PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF  
EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN. Special  
meeting held January 13, 1926.

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The Council was called to order by President Kenyon.

Present: Trustees Campbell, Frye, MacNeil, Tinkler.--4.

Absent: Trustees Osborn, Schuitema.--2.

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The President stated that this meeting for the purpose of revoking the license granted to the Rendezvous on account of the advertisement published in the Grand Rapids Herald on January 11, 1926 which in itself was enough evidence for the Council to act on.

After hearing remarks made by Mr. Fred Gycax and others and a thorough discussion by the Council members, Trustee Campbell offered the following resolution:

RESOLUTION BY TRUSTEE CAMPBELL:

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids within the last few days that the cabaret and restaurant known as the The Rendezvous located in our village is being conducted in such manner as to be a disgrace upon this community and in flagrant violation of the laws of the State of Michigan, and in violation of the terms of the license issued to the proprietors of said Rendezvous, now therefore, be it

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AN ORDINANCE

To regulate the Installation and Use of Oil Burners and the Handling and Storage of Fuel Oils for Heating Purposes.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. The provisions of this ordinance relative of the storage, handling and sale of fuel oil in the Village of East Grand Rapids, having a flash point about 120 degrees Fahrenheit, shall apply only to the use of such fuel oil for oil burners as specified herein, and this ordinance shall in no way supercede or conflict with any law or regulation of the State of Michigan now in force relating to the installation and use of oil burners, the handling and storage of fuel oils for heating purposes, or for the handling and sale of inflammable liquids for any other purpose.

Section 2. For the purpose of this ordinance the following words shall be defined as follows:

(a) "Fuel Oil" shall mean any liquid used as fuel in fuel oil burners for heating purposes and having a flash point above 120 degrees Fahrenheit.

(b) "Fuel Oil Burners" shall mean any device, including burners, motors, piping, valves and other equipment designed and arranged for the purpose of burning fuel oil for heating purposes.

(c) "Tank" shall mean any container for such fuel oil, having a capacity of more than 25 gallons, and directly or indirectly connected with such fuel oil burners.

(d) "Storage Tank" shall mean any tank used for the storage of oil, connected through some approved means of suction feed directly to the fuel oil burner, or indirectly through a manually operated device or an approved control.

(e) "Auxiliary Tank" shall mean any tank, permitted under three regulations delivering oil by gravity or pressure to the fuel oil burner or blower.

(f) "Department of Safety Engineering" shall mean such Department of the village as may be designated by the Chief of the Fire Marshall Division of the State of Michigan.

Section 3. Before any fuel oil burners, tanks and other equipment pertaining thereto shall be installed within the Village of East Grand Rapids, the owner of such premises or his agent shall, in addition to obtaining a permit for such installation from the state fire marshall's office, make application to the village fire marshall for a permit to make such installation from the village. A village permit for the installation of any such fuel oil burners and equipment and for the storage and use of fuel oil for the operation thereof, shall not be issued until such an application has made application to state Fire Marshall for the permit required by the Department of Safety Engineering.

Section 4. In addition to the tests and investigations made by the department of safety engineering covering the arrangements of parts, suitability of materials, strength of parts, electrical control, thermostatic arrangements, sensitiveness of automatic features, positiveness of ignition, safeguards against flooding, possibilities of explosions and hydrostatic or air pressure testing of storage tanks, similar tests and investigations shall be made by the Village inspector, and in making such inspections he shall have the right to enter the premises of every owner of property upon which fuel oil burners are installed and fuel oil is stored and that such inspections shall be made at least once a month.

Section 5. Oil burners shall be equiped as provided by the regulations prescribed therefore by the state fire marshall.

Section 6. All electrical construction in connection with fuel oil burners and storage tanks shall be installed in accordance with the provisions of the village ordinance relating thereto, and all electrical wiring in basements shall be run in rigid iron pipes and conform in every respect to said village ordinance. All such electrical wiring and devices shall not be used until inspection certificate that such all electrical wiring and construction is issued by the electrical inspector of the village.

Section 7. The fees for the issuance of permits and for inspections as provided for in this ordinance shall be fixed from time to time by the Council and such fees for permits shall accompany the applications for permits and all other fees shall be paid upon statements rendered by the clerk of the Village.

Section 8. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than Fifty (\$ 50.00) Dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent for a period not exceeding sixty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and cost the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of the county until the payment of such fine and costs, but not longer than sixty days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect March 12th. A. D., 1926.

You will be required to state definitely and exactly what statutes do govern the above stated CAUCUS & ELECTION, and on what dates they may have become effective as statutes and whether or not they have been repealed by later statutes enacted by the Mich. State Legislature.

You are hereby required to make this report in written form in duplicate and that you yourself shall vouch for the accuracy and truthfulness of this report above described.

He then read the report he had written in reply as follows:

To the President and Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids.

Gentlemen:

In compliance with the order of some of the trustees of the Village commanding me as attorney for the village to make a report to the village council under what law the village of East Grand Rapids is conducting its caucus and election of village officers, and further commanding me to state exactly and definitely what law governs such caucus and election, with their dates and other matters concerning said laws, and commanding me to make written report thereof in duplicate and that I shall myself vouch for the accuracy and truthfulness of my report, I respectfully submit the following:

FIRST.

ELECTIONS IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS. The election of village officers in the village of East Grand Rapids is governed by the provisions of Act No. 3 of the Public Acts of Michigan for the year 1895 which is the general act for the incorporation of villages and was approved and become effective February 19, 1895.

Section 7 of Chapter 3 of said act provides as follows:

"All elections in said village shall be conducted as nearly as may be in the manner provided by law for holding general elections in the state, except as herein otherwise provided; and the inspectors of such election shall

have the same powers and authority for the preservation of order, and for enforcing obedience to their lawful commands during the time of holding the election and the canvass of the votes, as are conferred by law upon inspectors of general elections held in this state. If at any election vacancies are to be filled, or if any person is to be elected for less than a full term of office, the term shall be designated on the ballot."

The law for holding general elections in the state mentioned in the above section is Act. No. 351 of the Public Acts of Michigan for the year 1925 which was approved May 27, 1925, and is known as the "MICHIGAN ELECTION LAW". The provisions of said act applicable to elections is found in Part Four (4).

SECOND.

CAUCUSES. There is no statute in this state which provides for caucuses by villages, and at the present time the village Council of East Grand Rapids has no jurisdiction or control over any political party caucus held in the village. If the voters of the village of East Grand Rapids shall elect to come under the provisions of Chapter 9 of Part 3 of Act No. 351 of the Public Acts of 1925, which statute provides for primaries in Village when adopted by the voters of the Village, then certain duties are to be performed by the Council, and village clerk, such as designating the time and place when such primary shall be held, and give notice thereof to appoint the inspectors of elections for such primary, to recount the ballots upon a proper application, and to furnish the proper primary ballots and ballot boxes.

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Attorney Gansser's Report:

To the President and Council of  
the Village of East Grand Rapids:

Gentleman:

As directed by you, I have examined the law relating to a plumbing inspector for East Grand Rapids, which appointment is questioned in the communication of William A. Decker, the Secretary-Treasurer of the Michigan State Association of Plumbing and Heating Dealers.

I find that the law in question is Act No. 222 of the Public Acts of 1901, being Sections 6857 to 6872 of the 1915 Compiled Laws. Section seven of said Act provided that inspectors of plumbing shall not be engaged directly or indirectly in the business of plumbing during the period of their appointment as stated in said communication. However, section fifteen of the Act provided that "this Act shall not apply to cities containing less than fifteen thousand inhabitants." Upon reading the Act it is my opinion that the Village Council may appoint an inspector of plumbing for the village who may also be engaged in the plumbing business during the term of appointment.

The communication in question states that any person engaged in the plumbing business and who is appointed plumbing Inspector should be an active competitor of the firms whose work he would inspect and also be the inspector in his own work, and this statement must be accepted as being substantially corrected and it would seem that the council should take due precaution to avoid, so far as can be, the possibility that any person appointed by it as a Plumbing Inspector who is also actively engaged in the plumbing business, will not take any undue advantage of his position.

At the last meeting of the Vestry of Grace Episcopal Church of Grand Rapids the undersigned, as secretary, was instructed to petition you for a permit to build a church and parish house on the southeast corner of Sherman St. and Rosewood Avenue in the village of East Grand Rapids.

In 1921 Grace Church purchased part of the land they now own at the above location. To give notice of all interested the Church immediately erected two large signs, one facing Sherman St. and one facing Rosewood Ave., each stating that that was the proposed site for a new chapel for Grace Church. Plans have matured so that the church now owns 140 feet on Sherman St. and 225 feet on Rosewood Ave. It is proposed to first build a Parish House which will face Rosewood Ave., well to the south end of the site. Eventually it is planned to build a church north of the Parish House as shown on the attached blue prints.

Grace Church has been endeavoring to serve its members in East Grand Rapids and in eastern part of the city of Grand Rapids by holding a church school in the chapel of Clark Memorial Home. Because of the number of people to be served and the limited accommodations at the Home it is necessary that the church have a building of its own in East Grand Rapids.

It is the plan of the Church, and the architects have been so instructed, to build this church and parish house of a design and quality in harmony with the high class neighborhood. This building is so designed that even before the erection of the church itself it will be an addition architecturally to the neighborhood. When the church is completed the whole structure will be one of which the village may justly be proud.

In accordance with your building code there are attached hereto two sets of blue prints showing the elevations, dimensions of the building and other data drawn to scale by the architect. Grace Church stands ready and willing to supply any other or further information which the council may desire and wishes to assure the council that Grace Church seeks to come among you as one that serves.

AN ORDINANCE

to amend Section Five a" an ordinance entitled "an Ordinance to Establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit of height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereaft erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population off such districts of zones, and to classify, regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof." AND APPROVED April 3rd, 1922, and as amended by ordinance approved September second, nineteen hundred twenty-four, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 5. RESIDENCE DISTRICT A. The following lands and premises not within the Commercial District is hereby designated as the "Residence District A; All the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon either side of Bagley Avenue, Crosewell Avenue, and Lovett Avenue and lying north of a line parallel with the one hundred and fifty (150) feet north of the north line of Lake Drive; All lots, parts of lots and parcels of land fronting or abutting upon either side of Wealthy Street, from the west Village boundary limits of Lovett Avenue, and on either side of Greenwood Avenue, and on the north line of Lakeside Drive from Greenwood Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard; and all the lots Numbered One Hundred eighty-four to One Hundred ninety-two inclusive of Sherman Park Addition to the city of Grand Rapids, Michigan, and the west Forty feet of Lot numbered Thirty of Benjamin's Second Boulevard Plat to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, as now recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for "ent County, Michigan. The Boundary line for said Residence District "A" shall be the rear lot lines of the lands and premises within said district that has been and is now, or that may hereafter be, divided into blocks and lots, but such boundary line shall not be less than one hundred and fifteen (115) feet back from the street line. In the case of unsubdivided lands within said district, such boundary line shall extend back at least one hundred and fifty (150) feet from the abutting street line.

In the Residence District "A" all buildings and premises, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, shall be erected for ~~use~~ used exclusively as:

1. Any use permitted in Residence District B.
2. Two family dwellings.
3. Multiple dwellings.
4. Hotels.
5. Boarding and Lodging Houses.
6. Colleges and Churches.
7. Libraries, Hospitals and Sanitariums.
8. Club Houses and Fraternal Buildings.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that a public hearing upon the adoption of said proposes amendment of said ordinance be held at the Council Room in said Village on Monday, the 10th day of May, 1926, at 8:00 o'clock P.M. and that the Village Clerk be and he is hereby directed to cause notice of said proposed amendment and hearing to be published in the Grand Rapids Herald, a newspaper having a general circulation in said Village, at least fifteen days before said hearing, which said notice shall contain the gist of said proposed amendment and notify all persons interested, that they will be heard at that time and place, and that if any person interested and desiring to object or be heard upon the adoption of said proposed amendment, that they will be heard at that time and place, and that if any person desired to object of such proposed amendment, he shall make such objections in writing and file the same with the Village Clerk, before the hour of said meeting.

To Regulate Dance-Halls, Cabarets, Restaurants, Soft-Drink Emporiums, Clubs, and all other places with the Village of East Grand Rapids where an admission fee, or table cover fee, is charged, or where soft drinks are sold, or where musical or other entertainment is furnished, and to fix the hours when every such place of business shall be closed.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section One: All dance-halls and all cabarets, restaurants, eating-houses, soft-drink emporiums, clubs and other places, except drug stores and pool rooms, within the Village of East Grand Rapids where an admission fee, or table cover fee, is charged, or where soft-drinks are sold or kept for sale at retail, or where food or civtuals are dispensed and sold, and where musical or theatrical or other entertainment is furnished and given to the patrons and customers of any such cabaret, restaurant, eating-house, soft-drink emporium, club or other place, shall be closed on the first day of the week commonly called Sunday, and on each week day night from and after the hour of twelve o'clock until six o'clock of the morning of the succeeding day, and on all other days when such places of business are required to be closed by the laws of the State of Michigan. The hours herein designated when all such places of business shall be closed shall be defined to mean the like hours of the time adopted and in force from time to time in the City of Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Section Two: No owner or proprietor of any dance-hall, cabaret, restaurant, eating-house, soft-drink emporium, club or other place mentioned in section one of this ordinance shall permit in or about his place of business or premises any noise, riots, fights, disturbance or other disorderly conduct, or permit any dice or game of chance or other gambling game to be played in or about his or her place of business, for money or other thing of value, or the betting of money or anything of value upon the result of any game, nor permit any person to become intoxicated, or if intoxicated to remain in or about his or her place of business.

Section Three: No person, persons, firm, association or corporation shall engage in and operate a public dance-hall, cabaret, restaurant or eating-house where musical or theatrical entertainment is furnished to patrons, nor engage in and operate a soft-drink emporium, within the Village of East Grand Rapids without having first obtained the license required by the ordinances of this Village, and every license issued to any such person, persons, firm, association or corporation shall only be issued upon the express condition that in case such licensee shall be convicted of violating the provisions of this ordinance in a court having jurisdiction, such license shall, by a majority vote of the Village Trustees elect, be revoked, forfeited, and become null and void.

Section Four: This ordinance shall not extend to any concert or entertainment given by the pupils of any public or private school, or given for the exclusive benefit of any church or charitable or benevolent object in this Village.

Section Five: Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, or conviction thereof, shall, in addition to having his or her license revoked as provided in section three of this ordinance, be punished by a fine of not less than ten dollars, nor more than ninety dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of the County of Kent, in the discretion of the magistrate or court before whom such conviction may be had, for a period of not more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall impose a fine and costs, such offender shall be remanded to said jail until the payment of such fine and costs, but not to exceed a period of ninety days.

To Amend Section eight of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Relative to the Establishment of the Fire Department, and for the Extinguishment and Prevention of Fires in the Village of East Grand Rapids," approved July 5th, 1921.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section One: Section eight of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance relative to the establishment of a fire department, and for the extinguishment and prevention of fires in the village of East Grand Rapids," approved July 5th, 1921, is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section Eight: The members of the fire department shall be limited to fourteen in addition to the chief of the department, and

they shall be appointed by the chief with the advice and consent of the council, and such number of them as the council shall from time to time determine shall be employed as full time firemen. The Chief of the department shall receive a yearly salary of Three Hundred Dollars to be paid monthly, and full time firemen shall receive a salary of such sum per day as the council shall fix from time to time to be paid twice monthly, and all full time firemen shall be on duty twenty-four consecutively hours and shall be off duty twenty-four consecutively hours and be entitled to a vacation of not more than ten days during the year with full pay; twelve hours shall be computed as one day and all full time firemen shall furnish their own uniform. The other members of the department shall receive as compensation the sum of Two Dollars for each and every grass fire or similar fire which they attend, and the sum of Five Dollars for each and every fire of any substantial building or dwelling house which they attend, and the further sum of One dollar and fifty cents for each practice and instruction drill attended, but not to exceed eighteen such practice drills in any one year and which drills shall be at oeast of one hour duration, and the conpehnsation for such members of the fire department shall be paid monthly. The fire department neglecting or refusing to answer any alarm of fire without having a good and reasonable excuse therefor, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter provided.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect the 1st day of July, A.D., 1926.

Gentlemen:

I herewith submit a report on the matter of the building line for the new church building at the corner of Lake Drive and Crosswell Avenue as follows:

I personally examined the location of the church building now being rebuilt at the corner of Crosswell Avenue and Lake Drive, and also examined the building line as fixed by the houses now existing on Lake Drive, in the block between Crosswell Avenue and Lovett Avenue.

The first house west of the church is occupied by Mrs. Fisher and was built about the same time as the original church building was erected, and the front main bearing walls of both buildings were then approximately on the same line back from Lake Drive. Since then four other houses have been built in this block west of the Fisher house, and the main front bearing walls of all these houses are approximately on a uniform line with the front wall of the Fisher house. Three of these houses were built with open porches in front of them. Since then the porch on the house at the corner of Lake Drive and Lovett Avenue has been screened in, and the porches on the houses of Mr. Morris and Mr. Bradley have been inclosed with glass. The porch on the Morris house is so arranged that the glass can be taken out and screens put in, and in fact the entire frame-work can be removed without injury to the house. The inclosed porch on the Bradley house is of a more permanent nature and the frame-work for the inclosed porch appears to be attached to the house in such manner as to become an integral part of the house. These inclosed porches have all been built since the houses in question were erected and since the Zoning Ordinance of the Village was passed and were built without permits. The Zoning ordinance does not prohibit the screening in of open porches.

The measurements taken by me show that the distance from the inside sidewalk line to the front wall of the porch on the Norris house is 18 feet 3 inches and the porch is 8 feet wide making the distance from the sidewalk line to the main front bearing wall of the house 26 feet 3 inches, and this distance is approximately the same for the two houses to the west and also the Bradley house. The distance from the inside sidewalk line to the steps of the Fisher house is 17 feet  $6\frac{1}{2}$  inches and the steps are 3 feet 3 inches wide and the porch from the front of the front wall of the house is 6 feet  $9\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide.

The excavation at the front for the church foundation is 17 feet 9 inches from the sidewalk, which is 6 inches nearer to the sidewalk than provided for in the building permit heretofore granted to the church people. It is the contention of Mrs. Fisher that the front wall of the church building should not be nearer the street line than the front bearing walls of the other houses in this block, and this line is the building line established for building was and that the new building should be made to conform to this line.

This block is in "Residence District "B" restricting property uses to single family dwelling houses, and a church in this district is a non-conforming use. By the provisions of the Zoning Ordinance the church property is permitted to be used for that purpose and it is lawful to rebuild the church on this location occupied by the former church which was destroyed by fire.

Section 13 of the Zoning Ordinance divides the village into three Area Districts regulating and limiting the intensity of the use of lot areas and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces, and it provides.

"Except as herein provided no building shall be erected, nor shall an existing building be altered, enlarged, or rebuilt, nor shall any open spaces surrounding any building be encroached upon or reduced in any manner except in conformity with the regulations hereby established for the district in which said building is located."

Section 14 of the ordinance fixes the boundary lines for the "A" Area District" the same as that for "Residence District B", and it provides that the front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling, exclusive of uninclosed porches not more than 10 feet wide shall not be less than 20 per cent of the full depth of the lot, and

not less than 20 feet in depth. This requirement is modified by subdivision 5 of Section 19 of the ordinance which reads as follows:

"When the front wall of dwellings, or the front wall of enclosed porches on dwellings, heretofore erected in any block between two intersecting streets within the A and B Areas Districts have been erected at a practically uniform distance back from the street line, and the building line so established is within the requirements of sections 14 and 15 of the ordinance for front yards, then in such case the extreme front of a dwelling hereafter erected upon lots within any such block shall conform to such established building line."

In the block on Lake Drive, between Lovett and Croswell Avenues, all the dwelling houses have conformed to a uniform building line within the requirements of the ordinance if the front main bearing walls of the houses are to be regarded as the building line and any new building or building rebuilt must conform to such building line and no building permit can be granted which will violate this provision of the ordinance without the consent of the property owners in the block or an amendment to the ordinance.

The porches of all houses but two in the block are open porches. This leaves the character of the porches of the Bradley and Norris houses to be determined. If they are enclosed porches then these houses have violated the ordinance as the Norris house was built since the ordinance was adopted and the porch on the Bradley house was enclosed since the adoption of the ordinance, and enclosing the porches constitutes an encroachment into the front yard area of their lots required by the ordinance. It is quite generally held that a porch, whether open or closed, is an integral part of the house of which it is a part. However, this question has no bearing in this matter as the ordinance permits open porches to be built in the restricted area. Our Supreme Court has said, in a case involving a building line restriction, that one of the objects of such restriction is to secure unobstructed light, air and vision for the lots for whose benefit the restriction is created (219/1), and it is my opinion that when a porch is so screened or glassed in so as to interfere with unobstructed light, air and vision to the adjoining property it becomes an enclosed porch.

However, whether or not these two porches are enclosed, it will not justify the granting of a building permit to erect the main front bearing wall of the proposed church building beyond the building line established by a majority of the houses in the block in question, unless the council, sitting as a board of appeals, is empowered to modify the requirements of the ordinance.

Section 8 of the ordinance provides that in case a building does not conform to the use permitted in the zone in which it is located, and such building is destroyed, it may be rebuilt and used for the same purpose that it was used before such destruction, but such use is subject to the lawful area regulations provided for in the zoning ordinance.

Subdivision D of section 27 provides that the council, sitting as a board of appeals, may reverse or affirm, wholly or partly, or may modify the order, requirements, decision or determination of the building inspector, as in its opinion ought to be made. Where there are practical difficulties or unnecessary hardship in carrying out the strict letter of the zoning ordinance, the board of appeals shall have power to vary or modify any of its rules, regulations and provisions relating to the construction, structural changes in equipment, or alteration of buildings or structures, so that the spirit of this ordinance shall be observed and substantial justice done.

The zoning ordinance contains no provision empowering the board of appeals to modify or vary the provisions and requirements of the ordinances as to front yard area regulations, and it is my opinion that the front wall of the proposed church building should conform to the building line established in the block in which it is to be located and that the building permit heretofore granted to erect the church was not in conformity with the requirements of the ordinance and void and should be revoked.

Gentlemen:

Attached please find check covering taxes on the former Schawben Society Grounds and also on the former Musty property on Lake Drive which we now own.

I was very much surprised to learn that you had raised the assessed valuation on the Musty property, and this new assessment is way out of reason considering the present conditions with the old ice house, barns, and dump adjoining it. We purchased this property solely for the purpose of turning it into a street for an entrance to the Schawben grounds, and we had to pay a price at least twice its value in order to get it.

I believe that anyone will agree that you could not sell this property at the present time for the amount you have assessed it and as I understand, you assess 50% to 60% of the actual sale value or worth which makes your assessment nearly 100% high. The old assessment of \$ 1200 on this property was fair considering the present conditions.

The Musty house will be removed very soon as it is worthless and can not be repaired to bring an income on the property. Therefore, this leaves this property as strictly a vacant lot and none too desirable a location at the present time, and this lot very soon will be turned into a street and dedicated to the Village of East Grand Rapids. Therefore, it seems unjust to be assessed taxes at the valuation you now have it.

Prior to the time your Board of Review was sitting, I understood the assessment would stand at \$ 1200.00 for the remainder of this year at least and did not follow this up because of this assurance.

I believe that you will agree that something should be done to rectify this very evident error in assessment and I am paying this tax on the assessment as you have it under protest and petitioning your Board to make refund or advise their reasons for not doing so as soon as possible.

We are enclosing statement for our services as per the terms in our letter of February 2, 1926.

Our report on improved sewage disposal was submitted on June 19 and we are advised that it has been approved by your Sewerage Committee and the Village Council.

As indicated in the report we consider the question of providing for adequate sludge digestion the most pressing need, though increased sand filter area and general revamping of the plant are also quite necessary.

We are advised that the State Department of Health would like to have detailed plans and specifications covering the work to be done before any construction is undertaken. After you have made a definite decision regarding the work to be done in the light of our report, we should be very glad to take up with you the question of the preparation of necessary detailed plans and specifications. Our fee for this service is usually a percentage of the cost of the work for which plans and specifications are prepared and the percentage varies with the cost of the work, being higher for small costs and lower for large costs. The standard percentage fees for this class of work are about as follows:

I wish to call attention to a condition which has occurred in connection with the installing of the Ravenswood water mains for which I have the contract. I completed the main line on August 10, 1925 about seven weeks after the letting of the contract but was unable to set the hydrants because they had not arrived. This left the work in an incomplete state since August 10th during which time I have had to red light the job. In the meantime the grading contractors proceeded to grade the streets, filling up my excavations, covering up my lumber and braces and removing dirt which I left over the trenches to take care of settlement. When I left the work on August 11th., I took this matter up with the parties concerned, asking for relief at the very outset before the condition was serious. You will readily see that the condition now existing will cause me considerable more expense to complete the work and as my contract is with the Village, I must have recourse to your Honorable Board for fair play and reimbursement for the added expense to complete the work when the material arrives, under existing conditions.

Several weeks ago I called your attention to the condition the Village left El Centro Boulevard in, when the sewer was installed. I spent several hundred dollars to build a substantial cinder road which has been practically destroyed by the clay heaped upon it. The road is now impassable and is to my knowledge delaying the building of new homes upon that street. It is absolutely to the interests of the Village to have a good cinder road thru the plat. I am not calling your attention to it from a selfish standpoint as my lots in Forest Hills Addition were all sold many months ago, but I have enough interest in the purchasers of these lots to give them a road at least as good as the one I built.

I also want to call your attention to the condition of Plymouth Road from Wealthy to Robinson Road. It is full of ruts, and a very deep drop exists at the end of F.A. Wurzburg's driveway on Plymouth. In turning from Robinson onto Plymouth it is necessary to go over this driveway and over this drop in the Road, endangering the breaking of a wheel or axle.

Gentlemen -

I am again giving you a copy of my letter of July 3rd, 1926, and respectfully ask if I may expect favorable action on this matter at your next meeting.

July 3rd, 1926.

Gentlemen:-

I am herewith submitting an extra in connection with the construction of the Ravenswood Plat Sewers, due to the change of line from the north side of the pavement ~~to~~ on Lake Drive to the South side. This change made the work more difficult in having an old water main ditch along side the sewer trench and a leaky main to contend with thereby causing the sewer trench to cave in repeatedly. This condition cut down my progress, and it was necessary to put supports under the pavement to try to prevent its injury as well as to frequently use tight sheeting. This change necessitated the re-spotting of material and the making of another roadway for the machine. I have tried to arrive at a fair cost figure and proceeded as follows:

My record of progress was:

Here are seven days laying 543 feet or approximately 78 feet per day average. It is my opinion that I would have laid at least an average of 125 feet per day, ( and my subsequent record indicates even more,) or 875 feet for the seven days. Therefore I lost a footage of 332ft. which amounts to 26 1/2 hours for the Machine and men. My minimum labor amounted to \$107.25 per day and my minimum machine cost per day was \$42.60 making a total of \$14.99 per hour or \$397.23

To this should be added the repairing of the pavement if I am expected to repair it, because I carried my machine on lumber outside the pavement and where the ground was not saturated with water. In the water main ditch it will be found that the lumber kept the machine entirely off the pavement, and did not injure the pavement. I might add that the cracks already in the pavement before indicated the underground condition.

I have endeavored to give you a clear cut statement of the foregoing and respectfully request that my bill be allowed.

About two weeks ago I wrote you a letter suggesting that the entrance to the private drive at the intersection of Plymouth Road and Franklin Street was barely passable, since which time the Village authorities apparently have deposited a few loads of sand, which has improved the condition. However, I now learn that that portion of the drive from the intersection of Plymouth Road and Franklin Street to the edge of the Wilcox property was taken over by the Village of East Grand Rapids, and the Wilcox people inform me that therefore the village are obligated to properly maintain the drive from the intersection to the property line.
