The following contract was then read by the Clerk:

THIS AGREEMENT entered into this 4th. day of May, 1920 between the City of Grand Rapids, a municipal corporation of the State of Michigan, of the first part, and the Township of Grand Rapids, County of Kent and State of Michigan, of the second part, WITNESSES;

Whereas, the party of the first part maintains a Fire Department, together with the necessary equipment, in the City of Grand Rapids, and is willing under the terms of this agreement to extend its fire service to the party of the second part; and

Whereas, the party of the second part, by action of its Township Board, has delegated authority to its Supervisor to enter into this agreement for fire protection covering all properties adjacent to the City of Grand Rapids, and accessible by good roads within the Township of Grand Rapids,

THEREFORE, it is agreed by said parties as follows, for each call answered:

For each Chemical Engine	\$ 25.00
For each Engine Company, consisting of Hose Wagon and Engine	50.00
For each Engine Company and Chemical Engine	75.00
For each Engine Company, Chemical and Ladder Truck,	100.00

Together with an additional charge of \$ 5.00 per mile, including both ways, and \$ 25.00 per hour from the time the apparatus leaves the station until their return,

Party of the second part agrees in calling for fire apparatus and service, it will conform to such regulations and requirements as may be fixed by the Fire Marshall of the party of the first part. It is agreed that in calling for assistance, all alarms by telephone will be called back to obviate as far as possible false alarms. For instance, any person calling for assistance in the Township of Grand Rapids will be asked by the Fire Department to hang up the receiver and the number will be called back, and confirmation of the call for assistance made; and it is agreed that upon the rendering of any service called for by this contract, it will upon being presented with a bill for same, forthwith pay the amounts hereinbefore specified, and party of the first part further agrees that it will respond to all calls made upon it for fire apparatus that conform to the rules laid down by the Fire Marshall, and that are not inconsistent with proper protection of the City.

It is expressly understood and agreed that neither this contract nor the services to be rendered hereunder shall in any event render the city, directly or indirectly, liable for any loss or damage that may be claimed to arise through negligence of the Fire Department or of any of the officials or employees in connection with the carrying out of this agreement, and that this contract shall not be made the basis, directly or indirectly, for any claim of damage against the city of any kind or nature whatsoever.

It is mutually understood and agreed that this agreement shall be and remain in force until terminated by the action of either of said parties, but that either of the parties hereto may terminate the same on giving to the other party thirty days notice in writing of its desire so to do.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, said parties have herunto set their hands by their duly authorized officers, in triplicate, this 4th. day of May, 1920.

Will you kindly advise why I have not had a reply to my letter of July 11th. copy of which was sent to Mr. Hall. The occasion of that letter was a notification from part owners of the water main outside of the Village that the Village had broken its agreement with them by permitting a water connection prior to a pro rate payment by a person not a part owner.

Will you kindly also advise me on the following points for which I am now asked by outside owners

- (1) Was water connection made for Mr. Limbert; if so, on what date?
- (2) Was water connection made for Dr. Temple, if so, on what date?

You will recall that due to the inability of the village to deal with outsiders, these negotiations were handled through me and accordingly I feel that this information should be placed in my hands promptly as well as that called for in my letter.

We wish to call your attention of your honorable body to a notice which we have received from the Village Treasurer stating that a tax has been assessed against this company in the amount of \$ 97.02, covering sixty-six feet of Barnard Street, recently vacated by the Village of East Grand Rapids, said tax assessment being in connection with Paving District No. 2.

This vacated portion of Barnard Street recently acquired by this Company was vacated in consideration of this Company deeding to the Village of East Grand Rapids a portion of Lot 25 and inasmuch as there were no taxes assessed against the property at that time, we do not feel we should be required to pay this tax at this time, and inasmuch as this tax has been heretofore assessed against the village at large we do not think it proper at this time for the Village to assess this Company for this amount.

Trustee Tinkler moved the following amendments to the proposed Zoning Ordinance:

1.

Amend Subdivision 13 of Section 2 by adding before the beginning of said subdivision the following:

"Land occupied or to be occupied by a building and accessory buildings and including the open spaces required under this ordinance. A lot may be land platted and recorded on the records of the Register of Deeds for Kent County, Michigan, or may be unplatted land and described by metes and bounds."

2.

Amend subdivision 15 of Section 2 by striking out the words "eighteen inches in width" on line 7 and insert in lieu thereof the words "thirty inches in width measured horizontally from the walls of the building."

3.

Amend section 4 by striking out the word "Lakeside Drive, and the north line of Lot Number sixty-six of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition" on line 10 and 11 and insert in lieu thereof the following words:

"and Lakeside Drive to east line of Reeds Lake Boulevard, and thence by the north line of Lot Number thirty-one (31) of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition east of said Reeds Lake Boulevard to Reeds Lake;"

4.

Amend section 6 by striking out the words "to Lot Sixty-six of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the City of Grand Rapids, Kent County, Michigan, on line 9 and 10 and insert in lieu thereof the words, "to Reeds Lake Boulevard"

5.

Amend section 16 by striking out all of paragraph entitled "Side yards" and insert in lieu thereof the following paragraph:

"SIDE YARDS. Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on lots fifty (50) feet or less in width shall not be less than twenty-eight (28) percent of the full width of such lots, and the total width for side yards for lots more than fifty-one (51) feet wide shall not be less than thirty (30) percent of the full width of such lots, and on lots from fifty (50) to fifty-one (51) feet wide no dwelling shall be erected thereon of a greater width than thirty-six (36) feet; Provided that in

no case shall any side yard be less than five (5) feet wide. In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face and front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet wide, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one or more feet in width; Provided, however, that the aforesaid side yard requirement for corner lots may be modified as provided in subdivision ~~five~~ (6) of section twenty-one (21) of this ordinance, and provided further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet, except as provided in said subdivision ~~five~~ (6) of section twenty-one (21) of this ordinance."

6.

Amend section 17 by striking out all of paragraph entitled "Side Yards" and insert in lieu thereof the following paragraph:

"SIDE YARDS". Side yards shall be provided for on each side of every dwelling hereafter erected or altered and the total width of all side yards on lots fifty (50) feet or less in width shall not be less than twenty-eight percent of the full width of ~~such~~ lots, and the total width for side yards for lots more than fifty-one (51) feet wide shall not be less than thirty (30) per cent of the full width of such lots, and no dwelling shall be erected on lots from fifty (50) to fifty-one (51) feet wide of a greater width than thirty-six (36) feet ~~wide~~; Provided, that in no case shall any side yard be less than five (5) feet wide, and provided further, that in ~~no~~ case any dwelling or building exceeds forty-five feet in height, the side yard width shall be increased by one foot for each additional story above the third story, and such side yards shall be further increased in width by three inches for every ten feet or fraction thereof that the length of the side yard exceeds fifty (50) feet. In the case of corner lots which have lots adjoining them on the rear which are platted or laid out so as to face or front on the street running along the side of such corner lots, the side yard farthest ~~as~~ away from the street line shall not be less than five (5) feet wide, and the side wall of the dwelling next to the street line shall not be nearer such street line than nine (9) feet on lots less than fifty-one (51) feet wide, nor nearer than ten (10) feet on lots fifty-one (51) feet or more in width; Provided, however, that the aforesaid side yard requirements for corner lots may be modified as provided in subdivision six (6) of section twenty-one (21) of this ordinance, and provided further, that in no case shall the side walls of dwellings be nearer to each other than ten (10) feet, except as provided in said subdivision six (6) of section twenty-one (21) of this ordinance.

Amend the third subdivision of section 21 by striking out the word four on last line, and insert in lieu thereof the word "six"

8.

Amend section 21 by adding thereto the following two subdivisions:

Fifth "When the front wall of any dwelling, or the front wall of inclosed porches of dwellings, heretofore erected in any block between two intersecting streets within the A or B Area Districts have been erected at a practically uniform distance back from the street line, and the building line so established is within the requirements of sections sixteen (16) or seventeen (17) of this ordinance, as the case may be, for front yards, then in such case the extreme front front of dwellings hereafter erected upon ~~such~~ lots within any such block shall conform to such established building line; Provided, however, in case such existing dwellings established a building line of less than twenty (20) feet from the front lot line, and the number of such existing dwellings exceed twenty-five (25) percent of the number of lots in any such block, then the extreme front of the house may be placed at such distance from the street line as will conform to such established building line, but no part of such house or of any porch thereto attached shall be nearer the street line than ten (10) feet."

Sixth: In case an existing corner lot in A or B area District is so narrow that a strict compliance with the side yard requirements for corner lots in such district would render such lots unavailable for the use permitted in such districts, then the council, sitting as a board of appeals, may modify and reduce the side yard requirements provided for in section sixteen (16) or seventeen (17) of this ordinance, and in so doing such board of appeals shall observe the spirit of this ordinance, and shall consider and have due regard for other adjoining lots and premises."

9.

Amend section 20 by striking out the words "of fire proof construction on lines 13 and 14"

Trustee Tinkler moved the adoption of the amendments as read. Supported by Trustee Hill.

Dear Mr. Kenyon:

For your information I am enclosing a statement of Village of East Grand Rapids taxes paid by the Grand Rapids Railway Company covering the period from 1908 to 1921, inclusive, which I am sure will prove interesting to you.

Having in mind the amount of taxes paid annually by this Company for the benefit of the Village in my judgment the license rate so far as Ramona Park amusements are concerned, should be lessened considerably in comparing the same with the concessions that are placed on the main street of the Village, most of which do not have to pay taxes and do nothing for the real support of the Village and live to a great extent through the efforts of the Railway Company at Ramona.

I do not know your thoughts, of course, or those of the members of the Council as regards our license fee, but want to call your further attention to the fact that resort business is getting worse every year. Last year we operated at the greatest loss we have ever known, and operating conditions so far as revenue is concerned, compared with the old order of things is different from what it used to be, and I believe the Council should give this careful consideration before they definitely decide as to any amount that should be paid by this Company or its concessionists.

Another fact to be taken in consideration is that you do not police and have not had to police our Park, and with the license paid we certainly have been entitled to plenty of police protection, and if we had had same we would save considerably each year.

All of the above for your consideration.

The greatest obstacle that we have encountered is the poor arrangement of the sewer, which we find is considerable too high for proper connection, besides we believe is not adequate in size to take care of all the flowage that comes from East Robt Robinson Road.

We understand that you have in mind building another sewer lift on Robinson Road- while this may relieve the excess water, it still would not permit of our making connections from the basement of these houses. Furthermore, it is our belief that the cost of building the lift, and the continued maintenance of same, would cost more in the long run than to fix the sewer properly at this time.

We understand that you are contemplating soon to grade Briarwood, and we suggest that you give this matter your consideration so that it can be done before a permanent street is put down. The writer has been a large taxpayer for the past sixteen years, and has not before asked any favors at your hands. We personally paid for many public conveniences and necessities before the village was in position to care for them, and we feel justly entitled to your consideration at this time.

The Ordinance Committee presented the following ordinance:

A N O R D I N A N C E

TO REGULATE AND FIX THE ISSUING OF LICENSES AND FIXING THE AMOUNT AND COLLECTION OF LICENSES FEES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS NOT OTHERWISE PROVIDED FOR, AND TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. No person, firm or corporation, shall either directly or indirectly, by his, her, their or its officers, agents or employees, carry on or engage in any of the following occupations, trades or businesses in the village of East Grand Rapids, without first obtaining a license therefor from the said village, and without first having paid the license fee or charge made for such license, which license fee or charge shall be as follows, unless otherwise changed by the council of this village as in this ordinance provided:

A.- Every theatre, show-house, musical hall, or entertainment hall, charging an admission fee, with a seating capacity for 1000 or more persons, per year, \$ 150.00

B.- Every theatre, show-house, musical hall, or entertainment hall, charging an admission fee, with a seating capacity for less than 1000 persons, per year, \$ 75.00

C.- Every Merry-go-round or carousel, so-called, operated with music, per year, \$ 50.00

D.- Every circle swing, so-called, per year, \$ 25.00

E.- Every amusement device known as a whip, per year, \$ 25.00

F.- Every roller coaster or jack rabbit, so-called, per year, \$ 50.00.

G.- Every old-mill, so-called, or device for operating boats by artificial waterways operated for hire and reward, per year, \$ 25.00

H.- For each dance hall or roller skating rink, per year \$ 25.00

I.- Every aerial railway, per year, \$ 250.00

J.- Every laughing palace or hall, so-called, every cave-of-the-winds, so-called, or every house-of-trouble, so-called, each per year, \$ 25.00; and for all or any other place or places of amusement or entertainment of a similar kind or nature as those specified in this subdivision and not provided for in this ordinance or any other ordinance of this village, such sum as the council shall by resolution determine.

K.- Every person keeping for gain or profit horoscopic views, or any magnifying glass or galasses, or any lung tester or any muscle developer, each per year, \$ 10.00, or \$ 2.00 per each day.

L.- Each proprietor of a phonograph or kinetoscope business operated for hire or reward, per year, \$ 10.00, or \$ 2.00 per day.

M.- Each proprietor of a penny arcade or penny-in-the-slot parlor for showing pictures, per year, \$ 5.00 for each machine, but this amount shall not be collected where the license fee provided in the preceding paragraph is paid.

N.- Each proprietor of an automatic musical machine or instrument, or automatic picture machines, \$ 5.00 per year for each machine.

O.- Each person operating an electric battery or batteries for ~~amusement~~ amusement or entertainment purposes for hire or reward, per year, \$ 5.00, or \$ 1.00 per day.

P.- Every proprietor of a bowling alley operated for hire or reward, \$ 5.00, per year for each alley.

Q.- Every proprietor of a shooting gallery or ball-throwing gallery, per year \$ 25.00.

R.- For each cigar stand, per year, \$ 15.00

S.- For each photograph gallery, per year \$ 10.00.

T.- Every proprietor of a stand or stands from which refreshments or goods of any kind, or both, are sold (except food, refreshments, or such other goods as are herein expressly designated), per year, \$ 150.00 for each stand. Every proprietor operating more than one stand located in the same building or elsewhere shall pay the license fee herein established for each stand.

U.- Every proprietor of a restaurant, eating house, lunch room, or place where soft drinks are sold (except stands where soft drinks are sold as well as other goods), per year, \$ 15.00.

V.- Every proprietor of a hotel, tavern or public lodging house, per year, \$ 25.00.

W.- For every baseball park or grounds where public base-ball games or contests are played and to which an admission fee is charged, per year, \$ 100.00.

X.- For every public base-ball game or contest to which an admission fee is charged (except for base-ball games conducted by the licensee or the lessee of the park or grounds mentioned in the above subdivision, per game, \$ 10.00.

Y.- For every football game or contest, for every public boxing or wrestling match or exhibition, for every race or other athletic contest or exhibition, for which an admission fee is charged, such license fee for each game, match or exhibition as shall be determined and fixed by the Council of the village for each of such game, match or exhibition.

Z.- Every circus, menagerie, museum, panorama, or show charging an admission fee, such sum per day as the council shall by resolution determine.

Al.- Every sideshow or entertainment operated and run in

Al.- Every sideshow or entertainment operated and run in connection with any circus, menagerie, museum, panorama or show mentioned in the above paragraph, such sum per day as the council shall by resolution determine.

Section 2. Definitions. The following explanatory notes and definitions are adopted and shall govern, so far as applicable, in the construction and application of the different parts or portions of the schedule contained in section 1 of this ordinance:

(1) The license fee provided for circusses, menageries, museums, panoramas and shows shall include a permit for one parade for each day of which such fee is paid, and if such circusses or shows are located outside the village limits such fee shall be paid as shall be fixed by the council for a permit to parade through the streets of the village. No permit or license shall be issued to any such circus, menagerie, museum, panorama or show, or to any side show or entertainment operated in connection therewith, until a good and sufficient bond, ~~and~~, in such amount as shall be fixed by the council, indemnifying the village for all damage done to public property and streets in the village, shall have been executed by the Proprietors and Managers of any such circusses, menageries, museums, panoramas or shows or side-shows and delivered to the village.

(2) A stand is a place near to or adjoining any building, side walk, alley, public place or highway, where articles of refreshment use, ornament, or necessity or otherwise, as distinguished from a permanent store building, so-called, are sold, and before any such stand shall be placed or erected a permit shall be first had from the council of said village for the erection of such building, and the application for such building permit shall be accompanied by the application for a license for any such proposed stand.

(3) A hotel, tavern or public lodging house is any house where persons are furnished with either board or lodging, or both, for a compensation to be paid therefor, and which is advertised by the proprietor or manager as a hotel, tavern or public lodging house. The same shall not include private boarding houses that do not advertise for or seek transient guests.

Section 3. Whenever the council may deem it advisable or necessary, it may fix and establish, by resolution, a blanket license to cover and include all theatres and other amusement concessions and stands and other occupations and businesses subjected herein to the payment of a license fee, located upon Ramona Park Grounds, so-called, in the village of East Grand Rapids, which said grounds or park is, for the purpose of this section, limited to that portion lying north of Wealthy Street; Provided, however, that such blanket license shall be granted for the theatres, concessions, stands, and other businesses in existence at the time such blanket license is issued, and any new occupation or business established upon said park grounds after the issuing of such blanket license shall be subject to the license fees hereinbefore established and fixed. Such blanket license fee shall be charged to and paid by the owners and proprietors of said Ramona Park Grounds, and when so fixed and established as herein provided, the provisions of this ordinance shall not apply to the owners, proprietors or operators of theatres, amusement concessions and stands included in this section. Failure to comply with the provisions of this section shall render the person, firm or corporation affected, or their officers and agents, subject to the punishment as in this ordinance provided.

Section 4. The schedule of license fees or charges established and fixed by section one of this ordinance may be changed by the council of said Village; Provided, however, that any such change or changes shall be made on or before the first day of May in each year and shall be made by written resolution.

Section 5. All applications for license under this ordinance shall be in writing and made to the council of said village, and the village clerk shall keep a record of all licenses granted and issued, which record shall show the date of issue, the nature and location of the business or occupation to be engaged in, and no license shall be issued until the license fee therefor is paid. Provided, however,

that the President or Clerk of said village shall be and they are here by authorized to issue licenses on application of persons desiring a license from day to day on the payment of the fee herein provided, where the period for which such license is applied for shall be for days between meetings of the village council.

Section 6. No license granted under the provisions of this ordinance shall be transferable or assignable without the consent of the council of said village.

Section 7. All annual licenses issued under the provisions of this ordinance shall expire on the 30th. day of April next thereafter, and the license fee herein provided for annual licenses shall be the same for any part or portion of such year; Provided, that upon special cause shown to the satisfaction of the council of said village, said Council may grant by resolution a deduction of a part of the annual license fee, but such deduction shall not be greater than the pro rata fee for the time during which the license has been in force.

Section 8. No person, firm or corporation, by themselves, or through their agents or employees, shall be authorized, under a single license, except as provided in section three of this ordinance, to carry on or engage in more than one place of business or amusement, or refreshment stand, or stand of any kind included in this ordinance, and if any person, firm or corporation shall establish more than one business stand or place of business or amusement upon such persons premises, or upon the premises of any other person or persons, than, for each and every of said place or places of business, occupation or trade, such person, firm or corporation shall be required to take out a separate license therefor and to pay the license fee and charge required by the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 9. Any license granted under the provisions of this ordinance may be revoked by the Council of said Village when the interest of said village may require such revocation. If any licensee hereunder shall at any time be convicted of a violation of this ordinance, the Council of said village, after giving five days notice to such licensee of its intention to declare forfeited, his, her, their or its license, and giving to said licensee an opportunity to show cause at the end of said five days why said license should not be revoked, may declare the same to be forfeited and without further force or effect. Every license issued under and by virtue of this ordinance shall have written or printed thereon that the same is granted and issued by said Council and accepted by the licensee upon the express condition that the same may be revoked by said Council under the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 10. All ordinances or parts of ordinances of the Village of East Grand Rapids inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 11. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars, nor more than one hundred dollars, and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment at hard labor in the common jail for the County of Kent, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom such conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days, or both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be imprisoned at hard labor in said jail until the payment of such fine and costs for a period not exceeding ninety days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect April 28, 1922.

Your committee has made a careful study of the Fire Department needs and recommends the purchase of a Reo Speedwagon chassis, our present equipment to be installed on said chassis. We believe at this time it would be unwise to spend a large amount of money for the Fire Department Service, and believe that the recommendations we are making will take care of the village needs for some years to come very nicely.

Your committee also finds that the Sinking Fund, which is raised each year for the retirement of bonds, has been used for other purposes, creating a deficit at this time of \$ 3,271.13, which must be raised this year. This money should not be used for no other purpose than for the retiring of bonds, for which the money is raised, and we recommend that this money be deposited and not used for any purpose except for the purpose for which it is raised.

Your committee would further recommend the purchase of the Village Hall and council rooms from the Water works department at the original price paid for same by the Waterworks Department

same to be paid for in installments of \$ 1000.00 per year. The money so paid to the Waterworks department shall be used to retire bonds. This will mean that instead of putting \$ 1000.00 in the Waterworks budget for the retiring of bonds, we put \$ 1000. in the General Fund for the purpose of buying the village hall, same to be used for the retiring of bonds, which does not increase or decrease the amount to be raised.

We further recommend that the various funds, when collected by the Village Treasurer, be credited in accordance with the attached schedule.

A N O R D I N A N C E

CREATING THE OFFICE OF HARBOR MASTER AND PRESCRIBING HIS POWERS AND DUTIES, AND FIXING HIS TERM OF OFFICE AND COMPENSATION, AND PROVIDING FOR HIS APPOINTMENT.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:-

Section 1. The office of harbor Master for the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, is hereby created, and the Council shall, on the second Monday in April in each year designate and appoint a resident of the Village having all the qualifications of an elector in said village as Harbor Master. The person so appointed as such Harbor Master shall take and file his oath of office within the same time after such appointment as is required by law for elective officers of the village, and he shall hold his office until the second Monday in April next after such appointment, and until his successor in office has qualified and entered upon the duties of his office, or until such time as he may be removed from his office for cause for failure to perform the duties of his office. Such office of Harbor Master shall be declared vacant if the appointee therefor shall fail to file his oath of office within the time herein required or if he shall cease to be a resident of the village during his term of office, and such vacancy shall be filled by the council as provided by law for other appointive officers of the village.

Section 2. It shall be the duty of such Harbor Master to enforce all ordinances and regulations as the Council may enact and prescribe in respect to, and over the navigable waters, harbors, wharves, docks and landings within the Village, and of the provisions of all existing ordinances of the village relating to such navigable waters, wharves, docks and landings, and boats, water crafts and other vessels navigating such waters; and such Harbor Master shall have the same power of making arrests for violations of such ordinances as he is required to enforce as is provided by law and the ordinances of this village for the Village Marshall.

Section 3. The Harbor Master shall receive such compensation as shall be fixed by the Council, which shall be payable at such time, either monthly, quarterly, semi-annually or annually, as shall be prescribed by the Council.

MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO JUMP ON, JUMP OFF, STAND UP IN, LEAN OUT OF, PUSH FORWARD, HOLDING OR STOOPING, OR ROCK, ANY OF THE CARS, CARRIAGES, BOATS, APPARATUSES, OR OTHER DEVICES IN THE OPERATION OF ANY OF THE FOLLOWING AMUSEMENT CONCESSIONS AND DEVICES SITUATED UPON RAMONA PARK GROUNDS, A PUBLIC PLACE, KNOWN AS THE "MERRY-GO-ROUND," THE MINIATURE RAILWAY, THE "WHIP", THE "GADABOUT", THE CIRCLE SWING", AND THE "MYSTIC CHUTES", SO-CALLED, WHILE IN MOTION:

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDINANCES:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to jump, on, or to jump off of, or to stand up in, or to lean out of, or to push forward, or to hold or stop, or to rock, any of the cars, carriages, boats, apparatuses, or other devices used in the operation of the following named amusement devices and concessions situated upon Ramona Park Grounds, a public place within the village, viz; The Merry-go-round, the Miniature Railway, The Whip, The Gadabout, the Circle Swing, and the Mystic Chutes, so-called, while any of said concessions and devices are being operated and while in motion.

Section 2. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than fifty dollars, and cost of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent at hard labor, in the discretion of the magistrate or court before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, but not to exceed a period of thirty days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect August 24th. 1922.

Dear Sir:

For some time the owners of the steamboats on Reeda Lake have been using the toilets on the Major Watson. I understand that last summer this was known to at least two of the village officials and still no action was taken, and if you will go aboard this boat yourself, you can plainly see, in spite of the paper with which the toilet is stuffed that they are still being used.

It is a crime and a shame that these men are allowed to pollute the water which the people of the village drink, and it should not only be stopped but the responsible parties should be made an example of.

I presume that you are no doubt unaware of this condition, and I feel it my duty to myself and the people who are drinking this water to call your attention to it. It is your duty Mr. Kenyon, as President of this Village, to cause the arrest and prosecution of these men, and I assure you that if you do, there are other people who know this, that will come forward, and there will be sufficient evidence to secure a conviction.

This is a matter that vitally affects every family in the village with one exception. It is a well known fact that the Poisson family never use the village water for drinking, during the summer, but carry their drinking water from a well or pump in the vicinity. Other people, however, relying on the village to protect them from just such an evil drink this polluted water daily, and have done so for years.

For the good of the community this thing should be stopped and the men responsible punished, and if some action is not taken, I will feel it my duty to write the state board of health and enclose a copy of this letter.

Among them is the extension of Greenwood Avenue, across the west part of my property from Lake Drive to San-Lu Rae Drive; thence, to Argentina Drive and Hall Street.

I am willing that Greenwood Avenue should be opened now and before such replat can be made, if agreeable to your Honorable Body. It would therefore be agreeable to me that you have a survey made of that proposed street by your engineer; and to stake and lay it out in order that when said replat is being made, that such street will be so located as to meet with your plans, as well as mine for the making of thoroughfare from Lake Drive to San-Lu-Rae Drive, and from thence to Franklin Street and Hall Street.

WITNESSETH:

1. That the village hereby retains and employs said second party as attorney for said village and to render all legal advice to the council and officers of said village relating to and affecting village matters, and to represent it in all matters which may be pending in any of the courts of this State brought by or against said village during the continuance of this contract; to draft all such ordinances and resolutions as shall be required by the council of said village; to examine all abstracts of title and all bonds; to prepare all contracts; to appear as counsel and prosecute in behalf of the village all violations of village ordinances pending in justice courts; to investigate all such matters and communications that may be referred to him by the council of said village, and to render all and singular all such legal services as said village by its council, acting officially, may require.

2. This contract shall be in full force and effect for the period beginning May 1, 1922, and ending May 1, 1923.

3. For the above services the said village hereby agrees to pay said attorney the sum of One Thousand Dollars per annum, payable monthly at the rate of \$ 83.33 per month on the first Monday in the month following, together with the actual and necessary expenses said attorney may pay out or incur on behalf of said village. It being expressly understood however, that said attorney shall receive additional compensation, and said village shall pay such additional compensation, at the rate of Twenty five dollars per day for actual time given by such attorney in the trial of cases in the circuit courts or higher courts wherein said village is a party, and at the rate of twenty dollars per day for time actually rendered in preparing for the trial of such circuit court cases and for examining questions of law involved and preparing briefs in all such cases. For all service rendered by said attorney outside of the territorial limits of Kent County, said village agrees to pay said attorney additional compensation of Twenty dollars per day for each day or fraction thereof so engaged including time necessarily spent in going to and coming from such distant places.

4. Said attorney hereby accepts said employment and hereby agrees to render the services as legal adviser and attorney hereinbefore set out on the terms, conditions and agreements herein stated.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:-

Section 1. That hereafter any excavation that is made by any person, firm or corporation, in any of the public streets, avenues or other public highway, within the village, that are paved with brick, concrete, or other permanent material, shall be refilled with sand and tamped or flushed with water, under the supervision of the Street Commissioner or other proper officer of the Village of East Grand Rapids, and the pavement replaced with the same material with which any such street, avenue or other public highway is then paved, and any such street or highway shall be left in the same condition as it was before such pavement was torn up for any such excavation, and any surplus dirt taken away as directed by such street commissioner; and in no case shall any pavement in any of the public streets or highways of said village be torn up without a permit therefore having first been obtained from said Street Commissioner.

Section 2. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars not more than one hundred dollars or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom such conviction may be had, and in the event that only a fine shall be imposed and upon the failure of the offender to pay such fine, he may be sentenced by such court or magistrate to said common jail until such fine and the cost of prosecution shall have been paid, but for no longer period than ninety days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect December 31st. 1922.
