Petition of John Van Oostenbrugge and 8 others for the construction of an eight inch sewer in Rexford Drive in Hodenpeil Park Addition from Cascade Road to Reeds Lake Boulevard for the purpose of draining basements until such time as a trunk sewer is constructed, at which time said sewer is to be connected with said trunk sewer, the cost of same to be assessed to the abutting property, according to benefits derived and to be paid for in five annual installments.

RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids, that it deems the construction of said sanitary sewer in the aforesaid street to be a necessary public improvement, and that this Council has determined and does hereby determine to make such public improvement, viz: to construct an eight inch sanitary sewer in Rexford Drive, a public street in said village, from Cascade Road to Reeds Lake Boulevard, all being within the corporate limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids, including the construction of the necessary branches, man-holes, catch basins in connection therewith, and to defray the cost and expense of constructing said sanitary sewer upon the lands and premises abutting upon said street and according to benefits derived; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the district, lands and premises upon which said special assessment for constructing said sanitary sewer shall be levied, shall include all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, as now recorded in the Register of Deeds Office for Kent County, Michigan abutting upon either side of Rexford Drive, from Cascade Road to Reeds Lake Boulevard and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Village Engineer be and he is hereby instructed to prepare and furnish to the Council at its next meeting, a plat and diagram of the work and of the locality to be improved, and an estimate of the cost of such improvement, and also a map, plat and diagram of each and every lot, parts of lots and parcels of land as now platted and recorded in the said Register of Deeds Office, fronting and abutting upon said street as above described.

AN ORDINANCE

To regulate the operation and use of vehicles on the public streets and highways of the Village of East Grand Rapids and to regulate and limit the gross weight of all such vehicles, and to repeal all former ordinances in conflict therewith.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle upon the public streets and highways of this village, except as in this ordinance otherwise provided the gross weight of which, including load, exceeds five tons, unless such vehicle is equipped with compressed air-filled rubber tires commonly called pneumatic tires, and no vehicle equipped with such pneumatic tires shall be operated on the streets and highways of this village, the gross weight of which, including load, exceeds ten tons: Provided, that this ordinance shall not apply to vehicles that run on rails or fixed tracks made of steel or other metal: Provided, further, that for the purposes of this ordinance, motor vehicles, trucks, tractors, trailers, and semi-trailers shall each be constructed to be separate units.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle, except motor driven vehicles, upon the public streets and highways of this village, the gross weight on any wheel of which exceeds six hundred pounds per inch of width of tire.

Section 3. Restrictions as to weight. For the purposes of this ordinance an axle load shall be construed to be the common axis of rotation of one or more wheels, whether power driven or freely rotating, and whether in one or more segments and regardless of the number of wheels carried thereon. In no case, shall a truck, tractor or semi-trailer, or other motor vehicle carry an axle load in excess of fifteen thousand pounds, nor shall any such trucks, tractor, semi-trailer or other motor vehicle carry an axle load in excess of thirteen thousand pounds if another axle of said vehicle or combination of vehicles be within a space of ten feet of such axle. In no case shall a four wheel trailer carry a gross axle load in excess of thirteen thousand pounds, nor shall any two adjacent axles of a truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or other vehicle, or combination thereof, be within a space of seven feet of each other, nor shall the combined weight of any two adjacent axles of the above named vehicles, or any combination thereof at any spacing, exceed twenty thousand pounds. When any two adjacent axles of vehicles, or combination thereof, mentioned in this section are less than ten feet of each other, the maximum gross load of either of such axles shall not exceed thirteen thousand pounds. When any axle is ten feet or more from the nearest adjacent axle of the above named vehicles or combination thereof then the maximum gross axle load shall not in any case exceed fifteen thousand pounds. Provided, however, that a tractor, semi-trailer combination, so-called, equipped with not more than three axles may carry an axle load of fifteen thousand pounds on the rear axle of the tractor and fifteen thousand pounds on the axle of the semi-trailer, if such axles are ten feet or more apart, and such axle load do not exceed six hundred pounds per inch of width of tires. The nominal size of tires shall be the rated size as published by the manufacturer.

Section 4. No vehicle of any kind whatever, whether self propelled or otherwise and not running on rails or fixed tracks, with axle loading and spacing not in accordance with the regulations described in Section 4 of this ordinance shall be permitted upon any of the public streets and highways of this Village unless the driver or operator of such a vehicle has first obtained a written permit from the street commissioner or other authorized officer of this village. Any special vehicle of any kind whose spacings and gross weight do not comply with or exceed the provisions of this ordinance may be operated under written permit from such street commissioner or other officer and upon such condition as he may prescribe having regard to the protection and preservation of the public streets and highways of this Village, Provided that said street commissioner or other officer may require said applicant, as a condition precedent to granting such permit, to deposit a cash bond in such amount as said officer deems necessary to indemnify said Village against damages to the streets, crosswalks or sidewalks in this Village, or to persons or property, both public and private, which may be caused by the operation of such special vehicle under such permit. And Provided Further, that such permit shall not be valid for a longer period than ten days from the date of issue. And Provided Further, that the foregoing provisions shall not apply to the fire apparatuses and vehicles belonging to this Village or to other fire apparatuses and vehicles operated on the village streets by authority of the Village Council, nor shall the foregoing provisions apply to any state trunk line, federal aid or county road extending into or through this Village, nor to that part of Lake Drive, a public street in this Village, between East Paris Road and Lakeside Drive.

Section 5. No motor truck, tractor, trailer, semi-trailer or other motor vehicle shall be operated on the public streets and highways of this Village the tires of which are equipped with metal that comes in contact with the surface of the road, except where chains or other non skidding devices are used, and unless by special permit granted therefor as provided in section four of this ordinance: Provided, however, that should any improved street be damaged by the use of chains or other non-skidding devices, the person, company, association or corporation owning or operating such vehicle shall be liable to the Village of East Grand Rapids for the cost of repairing any such damage.

Section 6. Rate of speed. The following vehicles shall not at any time while on the public streets and highways of this village exceed the following rate of speed;

(a) Any vehicle with or without load or drawing a trailer or semi-trailer with or without a load the gross weight of any unit of which exceeds fifteen thousand pounds shall not exceed the rate of speed of fifteen miles per hour, if equipped with pneumatic tires and ten miles per hour if equipped with non-pneumatic tires.

(b) Any vehicle with or without a load, or drawing a trailer or semi-trailer with or without a load the gross weight of any unit of which exceeds eight thousand pounds shall not exceed the rate of speed of twenty miles per hour, if equipped with pneumatic tires, and fifteen miles per hour if equipped with non-pneumatic tires.

Section 7. This ordinance shall apply to and include motor vehicles, trailers, or semi-trailers used for carrying passengers for hire.

Section 8. Any person, firm or corporation who moves or causes to be moved any vehicle, truck, tractor, trailer or semi-trailer over or along the public streets and highways of this village, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, shall for each offence, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than one dollar nor more than fifty dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County in the discretion of the Court of Magistrate before whom the conviction may be had for a period of not less than five days and not more than sixty days; and in case such Court or Magistrate shall only impose a fine and cost the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the said common jail until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not more than sixty days

Section 9. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of this Village inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This Ordinance is ordered to take effect April 11th. 1925.

AN ORDINANCE

To prohibit the throwing, dropping or depositing in or upon any public street, Avenue, Lanes, Alleys, parks, bridges and other public places, any glass, dirt, gravel, rubbish, ashes, or other refuse.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to permit any sand, gravel, dirt, iron, garbage, glass, tin, wire, tree trimmings, rubbish or other substance being transported over and upon any public street, avenue, lane, bridge, sidewalk, park, or other public place within the corporate limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids, while loaded and carried in any vehicle, to drop, scatter or be thrown from such vehicle in and upon any of said streets, sidewalks and public places.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, scatter, sweep deposit or place in any street, avenue, lane, bridge, park, sidewalk or other public place within the corporate limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids, any glass, tacks, crockery, scrap-iron, nails, tin, wire, ashes, dirt, rubbish, tree trimmings,

garbage or other refuse matter; provided, however, that fallen leaves may be deposited in piles at the curbs in any streets for collection by village employees when so directed by the Council. Provided further, that the provisions of sections one and two of this ordinance shall not apply in any case where permission has been granted by the village to any person to deposit building material in any street under the ordinances of this village.

Section 3. Any person or persons responsible for throwing or dropping of any of the substances and materials mentioned in section one and two of this ordinance in and upon any of the aforesaid highways, bridges, parks, sidewalks and public places, shall be required to remove the same upon being so notified by the ~~xx~~ marshal or other police officer of this village, and upon failure to remove the same, the village shall cause the same to be removed and the cost of such removal shall be charged against such responsible person, and in case such responsible person refuses to pay such charges, then the Village Attorney shall proceed to enforce the payment thereof by the necessary legal proceedings.

Section 4. Any person or persons violating any of the provision of this ordinance, on conviction thereof shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$ 50.00 and the cost of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for Kent County at hard labor for a period not exceeding thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court of magistrate before whom such conviction may be had.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect April 11th. 1925.

Every laughing palace or hall, so-called; every cave of the winds, so-called; every house of trouble, so-called and every house of mystery, so-called and every fun house, so-called, each per year \$ 25.00; Every amusement known as high striker, per year \$ 5.00; every fish pond, so-called; every cane rack, so-called; every knife rack, so-called and every pitch until you win, so-called, each per year \$ 10.00; every stand or concession for the sale of balloons, when sale is conducted independently and separate from any other amusement or business for which a license fee is charged and has been collected, per year \$ 5.00. Every shoe shining parlor or stand \$ 2.00

Subdivision Q. Every proprietor of a shooting gallery, per year \$ 25.00; every proprietor of a ball throwing gallery, or of a Japanese ball throwing alley, per year \$ 10.00

Subdivision T. Every proprietor of a stand or stands from which refreshments or goods of any kind, or both, are sold; except food, refreshments, or such other goods as are herein expressly designated, per year \$ 50.00, for each stand. Every proprietor operating more than one stand located in the same building or elsewhere shall pay the license herein established for each stand.

Subdivision U. Every proprietor of a restaurant, eating house, lunch-room or place where soft drinks are sold, or any combination thereof, each per year \$ 15.00; every proprietor of a soda fountain or ice-cream parlor, or both, each per year \$ 10.00.

Subdivision W. Every base-ball park or grounds where public base-ball games or other athletic contests are played or engaged in and to which an admission fee is charged, each per year \$ 100.00.

And be it further resolved that all license fees chargeable in the Village of East Grand Rapids and not changed or modified by this resolution, be and remain the same as heretofore established and fixed by the Village Council either by ordinance or resolution.

In the absence of the Clerk, Trustee MacNeil was appointed as temporary Clerk.

This meeting was called to consider the re-employment of Mr. H. Geo. D. Nutting.

After some discussion Trustee Tinkler offered the following motion:

The President be authorized to give the following instructions to our present Village Engineer and Manager, Mr. H. Geo. D. Nutting:

"That it is the unanimous sentiment of the Council that Mr. Nutting be released of the supervision of the Police and Fire Department and the Harbor Master and that he shall no longer be known as Village Manager.

His duties shall be defined under the head of Village Engineer, with supervision over the Disposal Plant, the Water works department, the Village street and sewer systems.

The Village Engineer shall be required to make all surveys and inspections and he shall not be allowed under any circumstances to employ the assistance of other surveyors or inspectors at the expense of the Village of East Grand Rapids, without authorization of the Board of Trustees.

The Village Engineer shall be empowered to make such purchases as are required from time to time under the following restrictions:

In the future all purchases amounting to more than \$ 100.00 shall not be made by the Village Engineer without authorization of the committee under whose jurisdiction this purchase is to be made, excepting in cases of extreme emergencies.

Furthermore in the future, the Village Engineer shall at all times in the performance of his duties be responsible to and under the direction of the various committees under whose jurisdiction the work is to be done.

It is the opinion of the Board of Trustees that the Village Engineer work to the end of better and more co-operation and diplomacy than heretofore apparently has been in evidence and thus promote better efficiency between the various village departments.

On account of the existing dissatisfaction in the Village at the present time, the Board of Trustees is not desirous of entering into a contract with the Village Engineer to cover the ensuing year, but are desirous of employing Mr. Nutting on a month to month basis at the present salary and consider that it will be entirely up to the Engineer to make good and that in that case he will have the full and undivided support of the entire Board of Trustees.

Trustee Tinkler moved the adoption of the resolution. Supported by Trustee Campbell.

The Chairman of the Ordinance Committee submitted the following ordinance
A N O R D I N A N C E

TO SUPPLEMENT AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE THE USE OF CARTS, DRAYS, WAGONS, HACKNEY COACHES, OMNIBUSES, AUTOMOBILES AND EVERY DESCRIPTION OF CARRIAGES AND VEHICLES KEPT FOR HIRE OR LIVERY PURPOSES, AND ALL VEHICLES DRAWN OR PROPELLED BY MOTIVE POWER ON ANY OF THE STREETS OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS, AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT HEREWITH."

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:-

Section 1. There is hereby created an automobile and vehicle pound, to which automobiles and other vehicles may be removed by the Police Department of the Village of East Grand Rapids in the cases hereinafter provided. Such pound shall be located and operated at a place designated by the council, and the village marshall, or some other officer or proper person designated by him, to be in attendance at said pound each day when necessary, for the purpose of receiving, safeguarding, and discharging vehicles and of collecting the fees hereinafter provided for.

Section 2. Whenever any vehicle shall be found by the village marshall or any other police officer of the Village, parked in violation of an ordinance to which this ordinance is supplemental and entitled " An Ordinance to Regulate the Use of Carts, Drays, Wagons, Hackney-Coaches, Omnibuses, Automobiles and every description of carriages and Vehicles Kept for Hire or Livery Purposes, and all Vehicles Drawn or Propelled by Motive Power on any of the streets of the Village of East Grand Rapids, and to Repeal all Ordinances Inconsistent Herewith ", such marshall or police officer may file a complaint before any Justice of the Peace of the Township of Grand Rapids against the owner or driver of such vehicle; or such vehicle may be removed and conveyed by means of towing the same or otherwise, by such marshall or other police officer, to the automobile and vehicle pound. Such vehicle shall not be discharged or removed from said pound except upon the payment by the owner of such vehicle, or his duly authorized representative, to the officer in charge of such pound of a fee of one (\$1.00) dollar for the first violation of the regulations relating to parking described in the ordinance to which this ordinance is supplemental by such owner, and a fee of three (\$3.00) dollars for the second violation, and a fee of five (\$5.00) dollars for each subsequent violation. Provided, that no violation committed prior to the date when this ordinance goes into effect and no violations committed more than one year prior to any other violation shall be considered in determining the number of violations committed by a particular owner. When the owner of a vehicle impounded, or his representative, presents himself at the pound to claim his vehicle it shall be the duty of the Marshall or officer in charge to inform such owner or his representative of the nature and circumstances of the violation on account of which such vehicle has been impounded. In case protest is made by such owner, or his representative, against the payment of such impounding fee and such protest is supported by a denial by him under oath of the facts constituting the alleged violation, there shall be given him by the officer in charge of said pound upon payment by such person of the proper fee according to the number of violations, a receipt for the same marked

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" Paid Under Protest." But in such case it shall hereupon be the duty of the officer having knowledge of the facts to forthwith make a complaint before a Justice of the Peace in and for the Township of Grand Rapids, under the proper ordinance charging the owner or driver of such vehicle with that violation of the ordinance on account of which the vehicle was impounded. Provided, however, that in case such person is subsequently found not guilty by a Justice Court of having committed the violation on account of which the vehicle was impounded, it shall thereupon be the duty of the Village Treasurer to refund to such person the fee paid by him under protest.

SECTION 3. When it is deemed impractical or inadvisable by the Marshall or other officer of the village, witnessing a violation of this ordinance, to tow the offending vehicle to the pound, he may, instead, post or affix a notice to such vehicle notifying the driver of the fact of the violation and directing him to pay to the officer in charge of the pound, the fee which would have been charged if the vehicle had been impounded. Such notice shall further state that, if such fee is not paid within forty-eight hours from the time of the leaving of such notice, a complaint will be made before a Justice of the Peace in and for the Township of Grand Rapids against the violator. If the owner of such vehicle, or his representative, presents himself at the pound in response to such notice he shall be subject to the same penalties and entitled to the same rights as though his vehicle had been impounded. If he does not present himself as directed or does not pay the proper fee within forty-eight hours from the time such notice was posted the officer having knowledge of the facts shall forthwith make a complaint against such violation before a Justice of the Peace in and for the said Township of Grand Rapids charging him with the violation on account of which such violation was posted.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of the Village Marshall to account for all fees collected under this supplemental ordinance and pay the same into the Village Treasury. He shall keep a record of the names of the owners of all vehicles impounded, the number of their state license tags, the nature and circumstances of each violation, and the disposition of each case.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect May _____ 1925.

A N O R D I N A N C E .

FOR THE REGULATION OF STREET TRAFFIC
IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS,
AND TO APPEAL ALL ORDINANCES INCON-
SISTENT HEREWITH.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:-

DEFINITIONS:

VEHICLE -

The word " vehicle " includes everything on wheels or runners, except baby carriages and street cars that run on tracks.

DRIVER -

The word " driver " includes the driver or operator of any " vehicle ".

CONGESTED DISTRICT-

The words " congested district " shall mean that district or portion of the village described in Section ____.

PARKING -*

The word " parking " for the purpose of this ordinance is hereby defined to mean the standing of any vehicle in a street, alley or public place in the village, either in charge of a driver or without such driver for a longer period than is necessary to actually load or unload said vehicle or to take on or let off passengers.

STREET INTERSECTIONS -

The words " street intersections " shall mean the area bounded by the side lines, real or produced, of two or more streets which meet or cross each other.

HORSE -

The word " horse " shall include any and all domestic driving animals.

RULES TO BE OBSERVED -

SECTION 1. The driver or operator of every vehicle, except street cars that run on fixed rails or tracks, driven or operated upon the streets, highways and public places within the limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids, shall conform to and observe the following rules:

VEHICLES - HOW TO BE DRIVEN:

SECTION 2. (a) Vehicles shall be driven in a

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careful manner and with due regard to the safety and convenience of pedestrians and of other vehicles, provided that the driving of vehicles past a school building during the school term, and during the hours when such school is in sessions, and for a space of one hundred feet in any direction from said school grounds, at a speed greater than ten miles an hour; shall be and is declared to be driving a vehicle in other than a careful manner and without due regard for the safety of pedestrians and of other vehicles.

(b) When one vehicle overtakes another it shall pass to the left side of the overtaken vehicle and not pull over to the right until clear thereof.

(c) All vehicles meeting shall pass each other to the right.

(d) Vehicles shall keep to the right side of the street except when necessary to turn to the left in crossing or in overtaking another vehicle; provided, that no vehicle shall pass on the left of a street car when going in the same direction with such street car.

(e) Vehicles turning to the right into another street shall pass and turn the corner as near to the right hand curb as possible.

(f) Vehicles turning to the left into another street shall pass to the right of and beyond the center of the street intersection before turning.

(g) No person shall stop a vehicle with its left side to the curb on any street, or back any vehicle to the curb for the purpose of unloading so as to obstruct the highways of said street. No person shall stop a vehicle in such a position as to obstruct the free passage of the street, or otherwise than within two feet of, and parallel with, the right hand curb thereof, except when compelled to do so temporarily by congestion of traffic, or except as otherwise herein provided.

(h) Vehicles turning around or crossing from one side of the street to another shall do so by turning to the left so as to head on the same direction as the traffic on that side of the street towards which the crossing is made, no vehicle thus turning around or crossing shall, in so doing, traverse any portion of any street intersection unless it shall be made to pass beyond and around the center of said intersection.

(i) A vehicle attended by a driver waiting at the curb shall promptly give place to a vehicle which must load or unload in that particular place.

(j) No vehicle shall back to make a turn in any street if by doing so it interferes with other vehicles, but shall go around the block to a street sufficiently wide in which to turn without interfering with traffic.

(k) Streets and boulevards in the Village of East Grand Rapids may hereafter be set apart by the Village Council and designated as " Through Traffic Streets ", and vehicles passing thereon shall have the right of way over all vehicles approaching the same from side or other streets, and all vehicles approaching said " Through Traffic Streets " shall stop before entering said streets, and shall not enter said streets when to do so would interfere with or interrupt the traffic thereon. And the Council may also designate street intersections in the Village at which vehicles moving on one of the streets composing such intersections shall have the right of way, such through traffic streets and right of way at intersections to be designated by suitable signs; Provided, that all highways within the Village designated by the

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proper authorities of the State of Michigan as " State Trunk Line Highways " are herewith designated as " Through Traffic Streets " for all the purposes of this ordinance.

(I) No motor or other part of the machinery of any motor vehicle shall be permitted to run while such vehicle is standing in any public street, alley, or public place, without an attendant capable of properly running the same.

SOUNDING DEVICE:

SECTION 3. Every motor vehicle or motorcycle while being used upon the streets, alleys, and public places of this Village, shall be provided with a suitable bell, horn, or other signal device, which shall produce an abrupt sound sufficiently loud to serve as an adequate warning of danger, and it shall be unlawful for any person operating any motor vehicle or motorcycle to make, or cause to be made, any unnecessary noise with any such bell, horn, or other signal device, or to use the same except as a warning of danger. Provided, however, that it shall be unlawful for any person to use upon any automobile or other vehicle, a warning signal similar to that used by the Fire or Police Departments of the Village of East Grand Rapids.

STOP AND TURN SIGNALS:

SECTION 4. The operator of every vehicle while it is being operated and used upon the streets, alleys, or public places in the Village of East Grand Rapids, shall indicate his intentions to turn such vehicle toward the right or left, or to suddenly check its speed or stop such vehicle, by the following signals:

(I) Before turning to the left of the driver of such vehicle shall give timely warning signal to other drivers by extending the arm beyond and outside of the side of the vehicle in a horizontal position.

(2) Before turning to the right the driver of such vehicle shall extend the arm outside of the side of the vehicle and hold it in an upward position.

(3) To check its speed or stop, the driver of such vehicle shall give a timely signal therefor by extending the arm outside of the side of the vehicle and hold it in a downward position. Such signals shall be given by the driver holding the arm in such position as herein provided for a sufficient time to apprise drivers of approaching vehicles of his intention to change his course or stop, as the case may be; - Provided, however, that in lieu of such signals above required, signals may be given by any mechanical or electrical device which conveys an intelligible signal or warning to another driver approaching from the rear. In all such cases the driver of a motor vehicle to whom such signal has been given as required in this section shall bring and keep his vehicle under such control as to be able to avoid an accident from any misunderstanding of such signals, and shall in all cases heed any such warning as shall have been given him.

PASSING STREET CARS:

SECTION 5. It shall be the duty of the driver or operator of any vehicle, on approaching in the same direction, any street car or bus, if the same is stopping or has stopped to take on or discharge passengers, to bring his vehicle to a dead stop not nearer than six (6) feet in the rear of the rear door of such street car or bus, and to wait there until all passengers are taken on and until all descending passengers shall have cleared the driveway of such street before starting; and in case such vehicle

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has overtaken, but has not passed all doors of such street car or bus before the same has stopped for such purposes, the driver or operator of such vehicle shall stop his vehicle and remain in place until the loading or unloading of such passengers of such vehicle shall be completed and the driveways of such street shall be cleared of such passengers: Provided, however, that the provisions of this section shall not apply to street car stopping points at or near street intersections where traffic officers are stationed to regulate traffic thereat; nor at such other intersections as are adequately guarded under the supervision and designation of the Police Department of the Village. No conductor or motorman on any street car or bus operating on any street in the Village shall open a car door for the purpose of allowing a passenger to descend from the car before such car has been brought to a complete stop.

DRIVING ON CAR TRACKS:

SECTION 6: The driver or operator of any vehicle proceeding upon the track in front of a street car, shall turn out as soon as possible, upon signal of the driver of a street car.

PROCESSIONS:

SECTION 7: No vehicle shall be driven through a procession except with the permission of a Police Officer.

CROSS WALKS:

SECTION 8: No vehicle shall stop on any cross walk or on that portion of any street where street cars stop to receive or discharge passengers or in front of alley intersections or any main entrance to upper floors of buildings for a longer period than to permit the occupants to alight or persons to enter said vehicle, or in any such manner as to obstruct the free passage upon such cross walk or that portion of said street or streets herein mentioned; or stop to load or unload passengers within any safety zone at any time while a street car is stopping and loading or unloading passengers.

FIRE HYDRANTS:

SECTION 9. No vehicle shall be left standing within twenty feet of any fire hydrant, unless in actual charge of a person capable of running the same.

NOT TO DRIVE WHEN INTOXICATED:

SECTION 10. No person when under the influence of liquor shall drive any kind of a vehicle upon the streets, highways or public places of the Village.

MUFFLERS:

SECTION 11. No person or persons shall operate in any of the streets, alleys or public places in this village, any motor vehicle which has not a suitable muffler in a proper and efficient working condition.

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NOISE, ODORS, ETC:

SECTION 12. It shall be deemed a violation of this ordinance for any person in charge or control of any vehicle to make with such vehicle or any device connected therewith, any excessive or unnecessary noise, or to open the muffler on any vehicle, or to permit such vehicle or any device thereon to emit smoke, steam, or offensive odors within the streets, highways or public places of this village.

CERTAIN SIGNALS PROHIBITED:

SECTION 13: It shall be unlawful for any person to use upon any automobile or other vehicle, a warning signal similar to that now or hereafter used by the Fire or Police Department of the Village of East Grand Rapids.

VEHICLES IN FRONT TO KEEP TO RIGHT:

SECTION 14. When any vehicle approaching another vehicle from the rear shall signal to pass the same on the left as provided herein, the vehicle in front shall, if the way is clear, immediately upon receiving such signal, drive to and proceed with the right wheel within a distance of three feet of the right curb.

BICYCLES:

SECTION 15. It shall be unlawful for persons to ride bicycles or motorcycles on the streets, highways, or public places, within the village, curving from one side to another thereon, or to ride bicycles or motorcycles without having their hands on the handlebars, or for more than two persons to ride such bicycles or motorcycles abreast, and bicycles or motorcycles shall be ridden as near as possible to the right hand curb. Riding of bicycles or motorcycles within fifty feet of a street car in the space between the parallel car tracks is prohibited.

SECTION 16. No person or persons shall be carried upon the handlebars or any other part of the vehicle in front of the driver of a motorcycle or bicycle on any part of the streets of the village.

SECTION 17. Every bicycle or similar vehicle operated and propelled on the streets or public places in the village shall be provided with a suitable bell, gong, or horn, which shall be sounded at least thirty feet before crossing the intersection of any street or public way, so as to give notice to persons upon all such intersections of the approach of such vehicle.

RIDING ON SIDEWALKS OR LAWNS:

SECTIONS 18. No person shall operate or ride any vehicle, bicycle or motorcycle, or use any mercantile push cart, along or upon any sidewalk or any place designed or kept for the use of persons on foot only, within the limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids, and no person shall ride or propel any such vehicle upon any of the lawns on any streets within the Village of East Grand Rapids.

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STOP WHEN SIGNALLED:

SECTION 19. The driver of any vehicle shall stop and start upon the signal from a Police Officer.

SPEED:

SECTION 20: No person shall drive any vehicle at a rate of speed exceeding 15 miles per hour on any streets in the business portion of said village, nor at a rate if speed exceeding 20 miles per hour on the streets, highways, or public places, in said village outside of the business portion thereof. Provided, however, that no vehicle shall be driven from any alley, garage, stable, or any other place of business, onto any streets in said village faster than 5 miles per hour, and shall sound audible warning of its approach.

SECTION 21: It shall be unlawful to drive any truck upon the streets, alleys, or public places in the village of East Grand Rapids faster than the following schedule:

Trucks of 5 tons capacity or over, 10 miles per hour,
Trucks of less than 5 tons capacity, with neumatic
tires, 15 miles per hour,
Trucks of less than 5 tons capacity, with solid rubber
tires, 10 miles per hour.

SLOWLY MOVING VEHICLES:

SECTION 22: Slowly moving or heavily laden vehicles shall not be driven upon the streets and highways abreast, but one must follow behind the other and keep as near to the right hand curb as possible, allowing more swiftly moving vehicles free passage.

BLOCKADE:

SECTION 23. No vehicle shall be allowed to remain upon, or be driven through any street of the Village of East Grand Rapids so as to blockade or obstruct the said street; and no vehicle shall be so loaded that the horse or horses or motive power shall be unable to move it.

SCATTERING IN STREETS FROM WAGONS:

SECTION 24. All vehicles must be so loaded or constructed as to prevent the blowing, spilling or falling to the street of any of the material or contents of such load.

GLASS, TACKS, SPRINKLING, ETC.

SECTION 25. It shall be unlawful for any person to throw, scatter, sweep, deposit, place or leave in any public street or alley, or upon any of the bridges within the corporate limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids, any glass, tacks, crockery, scrap iron, nails, tin wire, electric light carbons, ashes or broken ice from ice wagons or other wagons, or any other thing or substance liable to cause puncture of the tires of vehicles, or that would interfere with the use of rubber-tired vehicles, and the excessive sprinkling of any street, alley or

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other public place by any person or persons to such an extent as to leave standing water or mud thereon, is hereby expressly forbidden.

WARNING SIGNAL:

SECTION 26. No person shall drive any vehicle, the contents of which project more than three feet from the rear of the vehicle without fastening upon the projecting part of a load, a red cloth of sufficient size to be a warning.

TOWING LOADED VEHICLES:

SECTION 27. No person shall cause or permit more than one loaded vehicle (except street cars) not run on its own power to be towed or pushed by another vehicle in any street in the village.

SECTION 28. No person or persons shall drive or propel on any of the streets or public places in the Village of East Grand Rapids, any vehicle having metal spikes, lugs or corrugations projecting from the face of the tire, nor shall any heavy motor vehicle be driven or propelled at such a rate of speed as to tear up or damage the streets, nor shall any vehicle be used on said streets or public places in such manner or condition as to damage the pavement any way. No person shall drive or propel any vehicle in any improved street, alley or public place, excepting brick or stone pavements, with the wheels locked or other portion of the vehicle to be dragged, nor shall any motor trucks be tested on any improved streets, alleys, or public places in the village.

PARKING:

SECTION 29. No vehicle shall be parked within any street intersection nor nearer than twenty-five feet of the lot line on the intersecting street as extended; nor shall any vehicle be parked at any time in that portion of any cross street opposite a street which ends in such cross street, nor within twenty-five feet of the lot line of such intersecting streets as extended across such cross street; nor shall any vehicle be parked at any time in a safety zone except to take on or discharge passengers, which is that portion of each street in the Village of East Grand Rapids at the points where street cars are required to stop to receive or discharge passengers, running from the nearest line of the intersecting street fifty feet back from said intersecting street, except when held back by the congestion of traffic or by order of a Police Officer.

SECTION 30. The following named public streets of the Village of East Grand Rapids are designated as parking districts for all vehicles, and all vehicles stopped in any of the said streets hereinafter mentioned, shall be stopped as follows: viz: all vehicles stopped on the west side of Lakeside Drive, between a point fifty feet north of the curb in said street near the southeast corner of Ramona Athletic Park to Greenwood Avenue, and on the north side of Wealthy Street, between Lakeside Drive and a point thirty feet east of the street railway tracks leading into Ramons Resort Grounds, shall be parked up to the curb and turned at an angle of forty-five degrees and in the direction of traffic on that side of the street. All vehicles stopped on the west side of

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Lakeside Drive, between a point fifty feet north of the north line of Lake Drive to a point fifty feet south of the aforesaid curb in said street; and on the east side of Lakeside Drive between Barnard Street and Greenwood Avenue; and on the north side of Wealthy Street between Bagley Avenue and Lovett Avenue; and on the south side of Wealthy Street between Lovett Avenue and Lakeside Drive; and on the east side of Bagley Avenue; between Lake Drive and Wealthy Street, shall be stopped with the right side toward the curb or gutter line and within two feet of the same. No vehicle shall stop on the east side of Lakeside Drive, between Lake Drive and Barnard Street, for a longer period than necessary to discharge or take on passengers; and all vehicles stopped on any other thoroughfare of the village shall stop with the right side toward the curb or gutter line and within two feet of the same; Provided, that no vehicle stopped in any of the streets designated as a parking district shall be allowed to stand within the space of private driveways leading into the abutting premises nor within the space on the north side of Wealthy Street, between the west line of Bagley and the point 30 feet east of the tracks leading into Ramona Resort Grounds, nor in front of business places in such manner as to obstruct a right of way from any such street to the entrance to any such place of business.

SECTION 31. No vehicle shall be parked in any street of the village opposite any building in process of construction, rebuilding or repairing, material for which is stored in the street or any portion thereof, or opposite a portion of any street under process of construction or repair.

SECTION 32. No vehicle shall be parked in any public alley within the village when to do so would obstruct or interrupt the free passage of traffic, nor in any space assigned for the purpose of parking taxi-cabs.

HORSES :HORSES

SECTION 33. No person shall ride or drive, or cause to suffer to be ridden or driven any horse in any thoroughfare, highway or alley of this village at an immoderate speed. Provided, that the provisions of this section shall not apply to such streets as the village council may, from time to time, designate by resolution.

SECTION 34. No person shall permit any horse to stand in any public street, alley or public place in said village without being securely tied, fastened, guarded or held.

CLOSED VEHICLES:

SECTION 35. No one shall drive a vehicle that is so closed in or constructed as to prevent the driver from having a clear view of the traffic at the sides of such vehicle.

LIGHTS:

SECTION: Each and every motor vehicle operated and driven upon the streets, highways and public places in the Village of East Grand Rapids shall, during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, be equipped with and display a lamp or lamps as hereinafter provided, of sufficient power and so adjusted and operated as to enable the operator of such vehicle to proceed with safety to himself and to other users of the highways under all conditions of highway and weather.

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(a) FRONT LAMPS. Every such motor vehicle, except motorcycles, shall have a lamp mounted on each side of the front thereof, side lamps to be of approximately equal candle power, and every motorcycle and bicycle shall have mounted on the front thereof one lamp. Every such motor vehicle shall, during the aforesaid period, keep such front lamps lighted continuously while the vehicle bearing them is in motion, except when the driver thereof may temporarily extinguish them for the convenience of the driver of some approaching vehicle; but in such case the driver shall not extinguish them completely unless his machine is also provided with two identical lamps of equal brightness symmetrically placed on each side, both of which shall, during said period, be lighted continuously while the vehicle bearing them is in motion whenever such front lamps are not lighted.

(b) SIDE LAMPS. Every trailer and semi-trailer, except small two wheel trailers of one thousand pounds capacity or less towed closely behind a motor vehicle and semi-trailer when towed alone, whose overall length, in both cases, including towing vehicle and load, does not exceed thirty feet, when on the highways of this village at night shall carry at the front of its left side one lamp capable of throwing a white light visible from both sides of such vehicle.

(c) REAR LAMPS. Every vehicle, tractor, trailer, or semi-trailer when on the streets of the village at night shall have on the rear thereof one lamp capable of displaying a light, which shall, except in the case of tractors, be red and shall be lit during the aforesaid period, and on tractors, one white light displayed on the extreme left of the vehicle shall be sufficient, displayed so as to be visible at least one hundred feet behind such vehicle.

(d) SPOT LIGHTS. If any spot light shall be carried and displayed on any vehicle the same shall be placed and used so that the light therefrom shall be focused on the right hand side of the road not more than two hundred feet in front of such vehicle: Provided, that, motor bicycles or motor cycles shall be required to display but one lighted lamp, such lamp to be placed on the front of the vehicle so that it shall be visible one hundred feet in the direction in which the motor vehicle is proceeding.

(e) PARKING LIGHTS. No person shall permit any vehicle to stand upon the streets during the period between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, unless there shall be displayed on such vehicle at least one lighted lamp on the front left hand side and one in the rear of such vehicle which shall be a red light visible from the rear; Provided, that special parking lights may be used, placing the same on the left hand rear fender showing white in front and red in the rear, of sufficient size to be seen at a distance of at least two hundred feet from the front or rear.

SECTION 37. It shall be unlawful for any person operating any automobile, motorcycle or other vehicle upon the public streets and highways within the village, to use acetylene, electric or other headlights, or any headlights the rays from which shall be intensified by any parabolic or condensing reflector, provided, that such headlight may be used if properly shaded or adjusted so as not to blind, dazzle or confuse any users of the highways or make it unsafe for them to drive, ride or walk thereon.

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LIGHTS ON VEHICLES BELONGING TO VILLAGE:SECTION 38.

Each and every fire apparatus of the Village of East Grand Rapids used upon the streets of the village between sunset and sunrise, shall have displayed upon the side thereof one lighted red and one lighted green light; each ambulance, either public or private, used upon the streets of said village between sunset and sunrise shall have upon the side two lighted purple lights. It shall be unlawful for any vehicle except street cars, other than those designated in this section to carry colored side lights in the Village of East Grand Rapids.

RIGHT OF WAY AT STREET INTERSECTIONS:

SECTION 39. At all street intersections within the village, except at street intersections where traffic officers are stationed, in the case of vehicles approaching at an angle to each other, the right hand vehicle shall have the right of way. Cars approaching intersections must be under control; provided, that the village council may provide traffic officers for certain street intersections and to make additional rules for the direction of traffic by such traffic officers at such street intersections. Provided, further, that this section shall not affect the regulations for street intersections on " Through Traffic " streets.

SECTION 40. No vehicle shall pass another going in the same direction at any street intersection, nor shall any vehicle pass another vehicle going in the same direction on any curve where full view of the street ahead is obscured, and no more than two cars shall travel abreast going in the same direction.

TO MOVE UPON REQUEST:

SECTION 41. Any vehicle standing at any curb at any time, shall move away from curb at the request of a Police Officer.

RIGHT OF WAY FOR POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENT:

SECTION 42. All fire or police apparatuses and vehicles of the village, when going to or on duty at a fire or other call, and the sheriff's department and ambulances shall have the right of way in any street and through any processions except other vehicles carrying United States Mail.

SECTION 43. The driver of a street car shall immediately stop his car and keep it stationary upon the approach of any fire apparatus until such apparatus has passed said street car, and the driver of any other vehicle shall immediately draw his vehicle as near as possible to the right hand curb and keep said vehicle stationary until said fire apparatus has passed, and no vehicle shall be driven or propelled along said street in the rear of said apparatus within a distance of three hundred feet thereof, and no vehicle shall be driven, propelled or parked within a distance of three hundred feet of any entrance of any building which is a fire.

SAFETY ZONES:

SECTION 44. No vehicles shall be driven over any portion of any safety zone, so-called, that may hereafter be designated, and provided for, at a time when such zone contains any person or persons.

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AGE OF DRIVER:

SECTION 45. No person shall drive any public or private automobile, motor car, motorcycle, or other motor vehicle, who is less than fourteen years of age.

BRAKES:

SECTION 46. No person shall leave any motor vehicle unattended on any public street upon a grade without stopping the motor of said vehicle and effectively setting the brakes; Provided, further, that when such vehicle is left on a grade the wheels shall be so placed or blocked as to prevent the vehicle moving in case the brakes should be released.

SIGNS:

SECTION 47. No person shall deface, injure, remove or interfere with any signs, posts, standards or any signalling device installed or placed for the purpose of directing, instructing or regulating traffic or establishing quiet zones or safety zones.

SECTION 48. No person shall fail, neglect, or refuse to comply with any instruction, direction or regulation displayed upon any post, standard, sign or device installed or placed in any public street or place by order of the village council for the regulation, direction or instruction of traffic.

POLICE TO CONTROL DANGEROUS STREETS:

SECTION 49: Whenever a street, alley or public place or any portion thereof, or the traffic thereon, by reason of congestion, has become dangerous to the public, the village council or other village official designated by the council, may declare such street, alley or public place or such portion thereof, closed to the public, or may declare the necessary restriction of travel thereon in case of such dangerous congestion, and it shall then be the duty of the village marshall to cause to be placed the necessary signs, barriers, or warnings to notify the public of such order and the requirements thereof. Any person refusing to heed and observe such signs and warnings or who shall violate the order of the village marshall as promulgated, shall be deemed guilty of violation of this ordinance and shall be punished as in this ordinance provided.

ACCIDENTS:

SECTION 50. In case of accident to or collision with person or property upon any of the public streets, parks or public places of the Village of East Grand Rapids due to the operation thereon of any vehicle, the person so driving or operating such vehicle shall stop and give such reasonable assistance as can be given and shall upon request of the person injured or any other person, give such person his or her name and address, and if not the owner, the name and address of the owner of such vehicle, together with the registered number of such vehicle, in case such vehicle is motor propelled or licensed.

VIOLATION OF POLICE ORDER:

SECTION 51. Violation of a Police Order issued under and in pursuance of this ordinance shall constitute a violation of this ordinance and be subject to the penalties herein prescribed.

(12)

PENALTIES :

SECTION 52. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not more than one hundred (\$100.00) dollars, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County, in the discretion of the Court or Magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not more than ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such Court or Magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs for a period not exceeding ninety (90) days.

VALIDITY:

SECTION 53. Sections of this ordinance shall be deemed to be severable and should any section or provision of this ordinance be declared by any Court to be unconstitutional or invalid the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance or any part thereof other than the part declared to be unconstitutional or invalid.

REPEALING CLAUSE:

SECTION 54. An ordinance entitled " An Ordinance to Regulate the Use of Carts, Drays, Wagons, Hackney Coaches, Omnibuses, Automobiles and Every Description of Carriages and Vehicles Kept for Hire or Livery Purposes and all Vehicles Drawn or Propelled by Motive Power on Any of the Streets of the Village of East Grand Rapids and to repeal all Ordinances Inconsistent Herewith." Passed and approved April 19, 1915, and "An Ordinance to Regulate the Speed and Operation of Motor Vehicles upon the Public Streets, Avenues, Lanes, Alleys, Bridges and other Public Places within the Village of East Grand Rapids," passed and approved July 20, 1908, and " An Ordinance Relative to the Use of Bicycles or Velocipedes in the Village of East Grand Rapids," passed August 17, 1896, and all amendments to said ordinances, and all ordinances of said village inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect the 4th day of June, 1925.

This being the hour and date set for the hearing of objections to the proposed improvement of Argentina Drive and after hearing remarks from Mr. Wm. K. Clute and Martin Gibbons, the following resolution was offered by Trustee Osborn:

WHEREAS, the Council has met for the purpose of hearing objections to the proposed construction of a concrete pavement, in and upon Argentina Drive, a public street in the Village of East Grand Rapids, from the west line of East Paris Road to the west line of Orchard Street, as shown by the map, plat and diagram, specifications and estimate now on file in the office of the Village Clerk, and also to the district to be assessed as shown by said map, plat and diagram upon which should be assessed sufficient to defray one-half of the cost of such improvement,

NOW, THEREFORE, after hearing all objections thereto of all parties appearing and desiring to be heard and desiring to object and due consideration being had thereon, it is

RESOLVED, that the aforesaid improvement be made, that the map, plat, diagram, and specifications now on file in the office of the Village Clerk be approved and adopted and that all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, fronting on each side of said Argentina Drive and lying between the west line of East Paris Road and the west line of Orchard Avenue in said village and within the boundaries of said district as the same is determined and shown by and described in the map, plat and diagram of said district now on file in the office of the Village Clerk, shall constitute and be a special assessment district to be known as "Argentina Drive Paving District No. 1" and be it further

RESOLVED, that the expense of said improvement, including the cost of said map, plat, diagram, specifications and estimate and the surveys, plans and assessments incident thereto, be and the same hereby is estimated at the sum of \$ 2161.00 that one-half of the cost of said improvement be assessed upon and against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying within said special assessment district as shown by said map, plat and diagram according to foot frontage, and that the amount so assessed against each lot and parcel of land be paid in five annual installments with interest upon the deferred installments at the rate of six percent per annum, and that one-half of the cost of said proposed improvement be paid from the general highway fund of the village to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in said Village of East Grand Rapids, said tax to be divided into five parts and to be collected annually for five years and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to assess and levy the one half part of \$ 2161.00 upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land and premises lying within said special assessment district, as shown by said map, plat and diagram, according to foot frontage; that the lots and premises upon which said special assessment shall be made are those lying within said special assessment district as determined and shown by and described in said map, plat and diagram thereof; and that said Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to make and prepare a special assessment roll of all of said lands and premises within said special assessment district, said roll to be in five parts and the amount so to be assessed shall be divided in five parts, one part of be collected in the current year, to-wit 1925 and one of said parts to be collected annually thereafter, until the whole is collected; and if from the shape or size of any such lot an assessment thereon in proportion to its frontage would be unjust and disproportionate to the assessments upon other lots, said Board shall assess such lot and for such number of feet of frontage as the Board deems to be equitable and it is

ORDERED, that the Board of Assessors apportion against the Village of East Grand Rapids one half of the cost of said improvement to be paid from the Village Highway funds and to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in the Village in five annual installments, and it is further

ORDERED, that said Board of Assessors report said special assessment roll to this Council at this meeting.

WHEREAS, the Board of Assessors of this Village has prepared assessment rolls to defray the cost of paving Argentina Drive, from East Paris Road to Orchard Avenue, in this Village, in five parts numbered one, two, three, four and five respectively each part containing a list of the lots or parcels constituting the special assessment district with the names of the owners or occupants of each lot or parcel, and have assessed one-fifth of the cost or expense of such work upon each one of said five parts of said roll, to this Council and

WHEREAS, said Board of Assessors has assessed to each lot or parcel of land within said district such relative portion of the whole amount to be levied as the length and front of said premises abutting upon said improvement bears to the whole frontage of all lots to be assessed, except in cases where on account of the shape or size of any such lot an assessment for a different number of feet has been deemed to be more equitable by said Board, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the assessment rolls returned by the Board of Assessors be filed in the office of the Village Clerk and marked "#Argentina Drive Paving District No. 1 Special Assessment rolls" and that Monday, the 18th. day of May, 1925, at 8 o'clock P.M. be designated as the time and the Council Rooms as the place respectively when and where the Council and the Board of Assessors will meet to review the assessment to hear any objections thereto and appeals therefrom, and it is

ORDERED, that the Village Clerk give notice of the filing of said rolls with the Clerk and designating the time and place when and where the Council and the Board of Assessors will meet to review the assessment and to hear any objections thereto, and appeals therefrom, by posting notices in three public places in said village at least two weeks previous to said hearing.

RESOLVED, that the expense of said improvement, including the cost of said map, plat, diagram, specifications and estimate and the surveys, plans and assessments incident thereto, be and the same hereby is estimated at the sum of \$ 3328.00 that one-half of the cost of said improvement be assessed upon and against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying within said special assessment district, as shown by said map, plat and diagram according to foot frontage, and that the amount so assessed against each lot and parcel of land be paid in five annual installments with interest upon the deferred installments at the rate of six percent per annum and that one half of the cost of said proposed improvement be paid from the general highway fund of the village to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in said village of East Grand Rapids, said tax to be divided into five parts and to be collected annually for five years and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to assess and levy the one half part of \$3328.00 upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land and premises lying within said special assessment district, as shown by said map, plat and diagram, according to foot frontage; that the lots and premises upon which said special assessment shall be made, are those lying within said special assessment district as determined and shown by and described in said map, plat and diagram thereof, and that said Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to make and prepare a special assessment roll of all of said lands and premises within said special assessment district, said roll to be in five parts, one part to be collected in the current year, to-wit 1925 and one of said parts to be collected annually thereafter, until the whole is collected; and if from the shape or size of any such lot an assessment thereon in proportion to its frontage would be unjust and disproportionate to the assessments upon other lots, said Board shall assess such lot and for such number of feet of frontage, as the Board deems to be equitable and it is

ORDERED, That the Board of Assessors apportion against the Village of East Grand Rapids one half of the cost of said improvement to be paid from the Village Highway funds and to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in the Village in five annual installments, and it is further

ORDERED, that said Board of Assessors report said special assessment roll to this Council at its next regular meeting.

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the district, lands and premises upon which said special assessment for constructing said sewer shall be levied, shall include all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land as now recorded in the office of the Register of Deeds for Mont County, Michigan abutting upon either side of said East Paris Road, from the Pere Marquette Railroad Company's right of way to Hall Street, and upon either side of Burchard Avenue opposite the course of said sewer, and upon the north side of Elderade Drive opposite the course of said sewer, and extending back at right angles to said streets to the rear lot lines of platted premises and a distance of three hundred feet of all unplatted lands; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Village Engineer be and he is hereby instructed to prepare and furnish to this Council at this meeting, a plat and diagram of the work and of the locality to be improved, and an estimate of the cost of such improvement, and also a map, plat and diagram of each and every lot, parts of lots and parcels of land as now platted and recorded in said Register's office, fronting and abutting upon said Streets as above described.

Section One. The ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Providing for the Payment of Part of the Cost of Paving Streets from the General Highway Fund of the Village," approved April Sixth, Nineteen Hundred Twenty, is hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE

TO REGULATE THE PLANTING, MAINTAINING, CARE AND REMOVAL OF TREES, SHRUBBERY, HEDGES, AND PLANTS IN AND UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS, LANES AND ALLEYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. The President of the Village of East Grand Rapids shall each year by and with the consent of the Village Council, appoint a Village Forester, which appointment shall be made on or about the first day of May of each year, and the person so appointed shall hold such office for the term of one year and until his successor is duly appointed and qualified. It shall be the duty of such Village Forester, subject to the supervision of the Village Council, to supervise the planting, maintaining, care and removal of trees, shrubbery, hedges, and other plants in and upon any portion of the public streets, highways, lanes, alleys and other public places within the Village of East Grand Rapids,

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to plant, grow or maintain, or cause to be planted, grown or maintained, any trees, shrubbery, hedges, or other plants without first obtaining a written permission therefore from the Council of the Village Forester, and no such tree, shrubbery, hedges or other plants shall be planted in any portion of said streets or public ways until the Council or the said Village Forester shall have approved of the kind, size and variety thereof and of the location where any such tree, shrubbery, hedges or other plants, excepting trees, shall be planted in any portion of the public streets and highways in the Village within fifty feet from any street intersection.

Section 3. Whenever any shrubbery, hedges or other plants, excepting trees, is permitted to be planted, grown or maintained in any portion of any such public highways within the Village of East Grand Rapids, the same shall be kept trimmed and not permitted to be any higher than four feet at any time; and all shrubbery, hedges, or other plants, excepting trees, now existing in any portion of the public streets, highways, lanes, alleys or other public places, within the Village of East Grand Rapids, and within fifty feet of any street intersection as extended, is hereby declared to be unsafe to travel in and upon such streets, highways or other public places and to be a public nuisance and all persons, firms or corporations having and maintaining shrubbery, hedges and other plants, within fifty feet of such street intersections are hereby required to remove the same after being notified so to do by the Marshall of this Village and it shall be the duty of such Marshall to abate and remove the same after the expiration of twenty days after giving such notice.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any person, or persons, to break, cut, deface, destroy, or in any other way to injure or interfere with any tree, shrub, hedge, or other plant in any of the streets, highways, lanes, alleys, or other public places within the Village of East Grand Rapids; and it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to hitch or fasten any horse or other animal to any such tree, shrub, hedge, or other plant, or to any device erected and placed for the protection of the same; nor shall any person attach any rope, wire, sign, or poster, handbill, or other objects on any such tree, shrub, hedge, or other plant, now or hereafter growing in any of the public streets, highways, lanes, alleys or other public places within the Village of East Grand Rapids, nor shall any person or persons deposit or throw upon any such public street or highway any saltwater, or any other material or substance injurious to trees, shrubs, hedges, or other plants.

Section 5. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to pile any cement, stone, or other material in any of the public streets and highways within the Village which shall in any manner prevent or impede the free passage of water and air to the roots of trees, shrubs, hedges, or other plants now or hereafter existing or planted in any of the public streets, highways or other public places within the Village.

Section 6. The Village Forester or other official of this Village, designated by the council, shall be permitted by the owner or occupants of any lot or parcel of land within the Village of East Grand Rapids containing trees, or shrubs, to enter such lot for the purpose of examining such trees or shrubs for any disease from insects or other causes and if any such trees or shrubs are affected by any disease or by insects tending to destroy plant life, he shall serve notice thereof upon the owner or occupant or agent of such lands to remove such insects or such disease within ten days after receiving such notice, and it shall thereupon be the duty of such owner, occupant or agent to comply with the requirements of said notice within the time therein specified and in the event of the failure of neglect of such owner, occupant, or agent to comply with the requirements of such notice, and the disease is such that it may spread to and destroy other trees, shrubbery and plant life, in any of said streets, highways or public places within the Village, such Forester or other officer shall report the conditions to the Village Council who may order such owner, occupant or agent to forthwith remove such diseased or insect infected tree, shrubbery or other plants, and that failure to comply with such order by such owner, occupant or agent shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter described.

Section 7. Every person or persons owning or occupying lands and premises within the Village of East Grand Rapids on which trees, shrubbery, hedges or other plants are growing and being maintained, shall trim and remove all broken or decayed branches and stems which overhang or encroach into any public street, highway, lane, alley or other public place within the Village.

Section 8. Where trees are less than one foot from the inner or outer line of any sidewalk now or hereafter constructed and laid in any public street, highway, lane or any public place, within the Village, such sidewalk may be constructed and laid so that an open space of not less than one foot shall be left around the trunk of any such trees.

Section 9. Whenever any buildings are erected within the Village, the owner or occupants of the lands thereof shall erect and place effectual and proper guards around each tree in any of the public streets and parks of the Village bordering upon such land where such building is being erected.

Section 10. No person or persons shall remove or trim any tree located in any portion of any of the public streets or public parks of the Village without a permit therefore be first obtained from the Village Council of the Village Forester.

Section 11. Any person or persons desiring a permit for the purposes specified in this ordinance shall make written application therefore and address to the Council of the Village and the Village Forester, and such application shall state the description of the lands owned by the applicant and the location where it is proposed to plant any such tree, shrub, hedge, or other plants, and if the same complies with the requirements of this ordinance a permit therefore shall be issued, which permit shall be void after sixty days from its date.

Section 12. The engineer of the Village shall notify the Village Forester of all proposed improvements of public streets, highways, lanes, or other public places within the Village where such improvements may effect trees, shrubbery, hedges, or other plants, in such streets, before such work upon such improvements is commenced.

Section 13. Any person or persons violation any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not more than fifty dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County in the discretion of the magistrate or court before whom the conviction may be had, for the period of not less than five days not more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and case such magistrate or court shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to the imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, but not to exceed a period of ninety days.

An ordinance to regulate the uses of any fire engine, fire apparatuses and any hose, tools, bells, fire alarms or other implements thereof belonging to the fire department system of the Village of East Grand Rapids.

The Village of East Grand Rapids ordains:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to use, or interfere with, or injure, any fire engine, hose truck and apparatuses, hook, ladders, hose, chemicals, tools, bells, fore alarm apparatuses, public cisterns, hydrants and all other property and implements of the Village of East Grand Rapids belonging to and part of the Village Fire Department, or to remove any of such described property or fire apparatus from a fire engine house or other place where such property or apparatuses may be kept, without first obtaining the permission in writing from a duly acting chief of the fire department of said Village. Provided, however, that in case of any fire within the Village, any member of the village fire department designated by the chief of the fire department may remove and take such fire engine, hose truck, and the necessary apparatuses and implements connected therewith from the fire engine houses or other place where such fire apparatuses are kept to attend and have the same at any fire.

Section 2. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) or more than Ninety Dollars (\$90.00) and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent, for a period not exceeding ninety days (90), or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, but not longer than ninety (90) days.

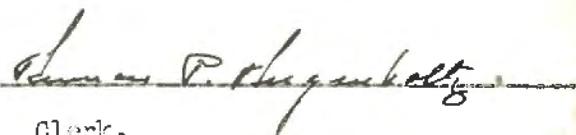

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section one: Sections two and eight of an ordinance passed and approved November 8th. 1922, entitled, "An Ordinance to regulate the electric wiring and the use of electricity and to provide for the protection of life and prevention of fires in the Village of East Grand Rapids," are hereby amended to read as follows:

Section two: The Clerk of this Village shall have authority upon the recommendation of the building or electrical inspector of the Village of East Grand Rapids to, and shall issue licenses to any person qualified to do electrical work and to any firm or corporation doing electrical work for others making application to contract and install electric wiring and appliances in or outside of any building in the Village of East Grand Rapids, and upon payment to said Clerk of the license herein provided for. The fee for the license herein provided for shall be twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars and such fee shall accompany each application for such license and no person, firm or corporation shall hereafter install any electrical appliances or wiring in or outside of any building in the Village of East Grand Rapids, without first having obtained a license to do such work and paying the aforesaid license fee.

Section eight: All wiring used in connection with electric light, heat or power hereafter installed in any dwelling house, church, school, theatre, commercial building, and any other building in the Village of East Grand Rapids, including dwelling houses, commonly known as summer cottages, stables, horse barns, automobile garages buildings, or any other accessory building, shall be inclosed in approved metal conduit or shall consist of approved steel-armored cable and all wiring in basements of any building shall be inclosed in rigid iron conduits. The provisions for wiring contained in this section shall apply to all stables, horse barns, automobile garages and all other accessory buildings whether or not such buildings are attached to any other building or dwelling house.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect October 30th. 1925.

Gentlemen:

The question arises of the location of the sidewalk to be placed along the front of our property on Lake Drive.

Last year the Village Engineer and Manager located the line for this walk, and we placed considerable shrubbery in groups to the south of this line. This year we have again gone over the ground several times with your committee relative to the question of the best place for this sidewalk.

After seriously considering the question from all sides, we are of the opinion that a sidewalk can be built between the street curb and the row of trees, but not

closer to the curb that four feet, which will not take out any desirable trees except one at the east end which would come out anyway, and which would not endanger the lives of the few pedestrians who use this street.

There have been very, very few instances in the city of vehicles jumping the curb and injuring pedestrians on a sidewalk over four feet away. Furthermore, traffic on Lake Drive will be considerably relieved by the paving in the near future of Hall Street, Franklin and San Lu Rae into East Grand Rapids.

In answer to your communication of the 2nd. inst. , after giving this matter a great deal of time and consideration, the Council wishes to correct you and inform you that your shrubbery on south side of sidewalk line was rushed in and set out by you long before the plans were completed for the Lake Drive curb and gutter and sidewalk improvement.

We feel that this was done by yourselves in your attempt to retain street rights which belong to the citizens of this village and the public.

We have ordered Engineer Whiting to set sidewalk stakes for a six foot walk four feet from the curb, removing trees which interfere with this plan. Three trees on east end of your lot shall be removed and the knol graded off and sidewalk shall make a long curve to meet adjoining sidewalk on the east.
