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 The ordinance Committee presented the following ordinance governing the conduct of poolrooms in the Village for consideration:

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE REGULATION OF PUBLIC POOL AND BILLIARD ROOMS, AND FOR THE LICENSING OF SAME.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:-

Section 1. No public billiard or pool room shall be operated in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, without first complying with the requirements of this ordinance.

Section 2. Any person desiring to engage in the business of conducting and operating any public billiard or pool room shall file with the village clerk a written application addressed to the Council of this Village, for a permit and license to carry on such business, which application shall state the name and address of the owner or owners of such proposed billiard or pool room, the location of the building in which such business is to be conducted, and which application shall be signed by two-thirds of the freeholders residing within three hundred feet of the building in which such business is proposed to be carried on, and also by not less than ten other freeholders residing in the village. Such application shall be accompanied by a bond in the sum of Five Hundred dollars, with two or more sureties, who shall be owners of real estate in the Village of East Grand Rapids, or by a reputable surety company, conditioning that the applicant as principal shall conduct and operate said business in strict compliance with the laws of the State of Michigan and the ordinances of this village relating thereto, and such application shall also be accompanied by the annual license fee which shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each billiard or pool table, and such application shall also contain a provision that the applicant agrees to a revocation of such aforesaid license before its expiration for any of the causes hereinafter mentioned.

Section 3. No license to operate a billiard or pool room in the Village of East Grand Rapids shall be issued or granted by the Village Council until all requirements provided for in section two of this ordinance have been complied with, and no license shall be issued for a longer period than one year and not longer than the first day of May in each year. Provided, that no license shall be issued to any person who is not a citizen of the United States, nor to a person not a resident of the village, nor to a person who is under legal age.

Section 4. It shall be unlawful for any owner or proprietor of any public billiard or pool room, either by himself, his agent or employe, to permit any minor child under the age of seventeen years, nor any minor who is a student in any public, private or parochial school, to remain in such public billiard or pool room, and any proprietor who shall, either by himself or his agent or employe, permit any such minor child or minor student to remain in any such place shall, in addition to the penalties hereinafter provided for, have his license to operate such billiard or pool room revoked, and any person who shall encourage or induce in any way such minor child or minor student to enter such billiard or pool room or to remain therein shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and liable to punishment as hereinafter provided.

Section 5. The Village Council shall have the right to revoke any license once granted, when it shall appear to their satisfaction that any such public billiard or pool room is being conducted in such manner as to be inimicable to public morals.

Section 6. All public billiard or pool rooms in the Village of East Grand Rapids shall be closed on each and every night from and after the hour of eleven-thirty o'clock until six o'clock of the morning of the succeeding day, and on all other days when such places are required to be closed by the laws of the State of Michigan.

Section 7. Any violation of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars, and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment at hard labor in the common jail of the county of Kent, in the discretion of the court of magistrate before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days, nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; and in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and not

costs, the offender may be imprisoned at hard labor in the common jail of the county of Kent, until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period of not exceeding ninety days; and in case any proprietor or owner of any duly licensed public billiard or pool room is convicted for a violation of this ordinance, then such conviction shall, in addition to the punishment herein provided, amount to a forfeiture of such license.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect February 10, 1921.

East Grand Rapids, Michigan.

To the Honorable  
The President and Council  
of East Grand Rapids.

Gentlemen:-

We, the undersigned, being all the owners of lands and  
premises abutting upon either side of Barnard Street, from Lovett  
Avenue to Lakeside Drive, and upon Huber Avenue, from Barnard  
Street to Greenwood Avenue, respectfully petition your Honorable  
Body to vacate, discontinue and abolish the above named streets  
within the limits above described, and in consideration that this  
request be granted, the undersigned agree as follows:

1. That Clara Huber, widow, will convey by warrenty deed  
to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, all that part of  
Lot Numbered Twenty-four (24) of Boynton and Judd's Lake Addition  
to the City of Grand Rapids, Michigan, lying west of the east line  
of Lovett Avenue as extended northerly across said lands to the  
southerly line of Greenwood Avenue, and also a small strip of  
land not exceeding twenty feet (20) in width off the northerly  
side of said Lot numbered Twenty-four (24) of said Boynton and  
Judd's Lake Addition, commeneing from the intersection of Barnard  
Street and Greenwood Avenue and running thence easterly to a point  
twenty feet east of the present east line of Huber Avenue, all said  
lands to be used for street purposes, and also excepting therefrom  
any buildings or dwelling houses now upon said premises and  
reserving the right to remove any such dwelling houses within one  
year from the date hereof.

2. The undersigned further agree and consent that if their  
petition is granted, the village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan,  
is to have and reserve the right and title in and to all water  
mains, sanitary and storm water sewers and laterals now in said  
streets, with the right to enter such premises at any time for the  
purpose of repairing and preserving said property, and also that  
no buildings or other obstructions shall be erected or placed over  
said water mains and sewers that will interfere with or prevent  
access thereto for the purpose of making repairs to said property.

The following resolution was then offered by Trustee O'Keefe:-

WHEREAS, All the owners of lands and premises abutting upon either side of Barnard Street, from Lakeside Drive to Lovett Avenue and upon Huber Avenue, from Barnard Street to Greenwood Avenue and Lakeside Drive, public streets in the Village of East Grand Rapids, have requested this Council by a petition in writing and signed by all of said owners, to vacate, discontinue and abolish said streets as public highways, and

WHEREAS, The owners of that part of Lot Number Twenty-four (24) of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition to the City of Grand Rapids, Michigan, lying westerly of said Huber Avenue, have offered and agree to convey by warrenty deed all that part of aforesaid lot Number Twenty four (24) of said Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition lying westerly of a line extending the east line of said Lovett Avenue across said lands to the southerly line of said Greenwood Avenue, said lands to be used for a public street and an extension of said Lovett Avenue, and also to convey a strip of land not exceeding twenty feet in width off the northerly side of said Lot twenty-four of Boynton & Judd's Lake Addition, from the intersection of said Greenwood Avenue with said east line of Lovett Avenue as said line extended, easterly to a point twenty feet east of the present east line of said Huber Avenue, for the purpose of widening said Greenwood Avenue, and

WHEREAS, A committee of this council has personally examined the premises and streets to be vacated and the location of the new street and strip of land for widening Greenwood Avenue, and have recommended to this council that the proposed alterations of the streets aforesaid would, in their judgment, be an improvement over the present conditions, and that it is advisable to make the change in said streets as proposed, and to vacate said Barnard Street and Huber Avenue as requested in said petition, and to accept warrenty deed as above set forth, Now therefore be it

RESOLVED, By this Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, that it deems it advisable, and that it is advisable, to vacate, discontinue and abolish the following named public streets of this Village, to-wit: Barnard Street, from the west line of Lakeside Drive to the east line of Lovett Avenue, and Huber Avenue, from the southerly line of Greenwood Avenue and Lakeside Drive to the northerly line of Barnard Street, so-called, and that this Council deems the closing and vacating of said streets to be necessary for the public convenience and a public improvement; and be it further

RESOLVED, That this Council meet on Monday, February 28, 1921, at eight o'clock P.M., at the council Room in said Village, to hear and consider any and all objections thereto by any person interested, why said streets should not be vacated, discontinued and abolished, and it is

ORDERED, That the village Clerk give written or printed notice of the time and place when and where the Council will meet to hear and consider objections to the vacating of said Barnard Street and Huber Avenue, by any person interested therein and desiring to be heard, by posting notices in three public places in said Village at least four weeks previous to said meeting, one of which said notice shall be posted at the intersection of Huber Avenue and Barnard Street, and also by mailing a copy of said notice to each of the owners of lands and premises abutting upon said streets, which said notice shall contain a full and true copy of this resolution.

Trustee O'Keefe moved the adoption of the resolution.

Trustee Tinkler amended the motion by adding that the Clerk be instructed to mail a copy of this resolution with a letter of explanation to all the resident property owners in the Village. The amendment was supported by Trustee Huber.

Prange and Olga Prange, to be used for public street purposes, be and the same is hereby accepted, and that the Village Clerk be and he is hereby directed to cause said warranty deed to be recorded in the office of the Kent County register of Deeds without delay. and it is further

ORDERED, that the Village Clerk record this resolution in the book of street records.

1. That continuing said Barnard Street as a public highway is not longer necessary for the public convenience.
2. That closing said street would not inconvenience the residents of said village living in the vicinity thereof and who would be more directly effected by such closing, ninety-five percent of whom have signed this petition.
3. That continuing said street as a highway would necessitate in the near future the improvement of said street at a large cost in taxes to the Village at large.

The Ordinance Committee reported the following ordinance:

A N O R D I N A N C E

TO PROHIBIT AND PREVENT OBSTRUCTIONS AND INCUMBRANCES IN AND UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, LANES, ALLEYS AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS, AND TO ABATE AND REMOVE THE SAME.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS:-

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to place, or cause to be placed, or keep or suffer to remain, any lumber, stone, gravel, sand, dirt, or other material or article, in any public street, lane or alley, or on any sidewalk or other public place in the said village, so as to impede, discommode or obstruct the free use and passage over the entire width thereof, or to construct or make any openings in any such sidewalk, or to construct or make, or cause to be constructed or made, any vault, structure, or excavations under any such sidewalks, without first obtaining the written permission of the village council therefor; PROVIDED, that this section shall not apply to shade trees planted in the space upon any such street, lane or alley, between the curb or gutter and the sidewalk thereof.

Section 2. No person, firm or corporation shall place, or cause to be placed, any goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles upon any part or portion of the public streets, alleys or sidewalks in front of and adjacent to any store, shop, stand, or other building in said village for the purpose of barter and sale, and neither shall any person, firm or corporation place, erect, maintain, or cause to be placed, erected or maintained, any counter, showcase, or other device used for the purpose of sale of merchandise or any other article, upon any part or portion of the public street, alley or sidewalk in front of his or their store, shop, stand or other place of business.

Section 3. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, to construct, erect, provide or maintain, any store, shop, stand, or other building bordering and immediately adjacent to the line of any public street, alley or other public place in said village, with an open window or counter, through or over which goods, wares, merchandise or other articles are bartered and sold or offered for sale, from within such building to customers standing upon any portion of the sidewalk in front of such building, and all stores, shops, stands, or other buildings so constructed and equiped with open windows or counters so that customers trading thereat are required to stand upon the sidewalk in front thereof, shall be so erected and placed that no portion or part of such building, or such window or counter when open, shall be nearer than four feet to the street line in front of and adjacent to such store, shop, stand or other building. PROVIDED, That a roof or other overhead cover, to be constructed of wood or other equally strong material, may be erected over the space between the front of any such building and the street line, and every such roof or other overhead cover, shall either be securely fastened to the front of such building, or be supported by a sufficient number of wooden or iron posts.

Section 4. All owners or occupants of premises and other having and maintaining in front of or adjoining their respective premises on any such public street, alley or other public place, any such obstructions or incumbrances mentioned in section one and two of this ordinance, and all persons placing or causing to be placed any such obstructions or incumbrances in any of such public streets, alleys or other public places, are hereby required to remove the same forthwith after being notified so to do by the Marshall of said village, or as directed by the village council; and if such owner or occupant shall not, within the time specified in such notice, remove such obstruction or incumbrance, it shall be the duty of such Marshall to remove the same after the expiration of the time specified in said notice, and such owner or occupant shall, in addition to the punishment hereinafter provided, be liable to the costs and expenses incurred by said village by such removal, to be recovered in a suit at law.

Section 5. All stores, shops, stands or other buildings erected alongside of and adjacent to the street line of any public street, alley or other public place, and equipped with open windows or counters through or over which goods, wares, merchandise, or other articles are sold, or offered for sale, and which require customers trading thereat to stand upon the sidewalk in front of such premises, are hereby declared to be a public nuisance; and all owners or occupants of premises and others having or maintaining such open windows or counters are hereby required to remove the same or to permanently enclose such building or stand within twenty days after being notified so to do by the Marshall of said village, and it shall be the duty of said Marshall to abate and remove the same after the expiration of said twenty days at the expense of the owner or occupant of such store, shop, stand, or other building.

Section 6. Any person or persons violating any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, shall, on conviction thereof, be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars nor more than one hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail of Kent County in the discretion of the magistrate or court before whom the conviction may be had, for a period of not less than five days nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, and in case such magistrate or court shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, but not to exceed a period of ninety days.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect April 28, 1921.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDINANCE:-

RESOLVED, that the expense of said improvement, including the cost of said map, plat, diagram, estimates, and the surveys, plans and assessments incident thereto, be, and the same is, estimated at the sum of Twenty-Nine Hundred (\$2900.00) dollars; that one-half of the cost of said improvement be assessed upon and against the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land lying within said special assessment district as shown by said map, plat and diagram according to foot frontage, and that the amount so assessed against each lot and parcel of land be paid in five annual installments with interest upon the deferred installments at the rate of six percent per annum, and that one-half of the cost of said improvement be paid from the general highway fund to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in said village of East Grand Rapids, said tax to be divided into five parts and to be collected annually for five years, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Board of Assessors be, and they are hereby directed to assess and levy the one-half part of the estimated cost of said improvement upon the lots, parts of lots and parcels of land and premises within said special assessment district as shown by said map, plat and diagram, according to foot frontage; and that said Board of Assessors be and they are hereby directed to make and prepare a special assessment roll of all of said lands and premises within said special assessment district, said roll to be in five parts, and the amounts so to be assessed shall be divided into five equal parts, one part to be collected in the current year, to-wit 1921, and one of said parts to be collected annually thereafter, until the whole is collected; and if from the shape or size of any such lot an assessment thereon in proportion to its frontage would be unjust and disproportionate to the assessments upon other lots, said Board shall assess such lot for such number of feet frontage as the Board deems to be equitable; and it is

ORDERED, That the Board of Assessors apportion against the Village of East Grand Rapids one-half of the cost of said improvement to be paid from the general highway funds and to be raised by tax upon all taxable property in the village in five annual installments, and that said Board report said special assessment roll to this council at its next regular meeting.

NOW THEREFORE, Be It RESOLVED, that the assessment rolls returned by the Board of Assessors be filed in the office of the Village Clerk and marked "Locust Avenue Paving District No. 2, Special Assessment Roll," and that the same be numbered by said Clerk, and that Tuesday the 5th. day of July, 1921, at 8 o'clock P.M. be, and the same hereby is, designated as the time and the Council room of this Village as the place respectively, when and where the Council and the Board of Assessors will meet to review the assessment, and to hear any objections thereto or appeals therefrom, and it is

ORDERED, That the Village Clerk give notice of the filing of said rolls with the Clerk and designating the time and place, when and where the Council and the Board of Assessors will meet to review the assessment and to hear any objections thereto and appeals therefrom, by posting notices in three public places in said village at least two weeks previous to said meeting.

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The Ordinance Committee presented the following ordinance:

A N O R D I N A N C E

RELATIVE TO THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A FIRE DEPARTMENT, AND FOR THE EXTINGUISHMENT AND PREVENTION OF FIRES IN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:

Section 1. The President, by and with the consent of the Council, shall appoint, from among the electors of said village, a chief of the fire department on the second Monday of April in each year, who shall hold office until the second Monday in April next following, and until his successor qualifies and enters upon the duties of his office. Any vacancy occurring ~~durxng~~ in the office of chief of the fire department shall be filled by the President, by and with the consent of the Council.

Section 2. All the powers and duties connected with and incident to the government and discipline of the fire department of said village shall be, as hereinafter provided, vested in and exercised by the chief of the fire department, subject to the direction of the President and the regulations of the Village Council.

Section 3. The Chief of the fire department shall have the supervision and direction of the department, and the custody, care and general management and superintendence of all engine houses, fire engines and apparatus, hooks, ladders, hose, implements, tools, bells, fire alarm apparatus, public cisterns, wells and water tanks, hydrants and all other property of said village of whatever nature connected with the management of the fire department, and it shall be his duty to keep the same in good order and ready for instant use and service at all times, and to make detailed and particular reports of the state of the department the conduct of the members thereof, and such other matters as may be required, to the Council on the first ~~day~~ Monday in March in each year and at such other times as directed by the Council. He shall also furnish a satisfactory bond to said Village in such sum and at such time as the Council may direct.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the chief to see that all rules and regulations of the Village Council and all provisions of ordinances relating to the fire department and to the prevention and extinguishment of fires, and all the provisions of the general laws of the State relating thereto, are duly executed and enforced, and he may at all times call upon and direct the village marshal to enforce the same.

Section 5. Said chief shall, by and with the advise of the Village Council, prescribe the duties of the members of the fire department at fires and he is vested with power to preserve property from being stolen thereat, and to extinguish and prevent fires; and the chief, or other officer acting as such, may command any person present at a fire to aid and assist in the protection of property thereat, and of any person shall wilfully disobey any such lawful command and requirement or other lawful order of any such officer, he shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

Section 6. The fire-chief appointed as above provided, shall also perform the duties of fire warden, and as such fire warden it shall be his duty at any time when he shall deem it advisable, between sunrise and sunset, to enter into any house or building, lots, yards or premises, steamboats and water crafts, in said Village and examine the stoves, furnaces, heating apparatus and fire places, and also all places where any gun powder, oils, hay, straw, shavings, gasoline, or other combustible or explosive material may be kept, and shall give such directions with respect to the several foregoing matters as he may deem expedient, either as to the removal and alteration, or better care and management thereof, which direction shall be obeyed and complied with by the persons directed so to do, and at their expense; and if any person shall neglect or refuse so to comply with any such directions as such fire warden shall give in the premises, such person so offending shall for every such neglect or refusal be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

Section 7. Whenever, in the opinion of the President, or any two Trustees of the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids, the Village is in immediate danger from fire, the President or any two members of the Council, may make such orders and adopt such measures and regulations as in their judgment they may deem best to prevent such fire, arrest its progress and secure the safety of the Village therefrom, and for that purpose may direct the chief in charge of the department at any fires, to cause any building to be pulled down or destroyed.

Section 8. The members of the fire department shall be limited ~~is~~ in number to sixteen in addition to the chief of the fire department, and they shall be appointed by the chief with the advise and consent of the Council. A less number may be appointed in the discretion of the Council. The chief of the fire department shall receive an annual salary of Twenty-five

dollars to be paid semi-annually, and an additional sum of three dollars for each and every fire which he attends. The firemen and members shall receive as compensation the sum of three dollars for each and every fire which they attend, but not less than Ten dollars for each year to be paid semi-annually. All compensation due members of the fire department for actual attendance at fires shall be paid at the first regular meeting of the Council in the month following the date on which such compensation was earned. The fire department shall hold not less than eighteen practice and instruction drills in each year, of not less than one hour duration, and at least one such drill shall be held in each month. Any fireman or member of the fire department neglecting or refusing to answer any alarm of fire without having a good and reasonable excuse therefor, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be liable to the penalty hereinafter prescribed.

Section 9. Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars not more than One hundred dollars and costs of prosecutions, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent for a period not exceeding ninety days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had; in case such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and costs, the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, but no longer than ninety days.

Section 10. All ordinances or part of ordinances inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect July 26, 1921.

Whereas, said Council and said Board of Assessors after due notice met together and sat in session for the purpose of hearing appeals from and objections to said assessment rolls and no appeals therefrom or objections thereto being presented, it is

Resolved By This Council that the special assessment rolls for the construction of a concrete pavement in Locust Avenue, from the South line of Sherman Street to the Northernly line of Lake Drive be, and the same hereby are, ratified and confirmed; that the assessment so made in said special assessment rolls be collected and that the Village Clerk be instructed to prepare and deliver certified copies of such special assessment rolls to the Village Treasurer and to attach his warrant to said certified copies, commanding the Village Treasurer to collect from each of the persons assessed in said rolls the amount of money assessed and set opposite his or her name therein, one-fifth of which shall be collected during the current year and one-fifth thereof shall be collected annually thereafter until the whole is collected

with interest upon all deferred payments at the rate of six percent per annum, and deposit all sums so collected upon said rolls to the credit of the Locust Avenue Paving District No. 2 fund as soon as collected,

## RESOLUTION BY TRUSTEE HUEBNER:

WHEREAS, The Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, has heretofore caused to be made, plans, and specifications and an estimate of the cost of constructing a concrete pavement in Locust Avenue, a public street in said village, from the south line of Sherman Street to the north line of Lake Drive, and said expense having been estimated at the sum of \$ 2900.00; and

WHEREAS the said Council has heretofore established a special assessment district of the lands and premises abutting upon either side of said Locust Avenue, from which assessed district shall be collected a sum sufficient to pay one half of said estimated cost, said district to be known as Locust Avenue Paving District No. 2, and has determined that the amounts so assessed against each lot and parcel of land be divided into five parts, one to be collected in the current year and one part to be collected annually thereafter until the whole shall be collected with interest upon all deferred payments, and has determined to raise the amount necessary to pay the one half part of said estimated cost over and above the installment payable in the current year, by loan on the faith and credit of said Village, to be paid out of said unpaid special assessment when collected, and said special assessment rolls having been returned to this Council and with due notice of appeals therefrom and objections thereto having been heard and said rolls having been duly ratified and confirmed on the fifth day of July, 1921, and said special assessments ordered levied and collected; and

WHEREAS, said Council did heretofore also determine that one half of the estimated cost of said improvement shall be paid out of the general highway funds of said village, one-fifth of which sum shall be collected ~~annually~~ during the current year and one-fifth thereof shall be collected annually thereafter until the full amount is collected, and to raise the amount necessary to pay the said one half part of said estimated cost over and above the amount collected during the current year, by a loan on the faith and credit of said village, such loan to be paid out of the general highway fund, now therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Council of the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, for the purpose of constructing a concrete pavement in said Locust Avenue, from the north line of Lake Drive to the south line of Sherman Street, one half of the cost of which is to be paid by said assessment on the lands and premises in Locust Avenue Paving District No. 2, and one half of which is to be paid out of the general highway fund of said village, which said assessments and the payments from the general highway fund are to be divided into five parts, one part of which is to be collected during the current year and one fifth part of be collected annually thereafter until the full amount is collected, and for the purpose of borrowing sufficient money to pay for said improvement over and above the amount collected during the current year from said special assessment district and from the general highway fund, there shall be issued negotiable coupon bonds of the village of East Grand Rapids in the total of \$ 1160.00 to be paid out of the special assessments levied against the lands and premises in said Locust Avenue Paving District No. 2, when the same are collected; and that there be issued similar coupon bonds of the village of East Grand Rapids in the total amount of \$ 1160.00 to be paid from the general highway fund, to be raised by tax upon all the property in the village, when the same is collected, one fourth of said bonds to be made payable and to mature in the year 1922, and one fourth of said bonds to be made payable annually thereafter in 1923, 1924 and 1925 respectively; and be it further

As secretary of the West End Welfare Association I have been asked to secure information concerning fire protection in the Village. Some time ago cards were placed in the homes by the village fire department with printed instructions about calling

the village and city fire departments. From these instructions one would naturally conclude that the residents of the village had a perfect right to call the city fire department in case of an important fire and could expect immediate response to their call.

Our attention was called to the case of a Mrs. Ainsley who called the city fire department when her neighbors house was burning and was told that they could not respond without an O.K. from the village fire chief. It is hardly necessary to say that every one would consider a fire in his home an important one and yet we are told that we cannot have the more efficient service of the city department without first getting an O.K. from a single individual who may not be within reach of a phone, and when minutes may mean ~~dollars~~ dollars.

It is the wish of the Association to know just what the arrangement is with the city, if there is one, and if not to have the assurance that the Council will make some such arrangement as soon as possible in order to relieve the home owners of the present fire hazard.

TO REGULATE THE SPEED AND OPERATION OF MOTOR VEHICLES UPON THE PUBLIC STREETS, AVENUES, DRIVES, LANES, ALLEYS, BRIDGES AND OTHER PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS AS FOLLOWS;-

Section 1. RATE OF SPEED. No person shall operate, propel or drive any automobile, autocar, motor truck, motor cycle or other similar motor vehicle, except such motor vehicles that run only on rails or tracks, at a rate of speed greater than fifteen miles an hour upon any public street, avenue, drive, lane, alley, bridge, or other public place in any business portion within the corporate limits of the village of East Grand Rapids, which such business portion shall, for the purposes of this ordinance, be deemed to include the following named public streets and highways within this village, viz: Lakeside Drive, from Lake Drive to Greenwood Avenue; and Wealthy Street, from Lakeside Drive to Sherman Street. And no such motor vehicle shall be operated, propelled or driven upon and along any other public street, avenue, drive, lane, alley, bridge or other public place or way within the corporate limits of this village at a rate of speed greater than twenty miles an hour.

Section 2. LAMPS. Every automobile, motor truck, motor cycle, or other motor vehicle, except such motor vehicles as run only on rails or tracks, operated and driven upon any of the public streets, avenues, drives, lanes, alleys, bridges or other public places or ways within the corporate limits of the village of East Grand Rapids shall, during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, be equipped with and display a lamp or lamps as hereinafter provided:

(a) "FRONT LAMPS". Every motor vehicles, except motor cycles and motor vehicles as run only on rails or tracks, shall have a lamp mounted on each side of the front thereof, said lamps to be of approximately equal candle power and, when lighted, to show a white lights focusing in the direction in which such vehicle is proceeding; and every motor cycle shall have one lamp mounted on the front thereof which shall, when lighted, display a white light focusing in the direction in which such motor cycle is proceeding. Every such automobile, motor cycle or other motor vehicle shall, during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, keep such front lamps lighted continuously while the vehicle bearing them is in motion, except when the driver thereof may temporarily dim or extinguish them for the convenience of the driver of some approaching vehicle; but in such case the driver of an automobile or motor truck shall not extinguish them completely unless his machine is also provided with two identical lamps of lesser brightness symmetrically placed on each side, both of which shall, during the period of one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, be lighted continuously while the vehicle bearing them is in motion whenever such front lamps are not lighted.

(b) "REAR LAMPS". Every automobile, motor cycle, motor truck, trailer, or semi-trailer, or other motor vehicle, except motor vehicles as run only on rails or tracks, when upon any of the public streets, avenues, drives, lanes, alleys, bridges, or other public places or ways in the village of East Grand Rapids at night, shall have on the rear thereof one lamp capable of displaying a light which shall be red and be visible for a distance of at least one hundred feet behind such vehicle.

(c) "SPOT-LIGHTS." If any spot-light shall be carried and displayed on any such motor vehicle the same shall be so placed and used that the light therefrom shall be focused on the right hand side of the street or other highway, not more than two hundred feet in front of such vehicle.

(d) "PARKED WITH LIGHTS". All automobiles, autocars, motor trucks, motor cycles, or other motor vehicles parked upon any public street, avenue, drive, lane, alley, bridge, or other public place or way within the corporate limits of the village of East Grand Rapids, or permitted to stand thereon at any time during the period from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise shall have displayed thereon at least one lighted lamp on the front left hand side, which shall show a white light, and one lamp in rear of such vehicle displaying a red light as herein provided.

Section 3. DIMMERS. It shall be unlawful for any person operating any automobile, autocar, motor truck, motor cycle or other motor vehicle upon any of the streets or public highways within the corporate limits of the village of East Grand Rapids during the period of one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise, unless the front lamps upon such motor vehicle shall be provided and equipped with some practical and efficient device or devices whereby the forward light or lights of such vehicle may be dimmed or lessened at the will of the driver to such an extent that such lamps or the reflection therefrom, when lighted, will not interfere with the sight of nor temporarily blind the vision of the driver of an approaching vehicle; and it shall be the duty of every driver of every such motor vehicle equipped with dimming devices as herein provided for and using such light of lights upon any of the public streets or highways in this village, to effectually apply such dimmer to the front light or lights of the vehicle being driven by him and cause such light or lights to be dimmed and lessened so as not to interfere with the vision or temporarily blind the vision of the driver of any approaching vehicle.

Section 4. "OPERATING MOTOR VEHICLES WHILE INTOXICATED". It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to operate or drive any automobile, autocar, motor truck, motor cycle, or other motor vehicle upon any of the ~~sixties~~ public streets, avenues, drives, lanes, alleys, bridges or other public places or ways within the corporate limits of the village of East Grand Rapids, while intoxicated or under the influence of intoxicating liquor or liquors.

SECTION 5. Any person who shall violate any of the provisions or requirements of this ordinance, on conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not less than five dollars and not to exceed One hundred dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent for a period of not less than ten days nor more than ninety days, or by both such fine or imprisonment, in the discretion of the court or magistrate before whom the conviction may be had; if such court or magistrate shall only impose a fine and the costs of prosecution and such fine and costs is not paid, then the offender may be sentenced to be imprisoned in the common jail of Kent County until the payment of such fine and costs, for a period not exceeding ninety days.

Section 6. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with or conflicting with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect January 10th. 1922.
