R E S O L U T I O N S .

RESOLUTION BY TRUSTEE AVERY.

WHEREAS, This Council is informed and believes that it is proposed to establish a cemetery upon the East One-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the Southeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) and the East One-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the West One-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) of the Southeast Quarter ($\frac{1}{4}$) of Section Twenty-Seven (27) of Township Seven (7) North of Range Eleven (11) West, same being in Grand Rapids Township, in the County of Kent and State of Michigan, which lands adjoin the North Village boundary line and is within one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile of Reed's Lake, so-called, from which waters drain in part, by surface flow and seepage into said Reed's Lake; and

WHEREAS, the water supply of this Village and its inhabitants is drawn from said Reeds Lake and such water is used by the inhabitants of this Village for drinking purposes; and

WHEREAS the establishment of a cemetery upon the premises aforesaid, will, as we are informed and believe, contaminate the water supply of this Village and render the same forever unfit for drinking purposes, and will, in any event, interfere with the use of said water by the inhabitants of this Village and the sale thereof by the Village, by reason of the gruesome suggestion occasioned by the burial of bodies in close proximity to the source of said water

supply and by reason of the drainage and seepage from said cemetery into Reed's Lake, and

WHEREAS, the establishment of a cemetery upon the premises aforesaid will impede the growth of the Village and endanger the health of the people living in the immediate vicinity thereof, and

WHEREAS this Council is also advised and believes that certain members of the Board of Health of the Township of Grand Rapids have expressed their intention to approve the establishment of said cemetery in the location aforesaid, now therefore be it

RESOLVED that the establishment of a cemetery at the location and upon the premises aforesaid is a matter of vital importance to this Village and its inhabitants; that said cemetery, if established as aforesaid, would be a menace to the health, life, comfort, well being and happiness of the inhabitants of this Village and an injury to the owners of property therein. That this Council do, and hereby does protest against the establishment of said cemetery at the location and upon the premises aforesaid and against the approval of any plat thereof, or of the granting any license or permit to any one for that purpose. And be it further

RESOLVED that this Council take such action by way of injunction or other legal proceedings and in other ways, as shall be best calculated, to prevent the establishment of said cemetery as aforesaid and that the President of this Board be and he hereby is authorized, directed and empowered to cause a copy of this resolution to be delivered to said Board of Health of the Township of Grand Rapids and to take such other and further steps by way of proceedings in the Courts or otherwise, as he may be advised, will be best calculated to prevent the establishment of said cemetery upon the premises aforesaid.

AN ORDINANCE

MAKING IT UNLAWFUL TO KNOWINGLY AND WILFULLY RAISE A FALSE ALARM OF FIRE AT ANY PUBLIC GATHERING OR IN ANY PUBLIC PLACE, OR TO RING ANY BELL OR OPERATE ANY MECHANICAL APPARATUS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CREATING A FALSE ALARM OF FIRE, AND TO PROVIDE A PUNISHMENT THEREFOR.

THE VILLAGE OF EAST GRAND RAPIDS ORDAINS:-

Section 1. Any person or persons who shall knowingly and wilfully raise a false alarm of fire at any public gathering or in any public place, or who shall, for the purpose of creating a false alarm of fire, ring any bell or operate any mechanical apparatus, siren or other device installed and maintained by the Village for sounding alarms of fire, or shall ring any other bell or operate any other mechanical apparatus or device for the purpose of creating a false alarm of fire, shall upon conviction of such offence be punished by a fine of not exceeding fifty dollars and costs of prosecution, or by imprisonment in the common jail for the County of Kent for a period of not exceeding thirty days, or by both such fine and imprisonment, in the discretion of the court of magistrate before whom the conviction may be had.

This ordinance is ordered to take effect December 31, 1920.

Trustee Tinkler moved the adoption of the ordinance. Supported by Trustee Zipp.

RESOLUTION BY TRUSTEE HUEBNER:

WHEREAS, Ernest A. Prange, of the Village of East Grand Rapids Michigan, has heretofore presented his petition to this Council requesting it to vacate, discontinue and abolish Beechwood Lane, a public street in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, and from which said petition it appears that the petitioner and his wife are the owners in fee simple of the lands and premises abutting upon the eastern side of said street for its entire length, and that they have acquired the rights, title and interest of the owners of the lands and premises abutting upon the west side of said street in and to the fee in the lands in said Beechwood Lane as abutting property owners, and

WHEREAS, the said petitioner and his wife have signed and executed a warranty deed to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, of the East twenty-four (24) feet of Lot Number Forty-four (44) of "Woodcliff Park Addition" to the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, to be used for street and highway purposes in the place and stead of said Beechwood Lane, and

WHEREAS, said Beechwood Lane as now laid out runs between Lots numbered Thirty Eight (38) and Thirty Nine (39) of said Woodcliff Park Addition on the west, and Lots numbered Forty two (42) and Forty four (44) of said Addition, on the east, and is Twenty-four (24) feet wide and extends from Mary Avenue to Reeds Lake Boulevard, so-called, and a committee from this Council having personally examined the premises and street to be vacated and the location of the new street, and have recommended to this Council

that it is advisable to vacate said Beechwood Lane and to accept said new street, therefore be it

RESOLVED, By this Council that it deems it advisable, and that it is advisable, to vacate, discontinue and abolish Beechwood Lane, a public street in the Village of East Grand Rapids, Michigan, from the North line of Mary Avenue to the south line of Reeds Lake Boulevard, so-called, and that this Council deems the closing and vacating of said street to be necessary for the public convenience and a public improvement; and be it further

RESOLVED, that this Council meet on Monday, the 7th. day of February, 1921, at eight o'clock P.M., at the Council Room in said Village, to hear and consider any and all objections thereto why said street should not be vacated, discontinued and abolished, and it is

ORDERED, That the village Clerk give written or printed notice of the time and place when and where the Council will meet to hear and consider objections to the vacating of said Beechwood Lane by any person interested therein and desiring to be heard, by posting notices in three public places in said Village at least four weeks previous to said meeting, one of which said notice shall be posted at the interesection of Mary Avenue and said Beechwood Lane, and also by mailing a copy of said notice to all the owners of lands and premises abutting upon said street, and it is further ordered that a true copy of this resolution be included in said notice.
