water main.

(d) That second party will replace and re-surface where necessary, the boulevard and park, to leave the same in as good condition, when said sewer and mains are installed, as it is now, and that in the event that maintenance or repair work shall require the disturbing of said boulevard and park in the future, the second party in each instance shall replace and re-surface the same to leave the same in as good condition as before the doing of such work.

(e) Second party shall not destroy any trees or shrubbery in said park, without consent of the Director of Public Welfare of the City of Grand Rapids. Upon completion of the work, second party shall collect and burn, or otherwise dispose of all brush, stumps or other debris accumulated in the course of the work.

(f) Second party shall so maintain said sewer, as to protect the lagoons and other parts of the park from contamination or leakage from the sewer, and to prevent the same from becoming a nuisance or a menace to health.

(g) Second party shall regularly patrol, inspect and maintain the said sewer and water main in a proper and efficient working condition, and in the event of the failure of second party to make any necessary repairs after notice of it, first party may make such repairs at the expense of second party.

(h) In the event that second party shall abandon said sewer or water main, it shall remove the conduits, and leave the park and boulevard in as good condition as before removing the same.

(i) Upon completion of the construction of said sewer and water mains, second party shall file with the Director of Public Welfare, certified correct blueprints, showing the location and profile of the sewer and main so constructed.

"(j) In the event that the future development of the park and boulevard shall require the changing of the route within reasonable limits from their present location, the City Commission of the City of Grand Rapids may require second party to make such changes, as are necessary, and second party shall make the same within six months after receipt of notice of the action of the Commission. This will acknowledge your letter relative to special assessments. You say, -

'Chapter 13, Section 1 of the Charter of the City of East Grand Rapids reads as follows:

'The Commission shall have power to provide for the payment of all or any part of the cost of construction, reconstruction, repair, operation or maintenance of any structures or work in the nature of public improvement, by levying and collecting special assessments upon property specially benefited. Such special assessments may be payable in yearly installments for a period not exceeding ten years.'

'The Charter was adopted in 1927 in pursuance of the Home Rule Law, Act No. 279, P.A. 1909, as amended. Will you kindly advise whether the City may legally assess the entire cost of public improvements to a special assessment district in pursuance of the Charter provision above quoted and Section 3307 (h) C.L. 1915, notwithstanding Sections 3110 and 3217, C.L. 1915, which latter, places limitations on the amount of special assessments based on assessed valuation.'

You are advised that Section 4, of Act No. 279, P.A. 1909, as last amended, by Act No. 224, P.A. 1925, reads in part as follows:

'Sec. 4. Each city may in its charter provide: \* \* \* and for assessing and re-assessing the costs, or any portion therefor, of any public improvement to a special district;'

Sections 3110 and 3217, C.L. 1915, to which you refer, are respectively Section 5 of Chapter 24 and Section 7 of Chapter 30 of Act No. 215, P.A. 1895, as amended. This act, as you are aware, is,

'An Act to provide for the incorporation of cities of fourth class.'

These sections have no application to cities organized under the provisions of Act No. 279, P.A. 1909, as amended, unless they are expressly adopted as a part of the charter formed under the provisions of said act of 1909.

Specifically, this question relates to the right of the owner of a lumber yard to carry on a coal business along with the lumber business. The property is located in a District which is not commercial, and therefore each of the uses would be a non-conforming use. However, the lumber business was established, I am informed, prior to the Zoning Ordinance, and therefore can be continued.

Under Section 8 of the Zoning Ordinance, it is my opinion that an additional non-conforming use cannot be added to the present use of property which already constitutes a non-conforming use.
