A N O R D I N A N C E

MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO OPERATE OR NAVIGATE ANY HYDROPLANES OR AIRPLANES UPON ANY OF THE NAVIGABLE WATERS WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to maintain, operate, or navigate any hydroplane, hydro-airplane, or airplane upon and through any of the water of Reeds Lake, Fisk Lake, or upon any of the channels, lagoons and water-ways connecting with and running into said lakes, which are within the corporate limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids.

Section 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not exceeding One hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, or, in default of payment thereof, by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent not to exceed ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court or justice of the peace before whom the conviction may be had.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect April 28, 1923.

A N O R D I N A N C E

TO REGULATE THE OPERATION AND USE OF VEHICLES ON THE PUBLIC STREETS AND HIGHWAYS OF THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS AND TO REGULATE AND LIMIT THE GROSS WEIGHT OF ALL SUCH VEHICLES.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle upon the public streets and highways of this village, the gross-weight of which exceeds Ten Tons.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful to operate any vehicle, except motor driven vehicles, upon the public streets and highways of this Village, the gross weight on any wheel of which shall exceed the following number of pounds.

Section 3. No motor trucks or trailers, hereafter operating upon the public streets and highways of this village, shall be equipped with driving wheels the tires of which are of metal that may come in contact with the surface of the road or pavement, except where chains or other non-skidding devices are used: Provided, that should any pavement or improved roadway be damaged by the use of chains or other non-skidding devices, the person, company or corporation owning or operating such vehicle, shall be liable to arrest and the penalties hereinafter provided and shall also be liable to the Village of East Grand Rapids for the cost of repairing any such damage.

Section 4. All motor trucks or trailers, now operating or hereafter placed in operation, upon the public streets and highways of this Village, shall have information relative to their height of wheel, width of tire, gauge, width over all, weight and carrying capacity, painted or printed in a conspicuous place, upon each of such vehicles.

Section 5. On the rear axle three-fourth of the gross weight of a motor truck or trailer, and its respective carrying capacity, must be within the limits of the schedule of the respective diameters of wheel, size of tire, and speed per mile, as shown in the schedule under section nine of this ordinance: Provided, That trailers having two wheels, at least three-fourth of the gross weight of the trailer and its respective load shall be upon the axle of the trailer.

Section 6. The front axle shall carry the remainder of the weight of a motor truck or trailer and load combined, and must be within the limits of the schedule of the respective diameter of wheel, size of tire and speed per mile, as shown in the schedule for single tires, under section nine of this ordinance.

Section 7. This ordinance shall apply to motor trucks or trailers used as busses for carrying passengers.

Section 8. When a truck is hauling a trailer, the speed shall be governed by the vehicle having the lowest mile per hour rating.

Section 9. The schedule for the regulation of the weight and speed of motor trucks and trailers upon the public streets and highways of this Village shall be as follows:

For a forty-inch wheel, multiply the above maximum wheel load figures by one and four-tenths.

For a forty-four-inch wheel, multiply the above maximum wheel load figures by one and six-tenths.

Section 10. Any person, firm or corporation which moves, or caused to be moved any vehicle over or along the public streets and highways of this village contrary to the provisions of this Ordinance shall for each offence, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than One Dollar nor more than One Hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in said common jail until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days.

Section 11. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect April 28, 1923.

To the Honorable, the President and Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids,

Gentlemen:-

By and with your permission, the Union Memorial Foundation are planning to erect on the property at the southeast corner of Wealthy Street and Plymouth Road a building to be used as a clinic for the diagnosis of disease.

The proposed building will be occupied by a corps of specialists in the several branches of medicine and surgery, who will devote their time and services to the diagnosis of all cases that may come or be sent to them; and by virtue of their contract with the foundation they agree to undertake this work at a fixed maximum charge for each case, which is very reasonable in amount. This work will be of great benefit to the public.

The proposed building will be quite similar in design and outward appearance to the Blodgett Hospital, will be four stories in height, with a frontage of about 97 feet on Wealthy Street and a depth of about 60 feet on Plymouth Road.

From a reading of the zoning ordinance we are of the opinion that the proposed building constitutes a non-conforming use and probably conflicts with the provisions as to height.

In view of the great benefits that will accrue to the public from an institution of this character, we respectfully request that steps be taken to amend the ordinance to permit the erection of the building; and in order that you may be fully advised as to the purposes and plans of the institution, we beh leave to present the same informally to you at the meeting of the Council this evening.

TO REGULATE TRAFFIC ON CERTAIN STREETS IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. Streets and boulevards may hereafter be set apart by the council of the village of east Grand Rapids and designated as "Through Traffic Streets", and vehicles passing thereon shall have the right of way over all vehicles approaching the same from side or other streets, and all vehicles approaching said through traffic streets shall stop before entering said streets, and shall not at any time enter said streets when to do so would interfere with or interrupt the traffic thereon.

Lake Drive, from west village limits to east village limits, Wealthy Street, from west village limits to Lakeside Drive and Sherman Street, from West village limits to Lake Drive, are hereby designated and shall hereafter be known as Through Traffic Streets.

Section 2. Any person violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dillars nor more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosscution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in said jail until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not more than ninety days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect May 29th. 1923.

A N O R D I N A N C E

TO REGULATE THE SELLING OR STORING OF COMBUSTIBLE OR EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCES OR MATERIAL WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDINANS:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, persons, firm or corporation to sell or store any gunpowder, gasoline, oils, or any other combustible or explosive substances, in any place within the village of East Grand Rapids, without a permit therefor having been first obtained from the council of this village, and any person, persons, firm or corporation, desiring so to do, shall make written application to said council for a permit therefor, which said application shall contain a full and complete statement of the nature of the combustible or explosive substance proposed to be sold or stored, and how the same shall be sold or stored.

Section 2. No permit shall be granted for the selling or storing of gasoline, oil, or other combustible or explosive substances, for the purposes of re-sale, in any building located less than one thousand feet from any dwelling or other building occupied or inhabited by any person or persons for residence purposes, and the selling or storing of any such substances in any building within the said prohibited district shall be unlawful.

Section 3. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than One dollar nor more than One hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not more than ninety days.

This Ordinance is ordered to take effect May 28th. 1923.

Trustee Whiting offered the following ordinance proposing to amend certain sections of the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of East Grand Rapids, viz:-

A N O R D I N A N C E

TO AMEND SECTIONS FOUR, FOURTEEN, FIFTEEN AND SIXTEEN OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED " AN ORDINANCE to establish districts of zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones, and to classify, regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof, "Approved April 3rd, 1922 and to repeal section twenty of said ordinance.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDINANS:-

Section 1. Sections four, fourteen, fifteen and sixteen of an ordinance entitled " An Ordinance to establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones, and to classify

regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof, "approved April 3rd. 1922, are hereby amended and section twenty is hereby repealed, said amended sections to read as follows:

Section 4. COMMERCIAL DISTRICT. The "Commercial District" shall hereafter be restricted to the area of land within the corporate limits of the Village of East Grand Rapids bounded as follows: On the south by the northerly line of Burchard Street, the southerly line of Lots number Seven and Eight of Boynton and Judd's Lake Addition to the City of Grand Rapids, Kent County, Michigan and the southerly line of the lots abutting upon the southerly side of Wealthy Street, as now platted, from the westerly line of said Lot number Eight of Boynton and Judd's Lake Addition to the easterly line of Lovett Avenue; and on the west by Lovett Avenue, on the north by Greenwood Avenue and Lakeside Drive to the east line of Reeds Lake Boulevard, and thence by the north line of Lot number Thirty-one (31) of said Boynton and Judd's Lake Addition east of said Reeds Lake Boulevard to the shore of Reeds Lake and on the east by the westerly shore of Reeds Lake, so-called, and also that area of land described as follows: Commencing at the southeast corner of Wealthy Street and Plymouth Road; thence south two hundred forty-one and four-tenth (241.4) feet; thence east One hundred seventy-five feet, thence north to the southerly line of Wealthy Street; thence westerly to beginning.

All buildings and premises within said districts, except as otherwise provided in this ordinance, may be used for any use except the following:

1. Abattoirs.
2. Acetylene Gas Manufacture.
3. Acid Manufacture.
4. Amonia, Bleaching Powder or Chlorine manufacture.
5. Arsenal.
6. Bakery (employing more than five persons)
7. Blacksmith or Horseshoeing shop.
8. Bottling Works.
9. Carting, express, hauling or storage yard.
10. Celluloid manufacture.
11. Crematory.
12. Creosote manufacture.
13. Coal, Coke or Woodyard.
14. Disinfectants manufacture.
15. Distillation of Bones, Coal or wood.
16. Dying and Cleaning Works (employing more than five persons)
17. Exterminator and Insect Poison Manufacture.
18. Fat Rendering.
19. Fertilizer.
20. Fire works or Explosive manufacture or storage.
21. Foundaries.
22. Gas (illuminating or heating) manufacture.
23. Glue, Size, or Gelatine manufacture.
24. Gunpowder manufacture or storage.
25. Ice plant or storage.
26. Incineration or reduction of Garbage, Dead Animals, Offal, or Refuse.
27. Laundry (employing more than five persons.)
28. Livery Stable.
29. Petroleum Refining or Storage.
30. Potash Works.
31. Pyroxlin manufacture.
32. Stock yards or Slaughter House.
33. Stone Yards or Monumental Works.
34. Storage or baling of Scrap, Paper, Iron, Bottles, or Junk.
35. Storage Warehouse.
36. Sulphuric, Nitric, or Hydrochlorid Acid Manufacture.
37. Tanning, Curing or Storage of Raw Hides or Skins.
38. Tar Distillation or manufacture.
39. Tar Roofing or Water Proofing manufacture.
40. Any other kind of manufacture or treatment other than the manufacture or treatment of products strictly incidental to the conduct of a retail business conducted on the premises.
41. And in general those uses which have been declared a nuisance in any court of record in this state, or by statute, or which may be noxious, or offensive by reason of the omission of odor, dust, smoke, gas or noise.

Section 14. "A" AREA DISTRICT. The boundary limits of the "A" Area District shall be the same as that prescribed and fixed by section six (6) of this ordinance for Residence District B, and the minimum dimensions of yards and the intensity of use of lot areas by dwellings hereafter erected or altered and the minimum lot area per family in such district, shall be as follows:

FRONT YARDS: The open space or front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling hereafter erected or altered, exclusive of uninclosed porches not more than ten (10) feet wide, except as otherwise provided in subdivision five (5) of section nineteen (19) of this ordinance, shall not be less than twenty (20) per cent of the full depth of the lot; Provided, that such front yard shall not be less than twenty (20) feet in depth, and need not exceed forty (40) feet in depth,

REAR YARDS: Immediately behind every dwelling hereafter erected or altered, there shall be a rear yard having a minimum depth of twenty-five (25) feet.

SIDE YARDS: Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on lots fifty (50) feet or less in width shall not be less than twenty-eight (28) percent of the full width of such lots and the total width for side yards for lots more than fifty-one (51) feet wide shall not be less than thirty (30) percent of the full width of such lots, and on lots from fifty (50) to fifty-one (51) feet wide no dwelling shall be erected thereon of a greater width than thirty-six (36) feet; Provided, that in no case shall any side yard be less than five (5) feet wide. Provided further, that in the case of corner lots, which have lots adjoining them on the rear and which are platted or laid out so as to face and front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street line shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet wide, not nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one (51) or more feet in width; Provided however, that the aforesaid side yard requirements for corner lots may be modified as provided in subdivision six (6) of section nineteen (19) of this ordinance, and provided further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet, except as provided in said subdivision six (6) of section nineteen (19) of this ordinance.

COURTS: Dwellings sixty (60) feet or more in length shall be provided with inner and outer courts of the dimensions prescribed for dwellings in the "B" Area District.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY: Every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered which is located in the "A" Area District shall provide a lot area of not less than five thousand (5000) square feet per family; Provided however, that where a lot is separate and distinct from adjacent lots and is included in a plat of record at the time of the passage of this ordinance, has less area than herein required, then such minimum lot area per family may be less than that herein required, but in no case shall such minimum lot area be less than four thousand (4000) square feet per family.

Section 15. "B" AREA DISTRICT. The boundary limits of the "B" Area District shall be the same as that established in section five (5) of this ordinance for Residence District A, and the minimum dimensions of yards and courts and the intensity of use of lot areas by buildings hereafter erected or altered, and the minimum lot area per family, in such district, shall be as follows:

FRONT YARDS: The open space or front yard between the front lot line and the extreme front line of any dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered in Residence District A, exclusive of uninclosed porches not more than ten (10) feet wide, except as otherwise provided for in subdivision five (5) of section nineteen (19) of this ordinance, shall not be less than twenty (20) feet in depth and need not be more than forty (40) feet deep.

REAR YARD. Immediately behind every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered in such district there shall be a rear yard having a minimum depth of twenty five (25) feet.

SIDE YARDS. Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on lots fifty (50) feet or less in width shall not be less than twenty-eight (28) percent of the full width of such lots, and the total width for side yards for lots more than fifty-one (51) feet wide shall not be less than thirty (30) percent of the full width of such lots, and no dwellings or buildings shall be erected on lots from (50) to fifty-one (51) feet wide of a greater width than thirty-six feet; Provided, that in no case shall any side yard be less than five (5) feet wide; and provided further, that in case any dwelling or building exceeds forty-five (45) feet in height, the side yard shall be increased in width by one foot for each additional story above the third story, and such side yard shall be further increased in width by three (3) inches for every ten (10) feet or fraction thereof that the length of the side yard exceeds fifty (50) feet. In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face or front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide, and the side wall of the dwelling or building next to the street shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet in width, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one (51) or more feet in width; Provided, however, that the aforesaid side yards requirements for corner lots may be modified as provided in subdivision six (6) of section nineteen (19) of this ordinance, and provided further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings or buildings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet except as provided in said subdivision six (6) of section nineteen (19) of this ordinance.

OUTER COURTS: The above minimum widths for side yards for multiple dwellings more than sixty (60) feet in length may be observed for any length of side yard, provided there shall be an outer court at least every forty (40) feet of not less than five (5) feet wide for a one-story dwelling, six (6) feet wide for two-story dwelling, seven (7) feet wide for a three story dwelling, and shall be increased by two (2) feet in width for each additional story above three (3) stories.

INNER COURTS: An inner court shall have a width of not less than twice the minimum width prescribed in this section for an outer court, nor shall its area be less than twice the square of its required least dimensions.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY: Every dwelling or building hereafter erected or altered which is located in the "B" Area District shall provide a lot area of not less than five thousand (5000) square feet per family for a "private dwelling" and of not less than twenty-five hundred (2500) square feet per family for a "two-family dwelling" and of not less than fifteen hundred (1500) square feet per family for multiple dwellings of Class A, and of not less than two hundred (200) square feet per person for multiple dwellings of Class B and hotels; provided however, that where a lot is separate and distinct from adjacent lots and is included in a plat of record at the time of the passage of this ordinance, has less area than herein required for "private dwellings", "Two-family dwellings", and "multiple dwellings" of Class "A", then such minimum lot area per family may be less than that herein required, but in no case shall such minimum lot area be less than eighty (80) percent of the aforesaid requirements.

Section 16. - "C" AREA DISTRICT: The boundaries of the C Area District shall be the same as that established in this ordinance for the Commercial District, and the minimum dimensions of yards and courts, and the intensity of use of lot areas by buildings hereafter erected or altered, and the minimum lot area per family in building used for dwelling house purposes, shall be as follows:

REAR YARD: there shall be a rear yard of not less than ten (10) feet in depth in the case of interior lots.

SIDE YARDS: Commercial buildings hereafter erected on an interior lot may be built up to the side lot line if the side wall is without windows, and in case a side yard is provided, such side yard shall not be less than five (5) feet wide.

Any building hereafter erected or altered in such district in which there are dwellings and in which the lower stories are not occupied for dwelling purposes, the requirements for rear and side yards and courts shall be the same as that provided for dwellings in the B Area District, and such yards or court may start at the level of the lowest dwelling story served by such yard or court.

INTENSITY OF USE OF LOT. Buildings to be used for commercial or industrial purposes may occupy one hundred (100) percent of the area of the lot.

LOT AREA PER FAMILY. Every building hereafter erected or altered for use for residence purposes in the C. Area District shall provide lot areas per family or per person, as provided for and required for dwellings in the B. Area District.

Section 20. Section Twenty (20) is hereby repealed, and the number of each section after said section twenty (20) is reduced by one so that the numbers of all sections of said ordinance shall be consecutive commencing with section number one.

Trustee Whiting moved that the proposed amendments to the Zoning Ordinance of the Village of East Grand Rapids be laid on the table and that a public hearing thereof be held at the Council room on Monday, June 11th, 1923, at 8 o'clock in the evening of said day, and that the Clerk be directed to cause due and legal notice of said public hearing to be published in the Grand Rapids Herald, a newspaper having a general circulation in the Village of East Grand Rapids, at least fifteen full days before said hearing, and that he cause to be indicated in such notice the proposed changes to said ordinance and in the district boundary lines and describe the boundaries of the territory to be effected, and also that said notice shall state the time and place when and where the council will meet and consider objections to such proposed change.

cost of such improvement as shown by the map, plat and diagram of such proposed district now on file in the office of said Clerk and no person appearing and objection thereto, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the aforesaid improvement be made, and that the map, plan and diagram thereof now on file in the office of the Village Clerk be approved and adopted and that all lots, parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon each side of Lakeside Drive a public street in said village and lying between the south line of Lake Drive and the north line of Argentina Drive in said village and within the boundaries of said district, as shown by the map, plat and diagram of said proposed special assessment district be known as the Lakeside Drive Paving District No. 3. and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the expense of said improvement, including the cost of said estimate and the surveys, map, plan and diagram of the work and the locality to be improved, and the cost of the map, plat and diagram of the lands and premises to be assessed one-half of the cost thereof, and the assessments incident thereto, be, and the same hereby is estimated at the sum of Eighty-four hundred and forty-two (\$8442.00) dollars; that one-half of the cost of said improvement be assessed upon and against the lands and premises lying within said special assessment district, according to foot frontage and that the amount so assessed against such lot or parcel of land be paid in five equal installments with interest upon the deferred installments at the rate of six percent per annum and that one-half of said cost be paid from the general highway fund of the Village of East Grand Rapids to be collected annually for five years, and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Assessors of the Village be, and they are hereby directed to make and prepare a special assessment roll of all the lands and premises within said special assessment district as shown by said map, plan and diagram, said roll to be in five parts numbered one, two, three, four and five respectively, each part to contain a list of such lot and parcel of land constituting said special assessment district with the names of the owners or occupants of each lot or parcel of land within said district, and that said Board be, and they are hereby further directed to assess and levy one-half of said cost upon each of said lots, parts of lots and parcels of land, within said district according to foot frontage, and one part of said assessment to be collected in the current year, to-wit: 1923, and one of said parts to be collected annually thereafter until the whole is collected; and if from the shape or size of such lot an assessment thereon in proportion to its frontage would be unjust and disproportionate to the assessments upon other lots, said Board shall assess such lot for such number of feet frontage as the Board deems to be equitable; and it is

ORDERED, That said Board of Assessors apportion against the Village of East Grand Rapids one-half of the cost of said improvement to be paid from the Village Highway funds, to be raised by tax upon all the taxable property in the Village, in five equal installments, and report said special assessment roll to this council at its next regular meeting.

The undersigned owners of residences on Orchard Ave.
desire to call your attention to the urgent necessity of improving
said street.

This matter has been presented on previous occasions and we
have been given to understand that something would be done to make the
street more passable, but as nothing has been done so far, and the
street is continually getting worse, we again ask that steps be taken
to improve the street in some way.

Two of the undersigned are now occupying their residences and
the other two will occupy theirs within two weeks. We find great diffi-
culty in getting deliveries of all kinds of goods on this street on
account of its poor condition and in some cases have been refused deli-
very. This has happened in dry weather. Unless the street is improved
before the fall rains, it will be impossible to get coal deliveries, etc
not to mention the inconvenience to ourselves not being able to drive
our automobiles to our own houses. The surface of the street is now
all clay and very rough, and in wet weather it is impassable in its
present condition.

We do not believe that the Council fully understands how
bad the condition of this street is and we respectfully urge that an

A N O R D I N A N C E .

TO AMEND THE PARAGRAPH ENTITLED "REAR YARDS" OF SECTION FOURTEEN OF AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE to establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones, and to classify, regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the violation of the terms hereof, "Approved April 3rd, 1922, as amended by an ordinance approved June 11th, 1923.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. The paragraph entitled "rear Yards" of section fourteen of an Ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to establish districts or zones in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which to regulate the use of land and structures, and the area of yards, courts and other open spaces; and to regulate and limit the height, the area, the size and location of buildings hereafter erected; and to regulate the light and ventilation of such buildings; and to regulate the density of population in such districts or zones, and to classify, regulate and restrict the location of trades and industries; to provide for the administering of this ordinance and for appeals therefrom, and for amendments, supplements or changes hereto, and to provide penalties for the vio-

lation of the terms hereof," and approved April 3rd, 1922, and as amended by ordinance approved June 11th, 1923, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 18. ACCESSORY BUILDING, PRIVATE GARAGES AND STABLES. When an accessory building is erected on a lot on which there is a dwelling, it shall be placed on the rear of the lot except as hereinafter otherwise provided; If a private garage or private stable is erected on the same lot on which there is a dwelling, such garage or stable shall, except as hereinafter otherwise provided, be placed on the rear of the lot and shall not exceed two stories in height and may have living rooms therein for the use solely of household employes or members of the family of the occupants of the dwelling and when so occupied the garage or stable, in addition to complying with all other provisions of this ordinance, shall have an entrance from the outside of the building without passing through the garage or stable. No such accessory building, private garage or stable shall approach nearer the rear wall of the dwelling than ten (10) feet; Provided, however, that a one story garage of fire-proof construction may be attached to the dwelling when it does not obstruct or interfere with the light or ventilation thereof, and provided that such garage shall not occupy more than one-third of the area of the rear yard. In the case of a corner lot any such accessory building private garage or stable shall not be nearer the side street line than twenty (20) feet; and in the case of a corner lot which has lots adjoining it on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face or front on the street running along the side of such corner lot, such private garage shall be attached to the dwelling and in no case shall the rear wall of such garage be nearer the rear lot line than fifteen (15) feet.

And that a public hearing upon said proposed amendment be held in the Council room on Monday, the 15th day of October, 1923, at eight o'clock in the evening of said day and that the Village Clerk be and he is hereby directed to cause due legal notice of such proposed amendment and of such public hearing to be published in the Sunday issue of the Grand Rapids Herald, a newspaper circulating in this Village, at least 15 full days before said hearing.

The Committee estimates the approximate cost of this expense to be 1800 dollars, from which would be deducted the cost of one man from now until the close of our fiscal year and the excess in fines collected above the estimate put in our budget, leaving a net cost of about 1200 dollars.

Dear Mr. Hugenholtz:

Relative to six (6) boulevard lights on Cambridge Blvd between Wealthy Avenue and Lake Drive, we are attaching herewith duplicate copies of agreement covering same. If this is acceptable to the Village, kindly sign and return both copies, and we will have same executed here returning one copy for your files.

The underground system on boulevard lighting is brought up on a pole situated on private property in the rear of the first house south of Wealthy Avenue on the west side of Cambridge Boulevard. This party has requested us to remove the pole. Providing this party insists on the pole being removed, it will be necessary to carry the underground over and up our pole just to the north of this one. Otherwise, we could run the service right to the cutout box as now located.

The undersigned hereby respectfully requests your honorable body to grant a special permit to me to place sand in the bottom of Reeds Lake, opposite lots 60 of Boynton and Judd's Lake addition to the City of Grand Rapids, commencing from the shore line as established by the government meander line to the bathing dock in said lake in front of my premises. BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids that it deems said building to be in an unsafe condition and dangerous to life and that this Council does hereby declare said building, in its present condition, to be a public nuisance and that this Council do and it hereby does order the owner of said building to tear and pull it down and to abate and remove said nuisance within thirty days after the date of service of a true and compared copy of this resolution and order upon said owner and that this Council do, and it hereby does, further notify said owner that in case he shall fail or neglect to comply with the requirements of this order within the time specified, that this Council will cause said building to be torn and pulled down and said nuisance removed and that all expense so incurred by this Council shall be charge upon the lot upon which said building stands and collected as a special assessment against said premises and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Clerk of this Village do forthwith serve a true copy of this resolution and order compared by him upon the owner or owners of said building.

RESOLVED, By the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids, that the cost of said improvement, including the cost of said estimate, maps, plat, plan, diagram and specifications and assessments incident thereto, be and the same is hereby estimated at the sum of Twenty three hundred thirty two and 80/100, and be it

RESOLVED, That this Council deems all lands and premises, lots parts of lots and parcels of land abutting upon and adjacent to either side of said Floral Drive, and lying between Argentina Drive and San Lu Rae Drive, and extending back at right angles to the rear line of the lots and parcels of land abutting upon said street, will be benefited by said improvement, and that this Council intends to establish a sewer and special assessment district, comprised of the lots, lands and premises as above described and as shown by the map, plat and diagram submitted to this Council, and that the entire cost of said improvement be defrayed by special assessment upon the lands and premises within said sewer and special assessment upon the lands and premises with said sewer and special assessment district according to benefits derived by each of said lots or parcels of land from said improvement, and that said assessment, when levied, be made payable in five equal annual installments; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the said maps, plat, plan, diagram and specifications and said estimate of the cost and expense thereof, be filed with the Clerk of the Village, and that this Council meet on Monday, December 17th, 1923, at the Council room in said Village, at 8 o'clock in the evening of said day or as soon after said hour as a hearing can be had, to hear and consider any objections or suggestions to said improvement, or to said maps, plat, plan, diagram or specifications, or to the establishment of said proposed sewer and special assessment district, and that the Village Clerk prepare and post proper notices of the filing of said maps, plat, plan, diagram, specifications, and of said estimate, in his office, and of the determination of the Council to make said proposed improvement and to assess the cost thereof upon the owners and occupants of the lands and premises within said sewer and special assessment district according to benefits, and of the time and place when and where the Council will meet to hear and consider objections to said improvement and to said map, plat, plan, diagram, specifications and estimate, and to the establishment of said sewer and special assessment district; and be it further

RESOLVED, That the Board of Assessors of the Village be and they are hereby directed to make and prepare special assessments rolls of all of said lands and premises within said sewer and special assessment district, said roll to be in five parts, for the payment of the entire cost of said proposed improvement and to report said roll to the Council at its next regular meeting; and it is

ORDERED, That the Village Clerk notify the Chairman of the said Board of Assessors of this resolution and deliver him a copy of the map, plat and diagram now on file in his office.

Gentlemen:

This is to bring to your attention the fact that the effluent from your sewage disposal plant after purification discharges into Silver Creek, which for a part of its course runs through the City of Grand Rapids as an open natural body of water.

As it is presently operated, raw sewage is by passed around the plant for an 1 hr. period each day more or less beginning at 5 o'clock in the evening. This results in deposits in the creek bed and along the sides which give rise to an objectionable and unsanitary condition which would not be necessary if the sewage disposal plant performed its proper functions through its 24 hrs. of the day.

We understand that this is not necessary; that a reasonable amount of work would so equip your disposal plant as that it would properly purify this sewage throughout the entire day, and we herein make formal complaint and ask that you take immediate steps to remedy the conditions discussed herein.

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The Ordinance Committee presented the following ordinance for consideration.

An Ordinance to Establish Fire Limits in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, within which wooden Buildings and structures shall not be erected, placed or enlarged; and to regulate the manner of constructing Buildings within such fire limits, and to regulate the kind of material of which the outer walls and roofs shall be constructed, and to declare buildings constructed in violation of the provisions hereof to be a nuisance and to provide the abatement and removal of such prohibited buildings, and to provide for penalties for the violation of the terms hereof.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS, MICHIGAN, ORDAINS:

Section 1. All that part of the lands and premises in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, embraced within the following limits and boundaries is hereby declared to be a fire district, viz; all the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land adjacent to and abutting upon the south side of Wealthy Street, from Lakeside Drive to the west line of Lot number twenty four of Jackson's sub-division of Lots two and eleven of Boynton and Judd's Lake addition to the city of Grand Rapids, and upon the northerly side of Wealthy Street, from Lakeside Drive to the easterly line of Lovett Avenue; and all the lots parts of lots and parcels of land adjacent to and abutting upon the east side of Lakeside Drive, from the northerly line of Burchard St to the north line of lot number sixty-three of said Boynton and Judd's Lake addition, and abutting upon the west side of said Lakeside Drive, from the southerly line of lot number seven of said Boynton and Judd's Lake addition to the northwesterly line of lot number twenty-five of said addition; the boundary limits of said fire district to extend back at right angles from said streets a distance of One hundred-twenty five feet; and no building or structure, or part thereof, shall hereafter be erected, removed into, placed, rebuilt, repaired, enlarged, or removed from one place to another, within the fire limits as in this section established, except as provided in this ordinance.

Section 2. The owner or owners of any building and structure within the limits of the fire district as established in section 1 of this ordinance, who hereafter desires to rebuild, repair, enlarge, any such building or structure, or any part there, or who hereafter desire to remove any such building or structure, or part thereof, from one place to another within said fire district, or who hereafter desire to remove any building or structure, or part thereof, into said fire district, or any person or persons who hereafter erect any building or structure within said fire district, shall first make written application to the Building Inspector of the Village of East Grand Rapids for a permit therefor; such application shall comply with the requirements of this ordinance and of all other and existing ordinances of this Village relating to building permits, and shall, in addition to all other information required, contain a statement as to the kind of building to be erected or rebuilt,

the extent of the repairs or enlargement to be made, and the place from and to which any such building or structure is to be removed, together with a statement of the size and thickness of the outer walls, and of the kind of material is to be used in the construction of the outer walls and roof of any such building or structure, or part thereof. No permit shall be issued unless the proposed building or structure, or part thereof, of the rebuilding, repairs, removal or enlarging thereof, complies in all respects with the provisions of this ordinance and with the provisions of all other ordinances of this Village applicable thereto; when such permit is issued by the Building Inspector he shall specify therein the purpose for which it is issued, and it shall be unlawful for any person or persons to use such permit for any other purpose than that therein specified. It shall be the duty of the Building Inspector, and his assistants, to do and perform all things necessary to enforce and carry out the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 3. The outside and party walls of all buildings, or parts of buildings, hereafter removed into said fire district, or which shall hereafter be placed, erected, rebuilt, repaired, or enlarged, within said fire district, shall be constructed of stone, brick, cement, or other fireproof material, and when brick, stone or cement is used the first floor walls shall be not less than one foot thick; the second story walls not less than eight inches thick. The roofs of all such buildings shall be constructed of metal, slate, tile, gravel, or other fireproof material. The gutters on the roofs of all such buildings shall be constructed of metal, and the cornices shall be constructed of metal, stone, brick or cement and securely fastened to the building. All division walls shall be constructed of stone, brick or cement and shall extend at least one foot above the sheathing of the roof, and in no case shall the sheathing of any such roof extend across any division or end wall, and all windows or other openings in the rear, side exterior, and division walls of all buildings, except dwelling houses, shall be provided with close fitting iron shutters, arranged in such manner that they may be speedily and securely closed in case of fire; Provided, however, that it shall not be necessary to provide such shutters for exterior walls of such buildings that border upon a street. Outside stairways, platforms, balconies, sheds and awnings, shall be constructed as included within the term "parts of buildings," as used in this section, and shall be constructed as provided in this section.

Section 4. Any building or structure, or part thereof, hereafter erected, placed, or removed, within the limits of said fire district, or any such building or structure, or part thereof, within said district, which is hereafter rebuilt, repaired, enlarged, or removed from one place to another in said district, contrary to the provisions of this ordinance, are hereby declared and deemed to be a public nuisance, and in any such case it shall be the duty of the building inspector of this Village to notify in writing the owner or owners of such building or structure, or part thereof so violating the provisions of this ordinance, of such violation and to order such owner or owners to abate such nuisance forthwith. In case such owner or owners shall fail or neglect to comply with the provisions of this ordinance and with the requirements of said notice, it shall then be the duty of such building inspector to cause such unlawful building or structure, or part thereof, to be torn down and razed, and the expense thereof shall be charged to such owner or owners and constitute and be a lien against the land upon which buildings or structure, or part thereof, stands or is placed, to be collected as other village taxes are collected.

Section 5. Any violation of or failure to comply with the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, shall, on the conviction of the offender, or offenders, be punished by a fine of not exceeding One hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent for a period not exceeding ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom such conviction may be had; and in case only a fine is imposed, in default of the payment thereof and of the costs of prosecution, such offender or offenders may be imprisoned in said jail until such fine and costs are paid but not for a longer period than ninety days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect January 10th, A. D. 1924.
